City Council West Third Avenue Project Approved

Burt Boldebeck from Boldtronics answered questions and reviewed his quote for Access Control Systems to replace the door locks at City Hall and the Police Department and cameras for the Police Department Evidence Room. After discussing, the board voted to refer it to the Public Safety Committee.

Joe DeYoung from MSA presented options for capital street sewer and water projects since the city was granted a Community Block Development Grant of \$1,000,000 for the West Third Avenue project from 11th to 15th Street and 13th Street from West Third to West Sixth Avenue. The total cost of that project is estimated at just over \$2.1 million. Other options considered were West Third Avenue from 11th to Fourth Street and West Third from 15th to 17th Street. After hearing from Mr. DeYoung, Public Works Director Rich Vogel and Ed Hoff from Brodhead Water and Light, the council voted to approve the project for West Third from 11th to 17th Street and 13th Street from West Third to West Sixth Avenue at a total cost of approximately \$2.5 million.

Stuart Bisbee, Library Director, reviewed the library's budget. He explained that program attendance and circulation are up substantially and costs are rising, but the amount allocated to them by the city has remained the same for the past three years. In order to maintain the current operating hours and services, Mr. Bisbee requested a five percent increase to next year's budget and to keep up with inflation in the future.

In Other Business:

Police Chief Raupp introduced new Community Service Office Ryan Walling to the Council.

Ryan Burns, representing Baer Agency's League of Wisconsin Municipalities Insurance, answered questions and reviewed coverage options with the board prior to renewal next April.

Chief Raupp was approved to hire part-time officer Joe Fitters pending completion of a background check.

The annual public budget hearing was set for Thursday, November 14th at 6 p.m. pending approval of the public notice at next month's meeting.

Presently, he is working at the University of Wisconsin-Madison on another large drilling project.

James Alfred Share

James Alfred Share, of Brodhead, Wisconsin, passed away at the age of 94 on September 22, 2024, at the Monroe Hospice Home.

Born on August 16, 1930, Jim was the youngest of the three children of Max and Edythe Share, Max was the proprietor of Share City Service, a fuel oil delivery business, and Edythe worked as a nurse. Max and Edythe were devout Christians. Jim, following in their footsteps, was a dedicated member of St. Rose of Lima in Brodhead and St. Victor's in Monroe.

Raised in Monroe, Jim loved the outdoors and sports. While a Chicago Cubs fans as a boy, he became frustrated with the Cubs always losing to the St. Louis Cardinals. "If you can't beat them join them," Jim said. He switched his allegiance to the St. Louis Cardinals, cheering for his boyhood hero Stan Musial.

Jim graduated from Monroe High School in 1949, where he lettered in football and track and field (pole vault and hurdles). Under Jim's picture in his senior yearbook was the quote, "To Shoot a Buck Would Be His Luck."

In 1951, during the Korean War, Jim was drafted into the U.S. Army. He worked in aircraft maintenance and was stationed in Japan. Ever the outdoorsmen, Jim traded a Parker Pen for a fishing pole so that he could fish with the locals.

After the Army, Jim pursued a degree in forestry at the University of Wisconsin-Madison on the GI Bill, beginning his lifelong love for the Badgers. It was there, in front of the Memorial Union, that he met the love of his life, Mary Hein, in 1953. The two were an odd yet perfect

match: she was studious, while Jim preferred going out fishing or shooting pool. They married on June 30, 1956, at St. Rose Church in Brodhead, starting a life together that spanned more than six decades.

In 1957, they moved to Mary's hometown of Brodhead. Together, they built a home on 7th Avenue in 1960, where they raised six children—Sue, Laura, Cathy, Sally, Mike, and Stephen—and where Jim would reside for the rest of his life.

With a young family to support, Jim abandoned his quest for a degree in forestry and instead took a job at Beloit Corporation. Later, with the offer of higher pay, Jim went to work at General Motors in Janesville, until his retirement in 1988. Despite dropping out of college, Jim always stressed the importance of education to his children, and to his credit, all six of his children have advanced degrees.

From the maternal side of his family, Jim inherited a love of gardening and outdoor activities. Jim always had a big garden. He also enjoyed fishing and hunting. Jim had a passion for all sports, especially baseball, which he loved playing and coaching with his children and their friends.

After retiring, he and Mary enjoyed traveling together, highlighted by a summer working at Denali National Park where Jim enjoyed the incredible trout fishing. Jim proclaimed that if he had gone to Alaska as a young man he would have never left.

Jim is preceded in death by his parents, Max and Edythe (Sturzinger) Share; and sisters: Ruthella Flannery and Maxine Helland. He is survived by his wife, Mary (Hein) Share; and children Suanne (Kurt) Reed of Fort Atkinson, Wisconsin, Laura (Eric) Bingner of Fort Atkinson, Catherine (James) Butts of Fort Atkinson, Sally (Brad) Saunders of Brodhead, Michael (Rose Courie) of Winston-Salem, North Carolina, and Stephen (Melanie Kranz) of Middleton, Wisconsin; along with 13 grandchildren and 16 great-grandchildren.

A Memorial Mass is being held, at St. Victor's Church in Monroe on Thursday, September 26th at 11:30 a.m., visitation starting at 10 a.m.

Saturday, October 5th—Talk on Old Testament Geography

Please join us at the Durand Library on Saturday, October 5 for a fascinating look at the places, which made up the backdrop for the Old Testament of the Bible. Mark Peterson will take us to a place and time where pivotal events were taking place which have shaped the world. Mark holds a master's degree in history and has presented talks at the Center for Learning in Retirement in Rockford as well as the Lifelong Learning Center in Freeport on this and other topics.

He will discuss the geography and history of the area, which is called the Holy Land and how geography played a prominent role in the Bible. For instance, significant Biblical events took place on mountain tops. The Jordan River, both the crossing of it and its role as a real and symbolic boundary, is mentioned often in the Old Testament.

The talk will begin with a discussion of the Patriarchs, then the time in Egypt, the Judges, the Kings, and the split kingdoms. We will also learn about the invading empires: Assyrian, Babylonian, Persian and Greeks, concluding with the success of the Maccabees rebellion as well as ultimately Roman control in 63 BC.

The Christian Bible is the most read book in the world and sections of it form part of Hebrew and Islamic holy texts. Please join us for this very interesting look at the Holy Land and its fundamental place in history. It will be a trip back in time.

They will have a telescope available for viewing the night sky. This event will be taking place on the upper green at the Reserve, there will not be an actual trail walk, as it will be too dark to embark on that safely. The weekly Friday Night Fish Fry will be going on from 5-9 p.m., and Chef John will be crafting some special space themed cocktails this evening. Feel free to come on down and have some dinner before joining in on the stargazing fun! (The stargazing is free, but any food and drink must be purchased separately from inside.) If the weather is too dangerous, or cloudy, cancellation will be made through email and social media posting. This event is free but pre-registration is helpful.

LUNCH AND LEARN: DRAGONFLIES AND DAMSELFLIES—Join Wisconsin Master Naturalist Bob Honig, on Thursday, October 3rd from 12-1 p.m. for this exciting presentation about dragonflies and damselflies. Both are important in terrestrial and aquatic food webs. In this Lunch and Learn you will learn how to tell them apart by their features and behaviors, as well as finding out the answers to those burning questions: Can dragonflies prey on birds? What is the killer lip? And what backyard pond features will attract them? Bob has been observing and studying nature for most of his life. He earned an M.S. degree in zoology/aquatic ecology, and he is a retired environmental consultant who has addressed issues including endangered species, wetlands, archaeology, recycling, and sustainability. He has been an active volunteer for conservation organizations for four decades in Texas and continues to do so in Wisconsin after moving here in 2021, supporting community science and educational activities. 
