School Board Brodhead School District Annual Meeting 2022

The 2022-23 mill rate will be \$6.65 per \$1,000. This is \$0.13 more than last year. This is the result of a 13.4% increase in equalized property values and an increase of 15.6% in the total school levy. To determine the rate per \$1,000, the total tax levy of \$4,391,201 is divided by the equalized value of the District, which is \$660,472,440.

The tax levy consists of \$4,391,201 for the General Fund and zero dollars for the Debt Service Fund. This is a 15.65% increase compared to last year due to an increase in the three year average pupil count and the additional funding from the three year non-recurring referendum of \$800,000. This was offset by a 3.3% increase in equalization aid. Total state aid this year is \$7,400,638, which is an increase in state aid of \$238,314 over that of 2021-22.

The 2022-23 school population is 1,020 which converts to 1,007 FTE's. Calculations for state aid include the summer school enrollment, giving a District total of 1,027 FTE's, which is a decrease of two FTE's compared to last year. Fifteen more students left the District than came in, through open enrollment, at a cost of \$118,508.

Current budget projections show a deficit of \$24,941 this year.

The following resolutions were approved:

Levy a school tax assessed against all taxable property within the District in the sum of \$4,391,201 (General Fund) necessary to operate and maintain the District School System and to finance the recommended budget for the 2022-23 school year.

Resolve that the Board members of the School District of Brodhead be paid a salary. Salaries: President

and Clerk, of \$1,173.36; all others, of \$1,119.91.

Resolve that the Board of Education of the School District of Brodhead be reimbursed for expenses incurred on District business when traveling outside the District.

Be it resolved that the 2023 School District of Brodhead set the date and time of the Annual Meeting within the guidelines of Wisconsin Statutes.

REGULAR SCHOOL BOARD MEETING

The Board held its regular meeting to certify the tax levy at \$4,391,201 General Fund for 2022-23.

The short term borrowing resolution for cash flow purposes was approved, in accordance with section 67.12(8), Wis. Statutes.

An alternative open enrollment application was approved.



McManus Family Keeps Arboretum on Solid Ground

Thanks to the family of Charles and Nora McManus, the M.J. Blackford Brodhead School Arboretum Fund is on solid financial ground. Besides the generous monetary contribution, the family also built six Aldo Leopold benches and donated them to the Brodhead School District for the Arboretum. The 2.5 acre School Arboretum has been mostly funded by donations or fund-raising efforts over the past 53 years. Most maintenance work has been donated as well.

The Arboretum was established in 1969 to educate Brodhead students about the environment. Nora McManus had a passion for nature and wildlife. Nora accompanied Brodhead sixth graders to Camp MacLean to share her knowledge of the natural world. When Nora passed away on April 3, 2022, her

children decided to provide the Arboretum of the Brodhead School District with funds and benches. The Arboretum is a great place to study birds, have scavenger hunts, work with orienteering, experience Geocaching, de-stress, study trees, botanize, do creative writing, and have cross-country practice. Many Brodhead classes have been observed using the Arboretum during the school year as well as for Summer School with a variety of activities. Arboretum funds are used for building maintenance, watering supplies, fencing, planting trees, tree care, and interpretive signs.

The School District of Brodhead is very grateful to the McManus Family for their very generous donations to the M.J. Blackford Brodhead School Arboretum.

In June 2013 a few lovers of reading started the Brodhead Library Book Club with three members, and today it has grown to ten or more with readers coming and going over the years. One recent member recalls that the library's book club was the first thing she sought out when she moved to Brodhead. After nine years and nearly 90 books, the group has found ways to adapt, survive, and grow. Initially the club met in the program room at the library, with a few months during the year branching out to a member's home or going to book readings elsewhere. When the pandemic hit, the members used a free audio conferencing program and chose books in a series, of the same genre, or by the same author to be able to access books to discuss since the library staff could not provide us with the service we had previously. While the program room was still closed, but the pandemic was lessening, the readers met in the park, at a local church basement or meeting room or spaced out a member's home. As one member commented, "We were able to be creative and continue meeting through the pandemic."

Recently the book club returned to the library after the program room was reopened in August of 2022. Library Director Kyle Domer and his staff greeted them with flowers and smiles. Once again the group is planning to use library resources to access books and to enjoy the space being provided. The literature chosen is always in one of three forms: regular print, large print or audio version. By making the literature adaptable to many types of readers, as one long time member commented, "We have the opportunity to be life long learners" and another said, "... my handicap—the way I read—didn't make a difference."

The Brodhead Library Book Club welcomes new members, as "it is a wonderful way to develop great bonds of friendship". This sentiment, from one of the founding members, is echoed by many others affiliated with the group. Contact library staff for more information and specific dates of the meetings.

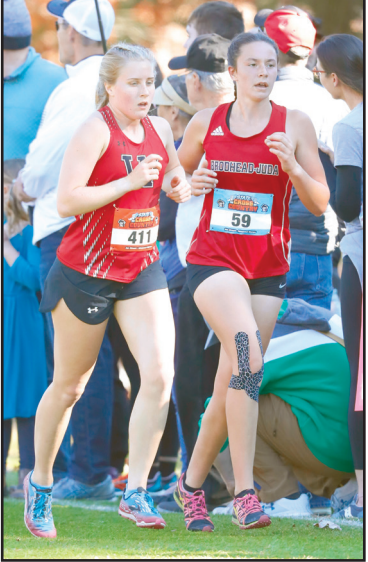
