ARTIST STATEMENT BY MARYANN LUCAS

A rumor, early last October, inspired the painting for this year's Sag Harbor American Music Festival. "Conca D'Oro is closing." We had to act quickly. Brad and Telly showed up a few days later outside of Conca D'Oro on a sunny Sunday afternoon. They unpacked their guitars and casually started picking some notes and plucking some strings. As I snapped the photos, I noticed how the pair just fell into harmony. I could hear it in their song, and see it in their body language. There was a comfortable rhythm in their movements. Ah, sweet inspiration! It was that mutual comfort - the ease of what is familiar - that I tried to capture in this year's painting. I saw it in their stance and the way they held their guitars. I saw it too, in the odd colored green awning flanking Conca D'Oro, and in the wooden bench just outside the open door. I saw it and remember it still, in the yellow glow of interior lights, glimpses of the ovens and stacked pizza boxes on the counter, all of which I hope to have conveyed in this year's featured artwork. In the years to come, as the Sag Harbor American Music Festival and the village itself continue to evolve, it will be fun to see which musicians are paired with the locations I hold in my own mind.

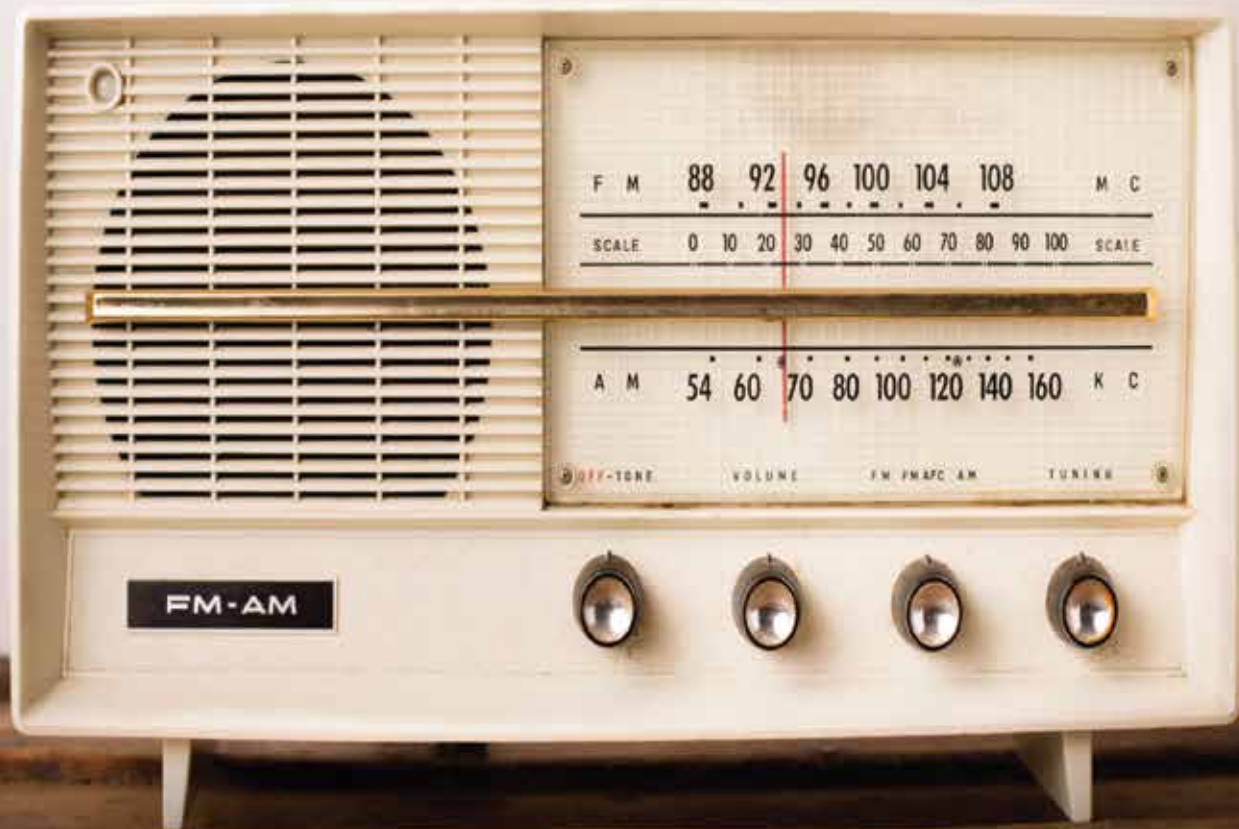

Ode to Live Music

Professional musicians are alchemists. They have the ability to take the original energy of any given room and often transform it to another plane. 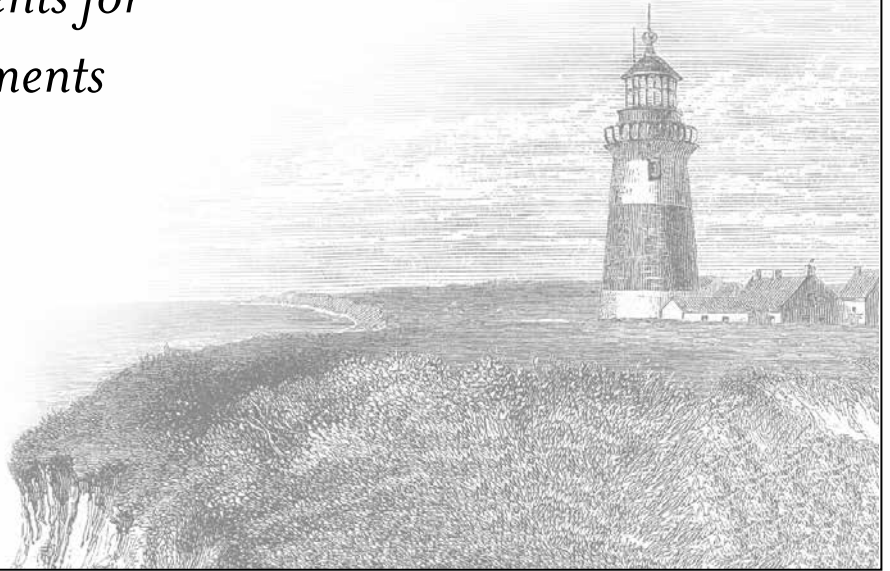

Celebration of Sly and The Family Stone at Bay Street Theater

THE SAG HARBOR AMERICAN MUSIC FESTIVAL kicks-off its eighth year on Thursday, September 27, with a special concert celebration of **Sly and the Family Stone**. A group of East End musicians, directed by Sag Harbor's own Dan Koontz, will bring the seminal funk band's classic songs to life on stage at Bay Street Theater starting at 8 p.m. The set will feature the band's biggest hits, including "Dance to the Music," "Hot Fun in the Summertime," "Everyday People" and "Thank You (Falettinme Be Mice Elf Agin)." So get ready to move to some of the most infectious dance music ever written.

The concert is a dream come true for Koontz, the show's music director. "I remember when I first heard Sly and the Family Stone, it was like a missing piece of the puzzle had been filled in," he said. "They showed again that music doesn't have to be serious in order to be profound. The

fun and joyous abandon of their music communicates freedom and inclusiveness more directly than any words could."

Koontz's plan is to capture the Family Stone's frenetic energy by basing the evening's performance on how the band sounded live.

Sly Stone, also known as Sylvester Stewart, was a singer, songwriter, arranger, multi-instrumentalist and record producer who formed Sly and the Family Stone in San Francisco in 1966. The band was experimental from the start and was racially integrated and gender integrated at a time when both were unheard of in rock music. Sly pioneered psychedelic funk while writing and producing songs that projected the components of soul and funk through the hallucinatory prism of acid rock. The result was music full of quirky breakdowns, surprising sounds and a giddy optimism that belonged more to the counter-culture than

to the band's African-American musical antecedents. The Family Stone's appearance at Woodstock in the summer of '69—they were the only real R&B band on the bill—was the high point of their success.

Why feature a tribute band at a festival known for presenting original music?

"Kerry [Farrell] and I had been playing with the idea of launching a 'Living Legends' series of concerts that celebrate significant American musicians," said SHAMF President Kelly Dodds. "At first we planned to do it as a separate event later in the year, but decided it would have greater impact as the opening night of the Festival. Sly and the Family Stone was an obvious choice to lead off with—we hope everyone has fun with it!"

The hand picked band for the celebration includes Marvin Joshua, Mama Lee Lawler, Joe Lauro, Michael Schiano, Dave Giacone, Eric Kay, Christian Crawford and Koontz himself on the organ.

Tyminski's Southern Gothic Sound Headlines Festival

Annual Friday night concert returns
to Sag Harbor's Old Whalers' Church

*"If I wanted to do something different for the sake of doing something different,
I could have done a lot of that...I've waited until it was my time to say what I had to say." -Dan Tyminski*

DAN TYMINSKI DARING ALBUM SOUTHERN GOTHIC, often makes reference to wispy, otherworldly forces. They're cast as occupants of the AM radio dial, as shadowy figures influencing the subconscious, as the essence of a man tormented by a broken relationship.

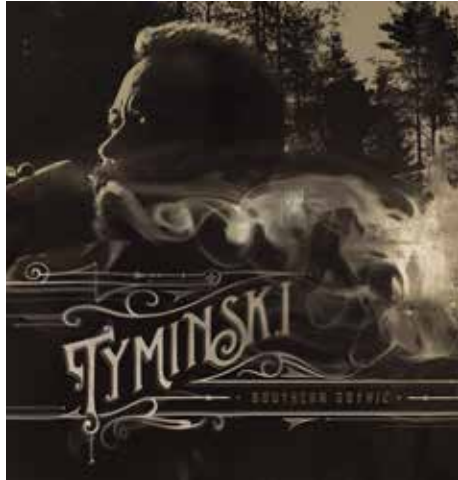
Ghosts could never have inhabited a machine during the bulk of Tyminski's storied career – as one of the premier vocalists in modern acoustic music, he's a member of bluegrass act Alison Krauss + Union Station, a band that doesn't even use a drummer, let alone programmed instruments.

But in "Southern Gothic," all the barriers fell down as a jumble of distinctly separate styles and sounds whipped together to form one unique sonic labyrinth. It's humanity vs. technology, mountain vs. Motown, right vs. wrong, tradition vs. progress, light vs. dark, angel vs. devil.

All of that – and more – is in "Southern Gothic." Not that the listener has to go there. The album is awash in hooky earworms, seductive percussion and Tyminski's stinging tenor. The sound itself is enough to keep a music fan occupied.

"You can listen to it and absolutely ride along and not really have to make a huge investment," Tyminski said. "But if you want to spend a little more time and really think about what the lyric says, there's a message, and if you really want to look at the double meanings, and the hidden meanings behind a lot of the lyric, it will feed you."

Tyminski has fed himself, and his family, for years on the back of his musical talent while working as the ultimate team player. After a stint in the Lonesome River Band, he's been a member of Union Station for 25 years, pitching in on a load of side projects along the way. Tyminski contributed guitar and/or harmony



to projects by Martina McBride, Reba McEntire, Brad Paisley, Dolly Parton, Willie Nelson, Kenny Chesney, Leann Rimes, Aaron Lewis and Rob Thomas, to name a few. He provided the singing voice for George Clooney's on-screen character in "O Brother, Where Art Thou?," earning multiple trophies through the fictitious Soggy Bottom Boys' "I Am a Man of Constant Sorrow." And in 2013, Tyminski sang lead on Avicii's international pop hit "Hey Brother," which reached #1 on charts in at least 18 countries.

Through all of those efforts – and his chart-topping 2008 album "Wheels," credited to the Dan Tyminski Band – Tyminski has racked up 14 Grammy Awards and 18 total nominations. And he's collected an additional 16 trophies from the International Bluegrass Music Association, including four as Male Vocalist of the Year.

But as essential as his contributions have been, Tyminski's always been content to be part of an ensemble.

"I've had opportunities now for a couple of decades to have a solo career," he says. "I never felt the need. I've felt my whole career that I was built and de-

signed to play with Alison and Union Station. God built me to do that."

After hearing a J.D. Crowe album, Tyminski asked for a banjo for his 13th birthday, and it triggered a musical passion that became a full-time job in short order. As a teenager, he toured the East Coast with the Green Mountain Bluegrass Band, emerging as a Southern singer despite his Yankee heritage.

"The people that I was most taken with were all Southern singers: Ricky Skaggs, Tony Rice, Jimmy Martin, Ralph Stanley, to name just a few," Tyminski says. "Apparently I mimicked that in my subconscious because I had people ask me where I was from when I was a teenager, even though I had never lived outside of Vermont."

He left his home state for Virginia in 1988 when he joined the Lonesome River Band, providing lead and harmony vocals and playing mandolin. Four years later, Tyminski accepted a role in Union Station, and spent 12 years commuting from Ferrum, Virginia to Nashville. It was near the end of that period that his Soggy Bottom Boys performance reshaped the way he approached recording music. "I Am a Man of Constant Sorrow" won the Country Music Association's Single of the Year and the O Brother soundtrack sold 10 million copies worldwide, owing in part to its authenticity. The recordings may not have been the first take, but they were live performances in every sense of the word, and they were not made to be perfect.

"Perfection turns out to be something that I had to reconsider," Tyminski says. "Now, to me, perfection is the largest impact on your soul, not the best fit between notes and units of measure. It's no longer as closely tied to math as it is emotion, and O Brother helped do that for me."

Known for her raw, live performances and stellar songwriting, Nancy and her band, The Nancy Atlas Project, are celebrating 22 years together during which time they have opened for almost everyone under the sun. To name a few: Elvis Costello, Lucinda Williams, Toots and the Maytals, Jimmy Buffett, Crosby, Stills and Nash. The reason is simple. When people want a solid

act to open their show and get the crowd warmed up, they call Nancy and her boys because they know they will deliver.

Nancy grew up in Commack, NY with gypsy blood in her veins. Eager to get the buck out of dodge she spent her college years abroad at both Cambridge University in England and Richmond College in London and Florence. She majored in art history, fine art, drinking lots of wine and talking shit. There was a serious recession going on the year she graduated college so instead of becoming a mad advertising executive she walked down to Portabello Road, London, bought a guitar for 60 quid and never looked back. It was pouring buckets of English rain that day so they gave her a black plastic bag to cover her guitar, as it didn't come with a case. Nothing, it is said, can stop true desire.

A mainstay on the impressive roster of performers at The Stephen Talkhouse, Nancy holds the record for most sold-out shows at the venerable establishment. Her "Fireside Sessions" series at Bay Street Theater in Sag Harbor sell out weekly in the dead of winter.

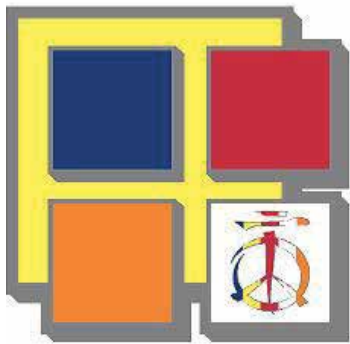
ALFREDO MERAT TRIO
