





# Saturday Mornings at the **Durand Library**

Modeling done to scale and to perfection

Come out to the Durand Library on Saturday, September 16 and learn what modeling is all about. The Stateline Area Modelers will bring in a great selection of models, which they have assembled. And members will be available to talk about the techniques and tricks to successfully model.

The Stateline Area Modelers are an International Plastic Model Society (IPMS) USA affiliated club, which meets in Durand. The club brings together like-minded individuals who enjoy building scale models of all types. In addition to plastic scale models, the club welcomes all scale model enthusiasts, regardless of medium or material used.

At 10 a.m. Bob Greenlee, club president will discuss the history of plastic modeling and how it has changed and developed over the years. He will share his experience in making models. The models will be on display through noon, so feel free to stop by any time between 10 a.m. and noon to see what club members have brought and to chat with them.

Model categories cover a wide range and include aircraft, armor, automobiles, dioramas, figures, ships and more. Even animals and humans are included. One can purchase the Visible Horse, which shows the internal organs through a clear plastic "skin." Other animals are also available, a cat, a dog, and, of course, a Visible Man. These make great study tools for aspiring veterinarians and doctors!

In order to be a scale model, the object must be drawn to a fixed scale so that all the parts are in proper proportion. Scale can be as small as one inch representing 144 inches, or 12 feet. So a tree 12 feet high would be represented by one inch. Scale can go the other way and yield a large model so that one-inch represents only 12 inches.

In addition to scale, the modeler wants perfection in the model he or she creates. Models must be carefully assembled in the correct order so that the pieces fit together perfectly. Depending on the model, painting of the surfaces may be required to reproduce the details of the object.

The club members don't limit themselves to plastic models and welcome members who work in other media such as wood. The club meets the third Thursday of the month at the United Methodist Church and visitors and new members are cordially invited.

This event is hosted by the Friends of the Durand Library. The group staffs the combined school and village libraries on Saturdays from 9 a.m. until noon. Check out privileges are free to all residents of the school district.

In addition to books, you will also find digitized Durand newspapers dating back to the late 19th century, STEM toys and DVD's for check out. Please enter from the east, or playground, side of the school building and follow the signs to the library.

Both children and adults will enjoy learning about this interesting hobby. So do stop by and see these interesting pieces. For more information about this event or the library, please email villagelibrarian@cusd322.

# Football Regroups After Upset

The last time Platteville High School beat Brodhead in football was 2013 in a playoff round that saw the Hillmen compete in the D4 championship game. That victory feeling returned to the Pioneer Stadium last Friday, when Platteville created an upset over the Cardinals with a 14-6 final score. Both teams had missed opportunities in the first half with the first score coming late in the second quarter when Platteville intercepted Gabe Bockhop's pass. The Hillmen were able to put together a 93-yard drive to take a 7-0 lead. With 1:06 on the clock, Marcus McIntyre on the kickoff, returned the ball 60 yards to Platteville's 25-yard line. Brodhead's first attempt was an incomplete pass, then Dane Huffman was handed the ball to gain three yards but the next play Bockhop was sacked for a loss. Going for it on fourth-down, Bockhop's pass to Gunner Boegli fell incomplete. The Hillmen maintained their lead heading into the break. The Cardinals had first possession of the second half and Mc-Intyre gained 25 yards on the return. Just when it appeared Coach Jim Matty's motivational talk at the break had made an impact, the next

play resulted in a fumble where Isaac Saunders pounced on it to maintain Cardinals possession. But the defensive line would stiffen for Platteville and Brodhead would be out on downs. Tyler Sass of the Hillmen, on third-and-six, scampered for 78 yards and crossed the goal line for another TD for Platteville and the 14–0 lead.

Early in the fourth quarter, Brodhead finally got on the board with a 10-yard pass completion from Bock-

hop to Boegli. The 2-point conversion attempt missed the mark, setting the score at 14-6. The Cardinals had a golden opportunity when Brody Riese, 3:58 on the clock, intercepted the Hillmen pass on Brodhead's 1-yard line. A gutsy call for a pass play from Bockhop to his preferred receiver, Boegli, resulted in a completion and 53 yards gained. Platteville determined to get the stop when the Cards were knocking their door again,

this time their interception ended Brodhead's drive. Coach Matthy's utilized his timeouts to preserve the game time. Platteville punted the ball with 1:17 on the clock. After the return, Boegli, once again, caught Bockhop's pass for a 31-yard gain, ball on Platteville's six-yard line.

With 39 seconds, the first down results in an incomplete pass, second down tackled for a two-yard loss. Entering fourth-and-eight yards, 27 seconds, the Hillmen are called for pass interference. Now fourth-and four yards, Bockhop is sacked. Game ends with the 14—6 final and Platteville begins their celebration.

Brodhead Juda will take the lessons learned from this loss and prepare to take on River Valley at Larsen Field later this week.
