The Green County Genealogical Society will hold its Friday Fun Day September 13 from 1-3 p.m. in the Research center located in the lower level of the Monroe Public Library.







Saturday Mornings at the Durand Library

State Library Enhances Rural Service Submitted by Barbara Flores, President, Friends of the Durand Library

The Library Company of Philadelphia, founded in 1731 by Benjamin Franklin and a group of his friends, became the first American subscription library. The Library Company, while founded as a membership library, allowed members to borrow books, and so may have been the first truly public library. At that time Illinois had not yet been carved out of the Northwest Territory and in fact, the Northwest Territory was not established until 1787. In the following decades this early start in the East was an inspiration to other territories and states.

It is fair to say that the Illinois State Library had its beginning in 1817 just before statehood was achieved in 1818, but progress in establishing it as an institution was slow and uneven. Eventually, the State Library would come to provide organizational assistance, outreach, grants and other services to local libraries as well as serving the Illinois Legislature and government offices. However, it would be decades later before legislation was passed enabling the establishment of local libraries.

In the early 1840's a permanent home was established for the State Library. Illinois had reason to be proud of the new State Library, it was a beautiful building with a good collection. There was some backing from the legislature, however not all officials showed a serious commitment to it and some Secretaries of State, who then as now carry the title of State Librarian, were indifferent to enlarging and strengthening the library.

While public libraries are an integral part of communities today, that was not the case during the 1800s and very few Illinois towns had libraries at all. It was not until March 7, 1872, that Governor John M. Palmer signed the Public Library Act, authorizing cities, incorporated towns, and townships to establish and maintain free public libraries and reading rooms "for the use and benefit of the inhabitants of each city."

The 19th-century industrialist Andrew Carnegie embraced the goal of funding libraries around the country. Between 1886 and 1919, Carnegie donated more than \$40 million to establish 1,679 new library buildings in communities large and small across America. From 1903 to 1914 106 public libraries were built in Illinois with grants awarded by the Carnegie Corporation. This includes the Rockford Public Library as well as the Freeport Library

Following legislative changes in the 1970's, the State Library is now a source of grants, developmental assistance, guidance to local libraries in the state and a strong advocate for accessibility to the handicapped. Systems for interlibrary loans, regional library agreements and methods of delivering borrowed books from one library to another were organized by the state system. In addition, Illinois is a Reciprocal Borrowing State, which means that library card holders from one public library may use their cards in any public library within Illinois.

While many rural areas would undoubtedly have developed local libraries on their own, having a strong State Library system bolsters the kind of collaboration among libraries which benefits everyone. The Interlibrary Loans and the RAILS system, an acronym for the organization which transports books from one library to another, are the result of organization on a state level.


