



RRASC Wayne Beyer Scholarship

College students pursuing a career in Fish and Wildlife Management, Law Enforcement, Biology or Zoology at a two- or four-year college are encouraged to apply for one of three yearly \$500 scholarships.

Student Eligibility

- Must have completed their freshman year or higher of college.
- Must be enrolled in an accredited degree-granting area (PhD, MA, MS, BA, BS, AA or AS) related to Wildlife Management, Law Enforcement, Biology or Zoology or must demonstrate a commitment to a career in Fish and Wildlife Management. Or, if accepted into a teacher education program of the life sciences.
- "C" average or higher.
- Graduate of a North Dakota, South Dakota or Minnesota high school.
 - First preference will be given to applicants with a connection to the Red River Area Sportsmen's Club and those residents of Richland County, North Dakota or Wilkin County, Minnesota.

Application and Selection Process

To apply, eligible students should submit their application, transcripts and a one-page, typed history about them self and the goals they have set for a career in helping to preserve the rights of all, to enjoy fishing and hunting.

Applications must be received by February 1.

Scholarships recipients are screened by a designated club committee and voted upon by the entire club. A scholarship winner may receive this award up to three times, at the discrepancy of the committee. Preference to first-time applicants.

The Red River Area Sportsmen's Club asks that recipient(s) of the scholarship(s) attend the Spring Banquet to receive their scholarship award.
