Brodhead School Board approves details for non-recurring referendum

The Board approved the details for a non-recurring referendum, to be held on April 5, that will allow the School District of Brodhead to exceed revenue limits by \$1,750,000 for the next three years. The funds are needed to maintain current programs and facilities. This will create mill rates that are still lower than the \$7.99 of 2020-21. They are estimated to be \$7.52 in 2022-23, \$7.47 in 2023-24, and \$7.28 in 2024-25.

The Administrative Team presented the results of the District's state report card. The District Goal was to exceed expectations. This was achieved in two of the three buildings, giving the District a score of 67.3, which meets expectations. It is important to remember that much of the curriculum was presented virtually, especially at the High School level, which had score of 50. The Middle School had a score of 74,1 and the Elementary School scored 88.4.

Principals from each building explained reasons for the scores

and how their curriculums and interventions are being implemented to increase student achievement.

Because of the difficulty to enforce the required mask policy at extra-curricular events, the Board voted to "highly recommend" masks during these after school ac-

The wearing of masks at school has been a controversial issue this school year. Depending on COVID levels, masks have been required to protect student health and keep students in school. Beginning January 3, masks will be highly recommended, but not required. This gives parents time to have their students vaccinated before returning from winter break. A test and stay and a mask and stay policy will also be used after possible COVID exposure.

The District is in the process of hiring a new chorus director. The Show Choir will become a co-curricular entity and a coordinator will be hired.

In other business:

The State has announced that

the District will receive \$133 per student in aide this year.

The District has received over \$100,000 worth of computers and other technology from the Middleton VA Hospital through a government program.

The Building and Grounds Committee will meet at 6 p.m. on Thursday, January 13.

The High School Program of Studies for 2022-23 was approved.

The second reading of Board Policy BEAA, regarding remote participation at Board meetings, was







Twenty-one fluorescent lighting fixtures have been replaced with 42 LED lamps to improve lighting and significantly lower the cost of lighting the library. LED bulbs last up to 10x longer than traditional fluorescent bulbs and use up to 75% less energy.

We expect there to be a significant energy savings as well as reduced maintenance by using LED bulbs.

The library received some books I would like to highlight this past month. The first was co-written by our very own Laura Roth's brother. Laura has been part of the library staff for the past 6 months but I only recently found out that she had an author in the family! The book The Handy Wisconsin Answer Book by Terri Schlichenmeyer and Mark Meyer, is a great addition to our collection. We received a donation of 5 novellas written by Pastor Emeritus Lawrence Balleine, of Zwingli UCC in Monticello. These short stories featuring angels are just the thing for this time of year. 

Christmas Fire Hazards

Tanna McKeon, Green County Emergency Management Director reminds everyone to make fire safety a priority when you are decorating your home this holiday season.

Christmas trees and fresh greenery are beautiful holiday decorations but they also pose a major fire hazard if they are not property maintained. Nationally, there is an average of 160 home fires that were started by Christmas trees. These resulted in deaths, injuries and millions of dollars in property damage. It only takes a matter of seconds for a fire involving a dry live tree to grow into a large blaze. Live trees should be kept at least three feet away from heat sources, such as a fireplace or heater. Heat will dry out a real tree, causing it to more easily ignite when exposed to heat, flame or sparks. Live trees should be watered daily. Almost half of all Christmas tree fires start from electrical distribution problems or lighting equipment. Inspect holiday lights each year and replace strands that have worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. If the wires are warm to the touch, unplug them and properly dispose them. Be sure to turn off all lights on trees and other decorations when going to bed or leaving the house and unplug extension cords when they are not in use.

Christmas is a peak time for candle fires and never leave a burning candle unattended. Place them where they can't be accidently knocked over and at least 12 inches away from flammable materials. Consider using consider using battery-operated flameless candles.

Christmas Eve and Christmas Day are among the top days of the year for cooking fires. Avoid distractions in your kitchen when you are cooking, keep cooking areas clear of decorations or other items that could catch fire.

Check your smoke alarms to make sure they are working properly and test them monthly. Alarms should be located on every level of your home. If you haven't created an escape plan with your family do it now! Be sure practice it so everyone knows two ways to get out of the house in the event of a fire.

Need some gift ideas? Think about giving fire extinguishers, smoke alarms, carbon monoxide detectors, battery jump cables, compact tire inflators, first aid kits, weather radios, flashlights, waterproof/fireproof safe etc. All of these are relatively inexpensive and really do make great gifts.




Cards defeated East Troy in OT

Each mental illness is different but common warning signs include:

- •Confusion or problems concentrating and learning
- •Extreme mood changes, including uncontrollable "highs'
- •Inability to carry out daily activities or handle daily problems and stress
- •Avoiding friends and social activities
- Changes in sleeping or eating habits

Youth can also develop mental health issues and can show behavioral symptoms, such as:

- •Changes in school performance
- Excessive worry or anxiety
- Hyperactive behavior
- •Frequent nightmares •Frequent disobedience or ag-

gression Many face stressful situations that are overwhelming and cause

strong emotions in adults and chil-

dren. Here are some good coping skills to help one become more resilient:

- •Take breaks from watching, reading, or listening to news stories, including those on social media.
- •Practice relaxation exercises, prayer or meditation.
- •Take vacations away from home and work.
- •Get enough quality sleep and regular exercise.

It is important to remember that even the most resilient person can face a difficult time and to know when to ask for professional help. Don't be afraid to reach out if you or someone you know needs help. Learning more about resources, support and treatment is an important first step.
