## City Council Special Tax Assessed if No Sidewalks in Crosswinds by End of 2024

After closed session, the board voted three-four, with Mayor Jones breaking the tie, to direct Attorney Shroeder to prepare a letter requiring all occupied residential properties in the Crosswinds Subdivision to install sidewalks by December 31, 2024 or be subject to a special tax assessment to have it done by the city. In a separate vote, the council directed the attorney to send a letter to the Dysis Group informing them if they do not comply with the ordinance requiring sidewalks in Crosswinds, the city will take legal action.

Chief Raup was approved to talk to the attorney about having Community Service Officers assist in enforcing code violations such as junk vehicles and lawns not mowed.

Joe DeYoung from MSA provided information on the possible sewer and water projects on West Third Avenue and 12th Street, for which the city likely qualifies for state assistance. To qualify for assistance, residents of the impacted areas must meet certain income criteria. The council gave approval for city staff to pursue surveying residents of the blocks in question.

According to the new investment policy, the city treasurer must obtain the mayor's approval to move

money within the same institution. Transferring funds from one institution to another requires approval from the City Council.

The fire department's building across from the compost area was approved to be burned for practice.

Per their suggestion to purchase CDs from local banks, Treasurer Miller was approved to work with Ehler's to invest up to \$1.5 million in city funds.

Mayor Jones reported Library Director, Kyle Domer, resigned effective Friday, August 18th and a search will begin for his replacement.

### In other business:

Resolution 2023-09 passed vacating a portion of Eighth Street.

Chief Raup demonstrated the department's new body cameras for council members and the mayor.

The council voted to accept the quote for \$3,873.23 from Boldtronics to replace some City Hall cameras damaged in a recent power outage.

The Historical Society lease agreement was renewed for another 20 years.

It was approved to close City Hall on Tuesday, September 12th, so staff may attend election training in Albany.

## BJ football sweeps preseason

The week of football practice was challenged by the extreme heat causing teams to alter their workout plans. Temperatures at kickoff on Friday were at 83° with humidity on the rise and no wind throughout the night. Brodhead-Juda football team had first possession, when Evansville came to play, and it did not take the home team long to take command of the game. Gabe Bockhop, QB, on the opening drive called upon Isaac Saunders, Felix Paffel, and Marcus McIntyre as running backs to help advance the ball. Bockhop connected with Gunner Boegli for a 15-yard reception and a 28-yard run to put the Cardinals deep into Blue Devil territory. Bockhop capped off the drive with an eight-yard run for the first score of the night and his point-after-kick was good for a 7 -0 lead. Bennett Keller, QB for Evansville, with Wyatt Nelson and their O-Line moved the ball downfield into the red zone with a third-and eight position. Cardinal senior defensive linebacker, Owen Hillstrom made a solo tackle for a loss and the Blue Devils settled for a field goal by Wyatt Klitzman to get them on the points board.

Brodhead did make multiple errors during the game. They racked up eight penalties that cost them 74 yards. Evansville had 1-for-10 yards in penalties.

The Cardinals scored twice in the second quarter. Bockhop connect-
