Come celebrate the 1st Brigade Band's 160th Birthday!!

Brodhead Historical Society invites you to step back in time on Sunday, August 11, when the $1^{\rm st}$ Brigade Band performs during Brodhead's Covered Bridge Days. This unique, Civil War-era band will perform an Ecumenical Church Service at 10 a.m. and again at a concert from 2–3:30 p.m. Both performances will be in Veterans Park, which is near the Depot Museum on 1st Center Avenue.

Come celebrate the 1st Brigade Band's 160th Birthday!! The original band in 1864 included 18 men from the Brodhead Brass Band, who enlisted in the Union Army as the band of the 1st Brigade, 3d Division, 15th Army Corps. They left their rural homes to participate under the command of General William T. Sherman in the campaigns of Northern Georgia and the Carolinas. The "Tradition of Excellence" that these men established lives on today with the members of the 1st Brigade Band.

History comes alive as members play period brass band music on antique instruments while attired in uniforms and gowns circa the Civil War. The entire collection of 240 instruments, all made before 1865, and their collection of sheet music of the civil war era, numbering 690 titles help in the nostalgic portrayal of the atmosphere of days gone by.

While the abundant written and pictorial materials remain of this era, the mellow sounds of the brass bands of the 1860's were lost until the 1st Brigade Band, starting in 1964, began to locate and restore the dented and broken instruments and to retrieve and reconstruct the yellowed and torn music. Through their work you can now hear what Presidents Lincoln and Davis, Generals Lee and Grant, and their contemporaries heard.

Covered Bridge Day events will conclude with the Brodhead Community Band performance at 6 p.m. in Veterans Park. Bring a chair, come enjoy these 1st Brigade Band events and our community band. If the weather is bad, the afternoon concerts will be held at the high school auditeria.



Bert Paris, a farmer that successfully grazes his dairy herd, is hosting the event at W3443 County W, Belleville on Tuesday, August 13 starting at 10 a.m. The presenter will be Erik Harris, who has been consulting with Paris on how to improve his farming system with better compost. Harris is a certified Soil Food Web Technician

Microscope on August 13

Farmers are invited to bring a baggie of their own soil collected that morning. Samples should be from 0-3 inches deep and within a plant's dripline (or very close to plants and roots). Farmers may also bring a baggie of compost for evaluation. These samples will be examined under microscopes and assessed for microorganisms like fungi, bacteria and protozoa. The presence and balance of these microorganisms is one way that farmers can see and measure how the practices they do on their farm influences the "livestock" in the soil.

The event is free and open to farmers wanting to learn more. 

Green County Clean Sweep

The Green County Land and Water Conservation Department is hosting a Clean Sweep event. Clean Sweep is program that helps dispose agricultural and household hazardous chemicals. This event is taking place at the Monticello Recycling Center, 406 North Main Street, Monticello, and will run from noon to 6 p.m. on Wednesday, August 21st.

For agricultural and household products, you can dispose up to one hundred pounds for free. A testing fee may be charged for unknown chemicals if the amount is greater than five gallons or 50-pounds. Participants will need to sign in when bringing in products, no pre-registering is needed. Proof of Green County residency is required. All items should be properly identified. Businesses may dispose of hazardous materials for a fee though Veolia Environmental Services.

We reserve the right to reject any item that does not meet the intent of the program. Materials will only be accepted by authorized personnel. Funding for this program is limited and the program will be suspended when the annual allocated funds are depleted. Some examples of accepted items are: home products, insecticides, old fertilizer, weed and feed products, mercury, oil based, marine, tractor, auto or lead paint, herbicides, fungicides, wood preservatives, low pressure gas cylinders, cadmium and lithium batteries, and small LP gas tanks. Some examples of items that are not accepted: explosives/firearms, radioactive material, high pressure compressed gas cylinders, freon 11 and 12, medical waste, latex paint, fluorescent tubes, waste motor oil, and antifreeze.

Electronic recycling will be collected for Village of Monticello residents only. Prescription medications may also be dropped off.




