District Continued Meeting Expectations Last Year Per State Report Card

School Districts are scored by the state each year in Achievement, Growth, Target Group Outcomes and On-Track to Graduation with the four elements being weighted differently for different districts depending on their demographics. Brodhead is weighted most heavily in the Growth area. Superintendent David Novy shared that the district met expectations with a score of 68.4 out of 100, just below their goal of Exceeding Expectations with a score of 70.0. This was

a slight decrease for the second year in a row. Last year's score was 69.6 and the year before was 70.2. The high school exceeded expectations with a score of 71.1, which Principal Jim Matthys attributed to students and staff, especially the English and Math Departments. The elementary and middle school both met expectations with scores of 68.3 and 65.3 respectively. More information is available on the district's website.

Principal Matthys explained the High School's efforts to help students tailor their senior year to their

future plans. With Collegiate and Career Academies, students can earn college credits, certificates or gain real world skills through apprenticeships and co-ops.

The board directed Superintendent Novy to work with Baird to draft a resolution for an April referendum to exceed revenue limits for operating expenses. Details about this referendum will be added to the website.

In Other Business:

Elementary Principal Kelly Knox reported the Kid Connection Santa's Shop event was successful with increased student participation compared to last year.

Middle School Principal Adam Ferger reported the Senior Luncheon was Friday, December 13th and they had over 150 people sign up.

Technology Director Kevin Buxton advised the board the installation of the new phone system and rerouting of the Middle School network were completed successfully in a cost effective manner, including a \$10,000 savings with the new phones compared to the old ones.

Superintendent Novy reported he will be working with Kevin Hickman from Nexxus Solutions and the Building and Grounds Committee to review priorities and plan ahead for future facility needs.



Saturday Mornings at the Durand Library

Houseplants and the Winter Solstice

Submitted by Barbara Flores, President, Friends of the Durand Library For us in the Northern Hemisphere, the Winter Solstice, which occurs Saturday, December 21 at 3:21 a.m. CST, will mark the longest night and shortest day of the year. This is when the North Pole has its maximum tilt away from the sun and the sun is lowest in the sky.

From 3:22 a.m. on (astronomers are very precise people) the sun will begin to appear higher in the sky; we can see this change almost day by day. The passing of the darkest day in the year is why so many cultures, including our own, have Winter Solstice events. We celebrate the fact that daylight is increasing.

The earth is tilted on its axis. The familiar globe demonstrates this as it is always set on its stand at a 23.5-degree angle. As the earth orbits the sun the north pole is further out for a period of time and we experience winter while the southern hemisphere experiences summer. Then the situation reverses it is all because of the tilt.

But what does this have to do with houseplants? Of course, the sun is essential for plant life as plants, through photosynthesis, use the energy from the sun to manufacture the sugars and carbohydrates they need. In fact, plants are termed "primary producers" and without them, there would be no life on earth, as we know it.

And back to houseplants, south facing windows provide the best light for sun loving plants in the winter because the sun is so low in the sky. However, beginning at the winter solstice, as earth's orientation to the sun begins changing, the sun will be higher in the sky. Once overhead, the sun will cast more light in east and west facing windows. And those plants which require less light may find that their position in an east or west window may get too bright or too hot while the ones in the south facing window may miss that more intense light.

To learn more about the orbit and rotation of the earth, winter and summer solstice, the vernal and autumnal equinox and all things astronomical, check out the books at the library. There are 41 titles dealing with astronomy at all reading levels.

About the Library

The Durand Library is a collaboration between Durand School and the Friends of the Durand Library, a 501 (c)(3) organization. Residents of the Durand school district enjoy checkout privileges, and everyone is invited to
