Brodhead School Board aligns grade level and curriculum

By Gloria Sutter

Joe Kobussen requested the Board consider renegotiating the current contract. The District is currently in the third year of a fiveyear contract, with a 5% increase annually. Because of the increase in gas prices, maintenance prices and new bus costs, he would like an increase of 8% for the coming school year. This would be a one time cost increase. A \$30,000 grant can be applied for to change five more buses to propane, which will save on fuel costs. The Board will address the issue at the next meeting.

The Board approved the alignment of Brodhead School District's grade level and subject area curriculum with the Wisconsin Model Academic Standards and the Common Core State Standards. These are the foundation for teaching and learning.

Elementary Principal Kelly Knox requested the District apply some of it's ESSER III funds to extending the after school CLC program. The program was funded by grants that

are no longer available. The Board voted to approve the use \$70,000 in ESSER III funds for the 2022-23 and the 2023-24 school years.

In other business:

Dental care was provided for 122 students during the 2021-22 school year, valued at \$1,123, through the Building Brighter Smiles program.

A Show Choir coop with Juda will involve several Juda students and their band director.

On August 10, the Finance Committee will meet at 4:30 followed by a goal planning meeting and the regular meeting.

The District has a new, more user friendly website.

The administrative received its annual approval to hire new staff and accept resignations between board meetings.

The first reading of Policy JICA with more specific dress code language was approved.

Action was postponed on Policy JICDA regarding the Code of Con-





American Cancer Society to Paint Brodhead Purple for Relay For Life




The Relay For Life of Green County event will take place on Friday, August 5th at the Jaycee Park in Brodhead from 5-9 p.m. Cancer
