## ORDINANCE No. 2.

## ORDINANCE REGULATING TRAFFIC

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SUN CITY, KANSAS:

Section 1. That no person shall operate a motor vehicle on any street within the city limits at a rate of speed greater than is reasonable and proper, having regard for the traffic and use of the street and the condition of the street, nor at a rate of speed such as to endanger the life or limb of any person, No person shall operate a motor vehicle on any street within the city limits at a rate of speed greater than twenty (20) miles per hour.

Section 2. All traffic shall <sup>keep</sup> to the right of the center of the street, in the direction in which the vehicle is facing. No person shall operate or park a motor vehicle on the left of the center on any street within the city limits.

Section 3. That the turning of all traffic shall be at the street intersections. No person operating a motor vehicle shall turn around in any street, nor turn across any street, nor drive across any street, only at street crossings. Nor shall any person operating a motor vehicle make a right hand U-turn on any street within the city limits.

Section 4. That the parking of all motor vehicles shall be at the curb, and the right hand side of the street in which the vehicle is facing. The vehicle shall face the curb at an angle of forty-five (45) degrees.

Section 5. That every automobile and truck using any street or alley within the city limits, shall show between one-half hour after sunset and one-half before sunrise two lamps exhibiting white light, visible at a distance of three hundred (300) feet in the direction toward which the vehicle is proceeding, and shall also exhibit a red light, visible at the rear end. That all lights shall be turned down or dimmed in such a way as not to blink or dazzle other users of the street, or users of the alley or sidewalk. It shall be unlawful for any one operating an automobile at truck to direct the rays of a spot light upon other vehicles, or upon persons, while on the streets within the city limits.

Section 6. That any person found guilty of violating any section of this ordinance and upon conviction thereof, shall be subject to fine of not less than one dollar (1.00), and not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00), for each, and any section.

Section 7. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect after the 20th day of March 1930.
