Ask the Expert

How do we as patients interpret information on side effects?

We're sometimes very concerned about starting or continuing a medication when we read about its side effects.

As a neurologist, I understand that navigating medication information, especially concerning side effects, can be daunting. Let's explore how to interpret this information effectively. First, it's important to know that side effect lists are designed to be exhaustive, and that not everyone who takes that particular medication is destined to have all of those side effects. Also, your physician will take your medical history, current medications, allergies, and other symptoms into consideration when deciding which medications (and their possible side effects) may work best for you. If there are specific side effects that are of concern, I encourage you to discuss these with your doctor.

<u>Are they listed in order of frequency or seriousness?</u>

Side effects for medications are often listed by frequency and sometimes by seriousness. The most common side effects commonly appear in the initial sections of the information provided, often categorized as "very common" (e.g. affecting more than 1 in 10 people) or "common" (e.g. affecting 1 in 10 to 1 in 100 people).

As you read further, you'll encounter less frequent side effects, such as "uncommon" or "rare." Any potentially life-threatening or severe side effects are usually highlighted in special sections or noted with warnings, such as black box warnings. These are crucial to pay attention to, as they indicate the need for immediate medical attention if experienced.

Do we have to "add them up?" For instance, if we're already in one medication that causes dizziness, should we avoid another that causes dizziness?

There may be some degree of cumulative effect when taking multiple medications with similar side effects. For instance, if you are already taking a medication that causes dizziness, adding another with the same side effect might increase the intensity or frequency of dizziness. Many medications do have overlapping side effects; however, as mentioned above, this does not necessarily mean that those side effects are guaranteed and that adding the second medication is contraindicated. You should discuss these concerns with your physician who can help balance the benefits and risks, possibly adjusting dosages or finding alternative treatments that minimize overlapping side effects.

When should we report side effects and how?

You should report side effects when they are severe, persistent, or bothersome. Severe side effects, such as chest pain, difficulty breathing, or severe allergic reactions, require immediate medical attention. For less severe side effects, contact your physician to discuss them, as they may require a change in your treatment plan or supportive measures to alleviate them. Finally, always communicate openly with your healthcare provider about your concerns and experiences with medications. They are there to help you find the most effective and safe treatment plan tailored to your needs.
