# Facility Committee Presented Board with Options

#### By Grace Kufahl

Facility Planning Committee members Carl Hearing and Paul Donovan reviewed options considered by the 25-member committee along with their recommendations. The committee proposed the board decide between two options focused on security and educational facilities. One would cost \$15,505,000 and raise taxes \$10.33 per \$100,000 of property value. The other would cost \$17,485,000 and raise taxes \$11.75 per \$100,000 of property value. The first option includes, at the elementary school, secure entry, main office and student services renovations, adding space for full time 4K and renovating the space for 5K. At the middle school it includes secure entry; main office renovation; moving fifth grade to the middle school with classroom addition and cafeteria expansion; kitchen/receiving remodel; band renovation into two sixth grade classrooms; and maintenance area

renovation into band and practice rooms. At the high school, it includes a main office addition with secure entry and student services renovation. The higher cost option includes all that plus toilet room renovations and window replacements at the elementary and middle schools. The board will refresh survey results and decide on an April referendum for a 20-year bond in January. The district may be able to use an estimated budget surplus to offset some of these expenses to minimize taxpayer impact.

Kid Connection members reviewed their activities with the board. These include an ongoing Textile Drive, Annual Walkathon, Outdoor Classrooms at the elementary school, Trunk or Treat, Reading Motivational and Book Swap and more. They are seeking assistance to replace the grade three-five playground. The cost would be around \$45,000 plus installation. They cur-


## Splash Pad Round Up a Success!

The September Piggly Wiggly round-up (plus a generous donation from





#### Senior proejct Blood Drive

On Monday, October 30th from 10:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., Lance Peterson and Jayson Montiel will be hosting a blood drive at Brodhead High School for their Senior Project. It takes about an hour to complete your paperwork and donation. Snacks will be provided.

Today, RRVBC supplies the total blood needs for 13 area hospitals: Beloit Health System, Edgerton Hospital and Health Services, FHN, Javon Bea Hospital-Riverside, Javon Bea Hospital-Rockton, Mercyhealth Hospital and Medical Center-Harvard, Mercyhealth Hospital and Trauma Center-Janesville, Mercyhealth's Hospital and Medical Center-Walworth, OSF Saint Anthony Medical Center, Rochelle Community Hospital, SwedishAmerican Hospital, SwedishAmerican Medical Center-Belvidere and SwedishAmerican Medical Center/Regional Cancer.

RRVBC must collect more than 800 units of blood each week to meet the needs of their 13 hospitals. They rely on donors from nine counties of the Rock River Valley, including Winnebago, Boone, Carroll, Lee, McHenry, Ogle and Stephenson counties in Illinois and Walworth and Rock County in Wisconsin. RRVBC employs approximately 100 people, including a Medical Director, healthcare, financial and community relations. RRVBC has four locations. In addition, there are up to three mobile blood drives each day. RRVBC is a not-for-profit organization, governed by an 11 member Board of Directors. They are regulated by the Food and Drug Administration; accredited by the American Association of Blood Banks; and a member of America's Blood Centers.

If you would like to sign up to give blood, please go to RRVBC. org, create an account, and login to schedule your appointment at the Brodhead High School Mobile Drive. All donors will need a photo ID with their date of birth. In order to donate, you must be 17 years old or older, or 16 with parental consent. All blood types are needed! Your donation can enhance or save lives for up to three people!

The Cardinals closed out their regular season last Tuesday traveling to Evansville. Brodhead took the first set 25–23 but Evansville would take sets two and three, 12–25 and 19–25 to bring on a marathon for set number four. The Cardinals had a 22–19 lead when the Blue Devils took a time out. Brodhead maintained their concentration to earn their next point but then Evansville scored four points. Kammerer called for a break and the Cards had the ball back. The two teams went back and forth point-for-point, tied up multiple times until the Blue Devils scored two in a row to finish the set 29–27 victory and win the match.

Brodhead had 40 kills on the night led by Addison Yates with 14 and Brenley Jones and Brynn Riesterer teaming for an additional thirteen. Brodhead had an astounding 177 attack attempts (ATT), which is defined as any time a player strategically hits the ball into their opponent's court. Yates, Jones, Riesterer, Alecia Dahl, Makenna Schooff and Jerrica Schwartz were each in double digits for ATT. Libero Ava Risum tallied 44 digs, with Yates and Dahl combining for 29 more. Paityn Kail had the most in assists with 22.

#### Football at Columbus for Level 1 Tournament

The road to Camp Randall will begin Friday this week with Brodhead Juda #6 on the road to #3 Columbus on Friday in a D5 dual. This will be a tale of two Cardinal teams meeting head-to-head with Brodhead's 6-3 record and Columbus 6-1.

Brodhead faced Lancaster last Friday. Whether it was the wind and soggy conditions or some other factors, the Cardinals were held to just four first downs and 146 offensive yards while the Flying Arrows managed 21 first downs and 463 offensive yards. Lancaster scored three times in the first half and Brodhead was down 24-0 at the break. The teams pounded it out in the third quarter. With 49 seconds left on the clock Lancaster's Peyton Alverado would get his second TD and make it a 31-0 game. But, Cardinals special team's player, Gunner Boegli would take it to the house on a 90-yard kickoff return. Accomplishing the two-point conversion to finally get Brodhead on the scoreboard would also bring new life to the team. Alvarado would score once more in the fourth and demonstrated why it is he leads the conference with over 1500 yards in rushing. But, the Cards were not yet done. Gabe Bockhop would go deep and find Boegli who caught the 50-yard pass and keep Brodhead still in the hunt for a comeback with a 14-38 score and more than five minutes on the clock. A short kick on the ensuing kickoff went to Lancaster starting on the 47-yard line. The Flying Arrows would score one more time to end the game with a 44-14 victory over the Cardinals.

Platteville 7–0 took the title in the Southwest Conference. Brodhead closed out their regular season with a 4–3 conference record giving them fourth place. Conference leaders include Brodhead's Bockhop, who is #3 with 926 passing yards, Boegli with his 543 receiving yards along with dual weapons in Marcus McIntyre and Isaac Saunders in rushing combining for 1,010 yards. Brodhead's defense will be led by McIntyre, Owen Hillstrom, Jamison Wallin, and David Masloske who are all in the top 20 of total tackles in the SWC for the season.


