

THE NANCY ATLAS PROJECT

Nancy Atlas and her band of journeymen (Johnny Blood, Brett King, Neal Surreal and Richard Rosch) have been dominating the East End Music scene on Long Island for quite some time. Known for her raw, live performances and stellar songwriting, Nancy and her band, The Nancy Atlas Project, are celebrating 22 years together during which time they have opened for almost everyone under the sun. To name a few: Elvis Costello, Lucinda Williams, Toots and the Maytals, Jimmy Buffett, Crosby, Stills and Nash. The reason is simple. When people want a solid act to open their show and get the crowd warmed up, they call Nancy and her boys because they know they will deliver.

Nancy grew up in Commack, NY with gypsy blood in her veins. Eager to get the buck out of dodge she spent her college years abroad at both Cambridge University in England and Richmond College in London and Florence. She majored in art history, fine art, drinking lots of wine and talking shit. There was a serious recession going on the year she graduated college so instead of becoming a mad advertising executive she walked down to Portabello Road, London, bought a guitar for 60 quid and never looked back. It was pouring buckets of English rain that day so they gave her a black plastic bag to cover her guitar, as it didn't come with a case. Nothing, it is said, can stop true desire.

A mainstay on the impressive roster of performers at The Stephen Talkhouse, Nancy holds the record for most sold-out shows at the venerable establishment. Her "Fireside Sessions" series at Bay Street Theater in Sag Harbor sell out weekly in the dead of winter.

Nancy lives in Montauk, New York with her husband Thomas, her two sons, Cash and Levon, and her daughter, Tallulah. When she is not writing a song or on stage rocking out, she can be found clamming with her kids, surfing with her kids, walking with her kids, reading with her kids or cartooning for her kids. On rainy days she lazily traces tour maps of Europe with her

right hand while sipping her beloved PG Tibs English Tea and smiling out into the East End Mist.

DAN BAILEY TRIBE

Dan Bailey Tribe presents soul funk reggae inspired by the wanderlust of an endless summer. A native of New York's infamous Hamptons, Bailey's South Af-



rican roots and his command of the West African djembe channel a vibration of celebration. Bailey grew up in a loving family of starving artists, living in harsh contrast to the extravagant wealth of the surrounding Hamptons. As a boy, he taught himself guitar and received the gift of rhythm from his godfather Babatunde Olatunji, world-renowned Master Drummer and cultural ambassador. Bailey studied Olatunji's unique method of teaching West African djembe and by the age of 13, was hosting his own drumming workshops and performing for African dance classes.



BLACK AND SPARROW

Black and Sparrow are a New York based Acoustic Duo that has been performing for years to receptive crowds. In the past they have opened shows for Los Lobos, The Subdudes, The New Riders of the Purple Sage, Mick Taylor, Taj Mahal, Hot Tuna and many other National acts. They have been joined on stage with Charles Neville(Neville Brothers), Roll Hall of Famer "Donna Jean Godchaux" (Grateful Dead) as well as Grammy winner Terrance Simien. Their mix of rock, blues and country has built them a strong reputation for great songs and musicianship Black & Sparrow took on a new dimension with the addition of a full band behind their two acoustic guitars. Randolph A. Hudson III, on Baritone 6 and 12-string guitars. He's played with the Fugs, Psychedelic Furs and toured with "Bong water" and "Magnuson/Kramer". Al Buonanno on bass, played with David Byrne and Rhett Tyler. James Bernard on drums. He studied with drum greats Jack DeJohnette and Tony Williams. BODEGA TALL BOYS

A gang of barnstormers from New York City and Brooklyn, **The Tallboys** sound is the timeless kind, born of lost highways and deep woods. Collectors of roughhewn country and soul tunes, rambling ballads, original barnyard stompers, and classics turned on their heads, this five-piece heart-on-its-sleeve outfit of guitars, mandolin, banjo, dobro and percussion, plays musical chairs every time they take the stage. They swap instruments, trade off vocals, and always deliver a high-octane performance and their infectious brand of urban Americana.

THE BUZZARDS

Besides inciting riotous mayhem and general debauchery, **The Buzzards** have performed at every rockabilly hot spot, including the Rodeo Bar in Manhattan and the Blue Comet just outside of Philly. They are the house band at the



Bayou in Long Island and have performed at the Gold Coast Casino and Orleans Casino in Las Vegas for the Viva Las Vegas Rockabilly Weekend more than ten times. They have performed at the Indy Rockabilly Rebel Weekend, the Heavy Rebel Weekender in North Carolina, and Rock n Rods in Philly. They performed for the Rockabilly Hall of Fame many times, most notably at the 50th anniversary of Elvis Presley's first sold out concert, in Memphis, TN. They are the band of choice to open for national acts and received outstanding praise for their performance with the great Scotty Moore.



GENE CASEY & THE LONE SHARKS

Gene Casey formed the Lone Sharks after moving to Long Island's East End in 1988, having received his baptism performing in the NYC / NJ area (Mudd Club, CBGBs, Maxwell's, et. al) the waning days of punk/new wave. The Lone Sharks became a mainstay in the late 1990s Hamptons music scene, when bars were plentiful and audiences robust and loyal. Throughout the 90s and into the new century Gene and the evolving line-up of Sharks men were the house band at The Wild Rose Cafe, a Bridgehampton night spot where packed houses danced to the roots rock and swing. Gene's original music emerged periodically to great acclaim and local and international indie radio play. Several of Gene's rootsdrenched songs have been used on the soundtracks to television and feature films, including "Justified" and "Sons of Anarchy" ; the 2012 thriller "The Tall Man" starring Jessica Biel, the 2013 release "The Killing Season" starring Robert DeNiro, and Rob Reiner's acclaimed "Being Charlie". March 2017 saw the release of Gene's latest CD, "Guitar In The Rain" an album celebrating the roots of contemporary Americana with original songs that evoke the romantic sweep of 60s pop, classic C&W and the raw untamed spirit of early rock & roll. Selections from the album and those preceding were featured at a wildly successful concert at the prestigious Westhampton Beach Performing Arts Center.

In 2014 Gene and the Lone Sharks were inducted into the Dan's Papers "Best of the Best" Hall of Fame, having been honored for the better part of 20 Years as favorite musicians/band. In 2015, Gene Casey received the LISA, aka, the Long Island Sound Award by the Long Island Music Hall of Fame, for his contributions to the Island's musical landscape. In 2017, the Northforker.com (the on-line arm of the Suffolk Times) named Gene and the group "People of the Year" for 2016.



CAROLINE DOCTOROW& THE BALLAD MAKERS

Singer-songwriter Caroline Doctorow has been called a great champion of American folk music. Her most recent album Dreaming in Vinyl reached #2 on the national folk radio airplay charts. In addition to eleven solo albums, she released the first retrospective of the work of '60s folk icons Richard and Mimi Fariña titled Another Country which received critical acclaim. Ms. Doctorow recently appeared on the PBS special "Pete Seeger's Legacy" along with Taj Mahal, Guy Davis, Dar Williams, and John Cohen. She has opened for The Band, Alison Krauss and Tim O'Brien, among others. For the past four years she and her band The Ballad Makers have been featured performers at the annual Woody Guthrie Folk Festival in Okemah Oklahoma. Her songs and her voice have been heard on both large and small screens. Caroline received The Alexander Award from the Long Island Arts Council in 2017, and an official New York State Proclamation honoring her many years of work as a folksinger. She is the daughter of the late world-renowned author E.L. Doctorow.

DANTE

Combining acoustic indie folk and soul, **Dante Mazzetti** is known for his expressive vocals and multi-instrumental style. Described as a "standout songwriter" (New Music Weekly), "multi-talented musician" (The Independent) and "a marksman of

both vocal skill and finger-plucking" (B-Sides and Badlands), Mazzetti is rooted in tradition yet fearlessly creative. As a multi-instrumentalist, Mazzetti plays most of the instruments on his recordings and during his live



performances he plays a number of instruments in addition to switching instruments throughout his show. Dante was chosen to star in Levi's "What's True" commercial campaign, has won many awards for his songwriting, and was voted Best Male Musician by the popular Hampton's publication, Dan's Papers. Artists such as Ben Folds, Guster, and America have included him as an opening act for their tours and festival performances.

Dante released Hotel Vol 1 on July 26, 2019. "Hey Now," the first track off of this EP, was described as including "a sprinkle of Prince, a dash of Dylan, a hint of Guthrie" (LA on Lock) and "more than earns its four-minutes-plus run time" (B-Sides and Badlands). It was included in many "best of" lists in the music blogosphere. Dante is currently in the studio working on the second EP in this series, Hotel Vol. 2. This four song album is set to be released on November 22, 2019. A portion of the proceeds from Hotel Vol. 2 and it's release show will go to First Responders Children's Foundation.

SOFIA D'ANGELO

At 14 years old, **Sofia** busked in a small town in Long Island on a hot summer day. She played songs by all of her favorite artists, as well as a few originals she had written in her bedroom that she never thought would see



the light of day. "It was truly an eye-opening moment," she recalls. "I knew I wanted to do music for the rest of my life, but now it seemed like the only thing to do. Why would I pursue anything else?" Now, at 20 years old, she studies Recorded Music at NYU.

When she's not in class, she is at home writing and producing more songs, and playing all of these tunes live in front of audiences around the city. "Producing is great because you can see the song building to where you want it to be, and I can now do that as I'm writing it. That's special about being a musician right now." Sofia says.

Taking inspiration from The 1975 ("I... love that band so damn much") to Led Zeppelin to Lorde to Joni Mitchell to Tears for Fears to Rihanna, Sofia's variety of taste comes together through her aesthetic filter to present a new, unique artist who uses the city, her relationships, and her femininity as powerful tools in her songs. She takes the stage recklessly but with care, ensuring everyone in the crowd is included and having fun. Sofia D'Angelo is one to watch.



IOE DELIA & THIEVES

Joe Delia has two gold records and one platinum. He is known internationally for his blazing blues piano onstage and his 30-plus feature film scores. Locally, he is known for his songs like "Under the Montauk Moon."

Delia started in music as a child, signed to RCA Records in his early teens and bacame one of the first Muppets on the Ed Sullivan Show. After that, life as a studio musician in NYC and as a producer and touring composer had him working with such varied artists as Dusty Springfield, Stanley Turrentine, Phoebe Snow to Dave Edmunds and many more. He's played live with Bruce Springsteen and Keith Richards, among others. Joe also has 30 feature film scores to his credit, including "King of New York" and "The Bad Lieutenant" and many documentaries. He has just completed his work on "Siberia" with Abel Ferrara and Willem DaFoe.

Delia likes to keep playing live on this side of the pond, mostly on the East End, where he invites some of the best musicians he knows, to play with his "Joe Delia & Thieves". This show features Klyph Black, James Benard, and Al Buonanno. Background singer PJ Delia will be featured as well as they play seldom heard classic rock n roll and country and originals.



ESCOLA DE SAMBA BOOM

In 2002 a group of drummers met to explore Brazilian rhythms and started a journey that would take them to **Escola de Samba BOOM**. Today BOOM is a tight and swinging Bateria (percussion section) of thirty members who have filled their souls with music from the heart. Our premise has always been to give it away and it

will come back to us, and it has. Based in what is called the "Hamptons" or the East End of Long Island, BOOM has performed at community events and festivals, sharing the sounds of Brazilian percussion - Samba.



INDA EATON

Inda Eaton is a singer-songwriter-storyteller in the tradition of Americana roots rock. Often compared to a fusion of Melissa Etheridge meets John Mellencamp, Inda's original music & observational humor often mine wanderlust and epic adventure to explore topics of resilience, community & connection.

In a rare convergence, the band on stage with Inda at SHAMF this year feature many of the musicians who perform on Shelter in Place. Shelter in Place, Inda Eaton's 8th independently produced album is a stunning mix of emotionally charged anthems, ballads, and boot-stompers, featuring B. Rehm-Gerdes, Michael Gugliemo, Jeff Marshall and Jeffrey Smith (with special appearances by Eve Nelson, Nancy Atlas, Lee Lawler and Rose Lawler). This collection of eleven story-rich songs highlights the power of human connection and offers a dashboard-drumming, heart-healing journey through life, death, laughter and love.



EDNA'S KIN

Edna's Kin is a family band based in Sag Harbor. Patriarch Warren Koontz plays bass and sings, eldest son Andrew plays fiddle and sings, and youngest son Dan plays guitar and sings. They play Americana music, including many original songs inspired by classic country and blues music, as well as countrified covers of some of the most unlikely songs. While the origins of the band extend back to the early 80s when the family lived together and played together fre-

quently, the current incarnation began in 2007. Since that time, Edna's Kin has performed many concerts and played at numerous festivals throughout the Northeast. Their debut CD, Whiskey and Wine, was released in April 2019, and it features 11 original songs written by Dan Koontz and arranged by the band.

GOAT ON A BOAT MUSICAL PUPPET SHOW

Henrietta, the singing chicken longs to be a star on Broadway but the Mean Ol' Farmer is going to put her in a stew if she doesn't produce an egg

They are among only 50 established puppet theaters listed by the Puppeteers of America. Through puppet shows, puppet playgroups, family workshops, and special events, Goat on a Boat invites families in the community to be entertained and to become involved in their own cultural and creative education.

JANE HASTAY & PETER MARTIN WEISS

Peter met pianist Jane Hastay in San Francisco while on tour and soon after they were married. The couple produced a CD entitled Never Never Land, named after a song that en-



courages us to follow our dreams. Peter and Jane have a brand new CD with saxophonist Richie Scollo entitled "The Good Life." Click here to purchase it. As an educator, Peter taught at the State University of NY at New Paltz on the jazz faculty. Now living in East Hampton, he currently teaches private guitar and bass lessons, sings with the Choral Society of the Hamptons and performs locally on bass and guitar.



HOPEFULLY FORGIVEN

Hopefully Forgiven - voted 'Best Band in the Hamptons' by Dan's Papers for the past two years - is a high-energy, mellow-vibin', harmony soaked cocktail of 100 years of American music and spirits. Singer/song-writers Telly Karoussos, and 'Alabama Brad' Penuel (fresh from Nashville) deliver big harmonies and authentic songwriting that transcend the 'Americana' genre and has attracted a devoted multi-generational fan base.

The brotherhood that is Hopefully Forgiven began shortly after a chance meeting through an internet post when Brad offered his Brooklyn railroad apartment to Telly in exchange for watching his dog. After sizing each other up and realizing they shared a passion for music and surfing, Brad said "I think this will work. My house is yours--you can even play my guitar if you want....just don't touch my boots."

Telly didn't and they soon began working up their favorite songs by the Stones, the Band, Van Morrison, etc. Brad even showed him some bluegrass tunes, and the course for Hopefully Forgiven was set. Hopefully Forgiven's debut EP, Soaked, is now available everywhere.

THE JAM SESSION LATIN EDITION

The Jam Session Inc. was conceptualized in 2009 aiming to create a live Jazz experience accessible to audience members of all demographics and ages, as well as creating a platform for local and global musicians to network and perform before a live audience. The Jam Session has become a staple of live Jazz on Long Island with its weekly live performances.

The Jam Session Radio Hour has been broadcast since 2011. All sessions are recorded live-to-tape and aired weekly on NPR station WPPB 88.3FM. In 2011 we introduced our Special Guest Series to help promote local and global musicians as well as showcasing the wide range of Jazz.

With each special guest featured we invite guest musicians to sit in, creating a wonderful gumbo of up-and-coming musicians and world class musicians - a concept unique to The Jam Session. We also showcase Latin/Jazz Night once a month - celebrating the unique sound and development of Afro/Latin Jazz. The Jam Session also collaborate with other organizations and venues, such as Duck Creek Arts Center, Baron's Cove, Southampton Arts Center, The Jazz Foundation of America and Keyed Up. JAKE LEAR

Raised on the music of John Lee Hooker, Jimi Hendrix and Howlin Wolf, **Jake Lear** is dedicated to the music of the blues. Spending years in Memphis, TN along with his drummer Roy Cunningham and bass-



ist Carlos Arias. The trio recorded three albums. The last being 2013 DIAMONDS & STONES. Jake recently moved back to the east end of Long Island where he lives with his wife, the artist Anna DeMauro, their daughter Lucia, and son.



LUDMILLA & MARCELLO

The international "Bossa Nova" rage is generally dated from the November 21, 1962 concert at Carnegie Hall in NYC, which featured among others Sergio Mendes and his group, João and Astrud Gilberto, Tom Jobim and Roberto Menescal.

This genre has remained popular and has recently experienced resurgence in Brazil as well as entered the repertoire and rhythmic language of jazz and popular music around the world.

For the past 20 years **Ludmilla** has been developing a solid reputation, working with renowned MPB (Musica Popular Brasileira) artists. Carefully selecting her repertoire, she finds new meaning in the music of such great composers as Tom Jobim, Carlos Lyra and Edu Lobo.

Since 1998 the singer has received a tremendous reception performing in the New York area, always accompanied by Marcello Pimenta. Together, they give an exciting high-energy performance that is truly unforgettable.



MAMALEE ROSE & FRIENDS

MamaLee Rose and Friends is a 7-member band out of East Hampton, N.Y. They are unique in that they feature 2 dynamic lead vocalists, the mother-daughter team of MamaLee Lawler (having done backups with Bonnie Raitt and Little Feat) and A.Rose Lawler Kerin (singing with local singer songwriters Inda Eaton and Nancy Atlas).

They are backed up by husband/father Jim Lawler on drums (having traveled with local singer songwriter Michael Weis-

kopf); Al Buonnano on down and dirty bass (played with David Byrne of Talking Heads, Roger McGuinn of Byrds); Peter "Bosco" Michne, Eastern Long Island's finest on guitar (look for his CD, "Unsung Heroes); Klyph Black (of Black and Sparrow, and Rumor Has It) shifts from bass to slide, to acoustic and electric guitars; and Fred Gilde (with Lynn Blue's band and the Moondogs), the Manhattan bred keyboard player who kicks that keyboard, no matter what genre.

They have a distinctive sound that is all their own, from Mama Lee's gospel Blues background to daughter Rose's soulful and powerful vocal interpretations. From Originals to R&B, soul, rock and standards they have a diverse reputation for whatever venue they play. Their live shows are a joy to hear and to watch. Enjoy!



PETE MANCINI

Diversion Records Recording Artist **Pete Mancini** got his start as the frontman and primary songwriter of Butchers Blind, a critically acclaimed rock band from NYC. King. In the big city they make people dance in subway stations, parks and at their club dates at nublu, the Blue Note and Brooklyn Bowl, among others. They also have been playing as a marching band, namely at the spectacular NYC Village Halloween Parade.

Underground Horns is led by alto sax-ophonist Welf Dorr. Originally from Munich (Germany), Dorr moved to New York in 1995 where he played/recorded with Sonny Simmons, Frank Lacy, Sabir Mateen, Butch Morris, Kenny Wollesen, Jojo Kuo and Vernon Reid. He performed in the US, Europe, Mexico, Brazil and Egypt including festivals such as Willisau (Switzerland) or Central Park SummerStage as well as places as City Hall of New York.






UNSUNG HEROES
