# **New Website Proposal** Accepted

The Economic Development Committee recommended the Council go with the Revize Web Design proposal to revamp the city's website with an initial cost of \$10,375. There is also a \$1,975 annual maintenance fee, up from the current \$1,800. The city expects to get a credit for the maintenance paid in August. Alder Simpson questioned why Revize was recommended over the Tom Webb quote which, despite the higher maintenance fee, would cost less over three years. Mayor Jones responded that there's value in the existing relationship. After

a lengthy discussion, the Council voted to accept the Revize proposal.

New police officer Craig Christensen took his Oath of Honor administered by Chief Raupp, in the presence of his family, the Council and other meeting attendees.

Alder Burkhalter presented a \$1,000 donation to the Economic Development Committee from Water and Light. He reported the committee gifted the money from 2022 and 2023 to Olivia from Green County Development Corporation (GCDC) for her to talk to the school district about using the funds to

build or rehabilitate houses like the Monroe School District is doing. Alder Simpson questioned why the committee didn't follow the Council's recommendation to put the funds toward the website or GCDC for Economic Development. When questioned, the attorney stated that the authority to spend the money rests with the committee. Alder Baxter asked if we were paying for GCDC to have a conversation with the school. Mayor Jones said he understands that the money would ultimately go to the school.

# GCDC and Family Promise receive WHEDA Grants for housing projects Wisconsin Housing and Economic Development Authority (WHEDA)

Wisconsin Housing and Economic Development Authority (WHEDA) announced recently that 53 organizations in 27 counties throughout the state will receive \$2 million in grants from the WHEDA Foundation to improve emergency shelter, transitional residences, and extremely low-income housing.

Family Promise of Green County, Inc., serving homeless families and individuals since 2011, will receive \$33,289 to rewrap the exterior and replace existing siding, install new gutters and downspouts, and replace the roof at the shelter. Rick Gleason, Executive Director of Family Promise said, "This grant enables us to complete the necessary structural upgrades to our facility on schedule per our property committee planning. We are so grateful for this grant approval."

GCDC was awarded \$30,000 for the Home Construction Cooperative, a program that addresses housing and workforce shortages in the county as local high school students learn in-demand job skills as they renovate the home. "This grant, in combination with the incredible amount of donations from the community, helps secure this program into the future as all funds from the sale of the house will be used for future projects," stated Olivia Otte, Executive Director of Green County Development Corporation (GCDC).

This year, the Foundation's annual Housing Grant Program is funded by \$2 million from WHEDA reserves. WHEDA received 96 applications requesting more than \$3.8 million through the housing grant process this year, an indication of the high demand and need in Wisconsin. This year's grants will create or improve 1,674 beds and housing units across the state. Investments at the community level also support economic recovery by creating valued construction jobs.

WHEDA Foundation has issued nearly \$31 million to housing providers across the state since 1985. Grants are awarded to non-profit agencies, local governments, and Tribal authorities for emergency/transitional housing or permanent housing. Both GCDC and Family Promise are 501c3, non-profit organizations serving the needs of Green County.

# Winter Mental Health and Upcoming programs: Winter is a rough time for many

Winter is a rough time for many people. Not only are the days short and we don't get much sun—we also experience the holiday letdown. For some people this is because of the visits from loved ones coming to an end. Others may be going through grief and loss of someone important, or the grief and pain of having complicated and difficult family relationships. All of these very human experiences can lead to more mental health concerns for ourselves and those we care about.

Green County Extension is offering a couple of educational programs that include mental health conversations as part of the learning experience. One program is called Mental Health First Aid. This program discusses different mental health diagnoses, substance use disorders, and mental health crises like suicide. It is an excellent overview program for anyone. They will be holding this by Zoom on Friday January 12th, from 9 a.m.-3:30 p.m.

Another program coming up on Friday, January 26th is called safeTALK. This is a program where we learn how to talk with adults or youth who may be struggling with thoughts of suicide, and keep them safe. This will be held at the Green County Justice Center on Friday, January 26th from 1-4 p.m.
