ORDINANCE No. 4.

AN ORDINANCE PREVENTING ANAMMILS AND FOWLES FROM RUNNING AT LARGE WITHIN THE CITY LIMITS.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE GOVERNING BODY OF THE CITY OF SUN CITY, KANSAS:

Section 1. It shall be a violation of this ordinance for any Cattle, Hogs, Horses, Mules, Sheep, Goats, or any other animals, Chickens, Ducks, Geese, or any other fowls, to be permitted to run at large within the city limits. All animals and fowls running at large within the city limits, may be impounded and sold to discharge the cost of impounding and keeping of said animals and fowls.

Section 2. That the owners and harborers of all dogs within the city limits shall pay a city tax of one dollar per head per year. That each and every dog shall wear a license tax tag, and any dog found not wearing a license tax tag, shall be destroyed.

Section 3. That the said license tax tag shall be purchased from the City Clerk, at the annual fee of one dollar. The said license tax tag to bear the ~~name~~ year for which the said annual fee was paid.

Section 4. That the official year for the annual fee for dog license tax shall be from January 1, to December 31. All annual fees are due January 1, of each and every year, but the owner shall have until February 1, in which to secure license tax tags. All dogs found running at large within the city limits without tags after February 1, shall be destroyed.

Section 5. That the owners and harborers of all dogs shall have until May 1 1930 in which to secure tax tags for the year of 1930. All dogs found running at large, without tags, within the city limits after May 1 1930 shall be destroyed. That nothing in this section shall be changed, or caused to be changed, any previous section of this ordinance, after the year 1930 all annual dog license tax fees shall be due January 1.

Section 6. That this ordinance shall be in full force and effect after

APRIL 30th 1930.
