School Board

Public Comment Policy Changed

By a narrow margin, the school board opted to change their policy on public comment at board meetings to allow any comment relevant to the school board's function. Previously, any person wishing to comment was limited to topics already on that night's agenda. Three citizens spoke in favor of this change and one spoke against it. Concerns raised by that citizen and some board members were that the board would not be able to act on any comments unless they were on the agenda and that meetings may become chaotic. Board Clerk Michael Oellerich also pointed out that all board members' contact information is on the website and that people may email them any time with concerns.

All three principals reported their years were off to a good start. This was echoed by Superintendent Novy who added that the Summer School Orientation Day went great and he would like to do it again next year.


Chad Dix reported that the new JV ball diamond on school grounds has been completed.

Due to the shortage of school psychologists, the district has not been able to fill that position. Instead, they've hired back Jill Gordon who is dual certified as a regular and special education teacher and has a master's degree in Educational Psychology. She will be able to take on many of the duties that a school psychologist would otherwise fulfill.

FFA Advisor Jillian Malkow reported that she has 10 applicants for the FFA Trip to the National FFA Convention and Expo in Indianapolis. They are typically only able to take six students, but may be able to arrange to take more. The board approved the trip.

The Board adopted an agenda for the Annual School Board Meeting next month. The meeting will be held October 23, 2023 in the High School Auditeria.


Diane was preceded in death by her parents, Fred and Dorothy and her husband, R. Richard Riese in 2018

All labor and administrative costs are provided through donated and volunteer services.

During 2022, the seven Districts issued 7,421 weekend food bags to students.

The Wild Ones Rock River Valley Chapter will host Cranes Over Illinois on Thursday, September 21, starting at 6:30 p.m. at the Cherry Valley Library, 755 East State Street, Cherry Valley, Illinois.

Stephanie Schmidt is the Whooping Crane Outreach Coordinator at the International Crane Foundation in Baraboo Wisconsin. She helps raise awareness about endangered whooping cranes and sandhill cranes in our communities to inspire us to care for cranes and support greater protection for these birds. They are facing increasing threats of habitat loss, collisions, and poaching throughout their flyway. Each year in Illinois we will see over 40,000 sandhill cranes and 76 whooping cranes from November through March, including in our own community. The International Crane Foundation aims to ensure these birds are protected on our landscapes for future generations to enjoy and appreciate.

Stephanie will show us how to identify the two species of cranes in Illinois, and teach us a bit about their history, the threats they face, and the habitats they use. She'll also describe the whooping crane reintroduction program that the International Crane Foundation runs.

Stephanie often works very closely with naturalists and nature enthusiasts across the whooping crane flyway as they are catalysts for protecting cranes, helping to spread the word, and acting as eyes and ears on the ground to safeguard cranes from harm.

This in-person program will be held at the Cherry Valley Public Library. While the speaker will present via Zoom, please join them at 6 p.m. for socializing and a chance to check out their Wild Ones Chapter library, followed by the speaker's presentation at 6:30 p.m. To attend this meeting via Zoom, you must register first. Eight Touchdowns Seals Cardinal Victory By Teresa Earleywine

Brodhead-Juda scored eight touchdowns, had 26 first-downs, 68 yards passing, rushed for 416 yards, 484 yards total offense, and did not punt the entire night, meanwhile, River Valley was held to 50 yards passing, 140 rushing yards, limited to six first-downs, four punts, three touchdowns, and a total of 193 yards in offense which all led to a 54-19 Cardinal victory.

Brodhead has several key players that remain sidelined with injury, but the determination and encouragement of the upper classmen has inspired the younger athletes to strive to fill in where called upon for success as a team.

Brodhead's first drive was capped off by a seven-yard TD run by Brody Riese. Gunner Boegli took on kicking duties for this game and he was solid on point-after-kicks. Late in the first quarter, in the redzone the Cardinals were unable to convert and the Blackhawks took over on downs. The hometown defense was dialed in and had numerous players including Jameson Wallin, Marcus McIntyre, Owen Hillstrom, Jordan Dix, Josiah Crisler, Charlie Weiss, Nick Lobeck, Dane Huffman along with Riese, Boegli all getting multiple solo tackles in the game to keep the pressure on River Valley. In the second quarter McIntyre and Isaac Saunders would combine for four endzone scores. In this matchup, Saunders was Brodhead's leading rusher with 20 carries and 181 yards while McIntyre had 14 carries resulting in 67 yards on the night. The Blackhawks did earn two touchdowns in the second quarter and mid-way with 4:06 on the clock were down by one score and momentum appeared to be trending in their direction. That was quickly squelched when Saunders would score his second TD followed by McIntyre's pick-6, aided with some stellar blocking. The halftime score 35-12 and the Cardi-

Opening the second half with BJ having first possession, QB Gabe Bockhop would make a 33-yard run to the endzone. McIntyre would get his second score with a three-yard run after Riese made a 26-yard run to get the Cardinals in the redzone. On the kick return, River Valley would be called for an illegal block in the back nullifying the large return made by Kaden Plumley. Two plays later, QB Lucas Klein would send the ball deep only to have his pass picked off by Boegli. The Cardinals have possession, fourth-and-four, he would then catch a 45-yard beautifully, lofted pass from Bockhop to seal the game. River Valley would score one more time in the fourth.

This week the team will travel to Dodgeville on Friday.

Shrubs: Nannyberry, 18-24 inch seedlings, Ninebark, 18-24 inch seedlings, and Silky Dogwood, 12-24 inch seedlings. Tree protectors and Root Dip Planting Gel are also available.
