

The Brodhead Historical Society will hold its monthly meeting on Monday, August 28. Join them for another presentation by Jessica Colaluca on one of Brodhead's "original six" founders. John L. McNair's impact on Brodhead was distinct, as he was the first Station Agent at our railroad depot, and an original founding member of the Congregational Church. The John McNair house is also believed to be one of the oldest, and still standing, houses in Brodhead. Mr. McNair was a modest character in contrast to I.F. Mack (who was discussed last summer), but shares an equally notable and indelible impact on our city.

There will also be a brief business prior to the presentation. The event begins at 7 p.m. in the Knight Addition of the Depot Museum. The public is welcome to attend.

#### Cards Rip the Tide

Brodhead-Juda football was hosted by Edgerton in their inaugural game of their new artificial turf football field last Friday. The Cardinals had first possession. Utilizing Blake Matthys, Isaac Saunders and Marcus McIntyre, all seniors, as running backs and quarterback Gabe Bockhop, in his second season as a starter were effective in moving the ball down field. Bockhop was on target putting up a pass into the waiting hands of senior and receiver Gunner Boegli to put the Cards into the red zone. Bockhop would then handoff to Matthys for the first score of the game. Bockhop, a junior, has the responsibility of kicking duties and Brodhead took a 7–0 early lead. The Cardinals dominated throughout the game with the Tide going three-andout. Matthys was called upon again advancing the ball 14 yards. Bockhop, with a designed fake handoff, kept the ball and following Brodhead's strong offensive line, was able to scamper 46 yards for the TD and his point-afterkick was good. The Cardinal's defense held the Tide to 11 first downs for the game. McIntyre got the nod in the second quarter and would race 30 yards for Brodhead's third score. This time the PAK failed. Edgerton would feel the defensive pressure of the Cards and had to punt the ball on downs. The Cardinals managed the clock by putting together an eight-play, 74-yard drive that was capped off with Bockhop's pass to Boegli who scored with a 20yard pass into the end zone. With a completed two-point conversion from Bockhop to Brody Riese, Brodhead went into halftime with a 28-0 lead.

Edgerton went nowhere as they started the second half while the visiting team continued to rip the Tide. Bockhop would score his second TD of the night. Just when it looked like Edgerton might score, as they were in the redzone, Tider, QB Cole Langer's pass was picked off by McIntyre who would take the ball all the way to the Edgerton 29-yard line. With Matthys on the sidelines, sophomore, Dane Huffman, was called in. He would then plunge across the goal line from 12 yards and the running clock would ensue for the remainder of the game. Many of Brodhead's JV squad would gain varsity experience in the fourth quarter. The Tide would score in the fourth quarter to make the final score 46–7.

Brodhead-Juda will play Evansville for their first home game at Gary Larson Field on Friday.
