

South Meadow School honors Silegy

Athletic director's legacy includes more than 250 victories as soccer coach

South Meadow School celebrated retiring Athletic Director Tod Silegy and presented him with a commemorative banner.

Silegy is retiring after a 24-season career which included over 250 victories. During the last home soccer game of the season, South Meadow School celebrated Silegy during a special halftime ceremony to honor his legacy and commitment to students and players both on and off the field.

Silegy was presented with a tribute for his dedication and impact at South Meadow with a commemorative banner that will hang in the rafters of the gymnasium.

"Mister Silegy's impact extends far beyond the soccer field. He has been a guiding force, pushing players to reach their highest potential while shaping their character," stated Principal Tim Conway. "His dedication to excellence both on and off the field has made him the embodiment of South Meadow School's spirit. His absence will be keenly felt, and he will be greatly missed."

Silegy, a member of the original ConVal High School graduating class in 1971, played soccer, basketball and baseball for Keene State College. He spent 22 years as men's soccer coach at Franklin Pierce University, leading the Ravens to eight straight NCAA Division II tournaments. He left Franklin Pierce in 1999 and was hired at South Meadow School in 2000.

At South Meadow, Silegy has served as a physical education teacher, athletic director and coach, and in 2011, was named New Hampshire Middle School P.E. Teacher of the Year. He has also run soccer camps in the area, including keeping the camp going during the COVID pandemic.

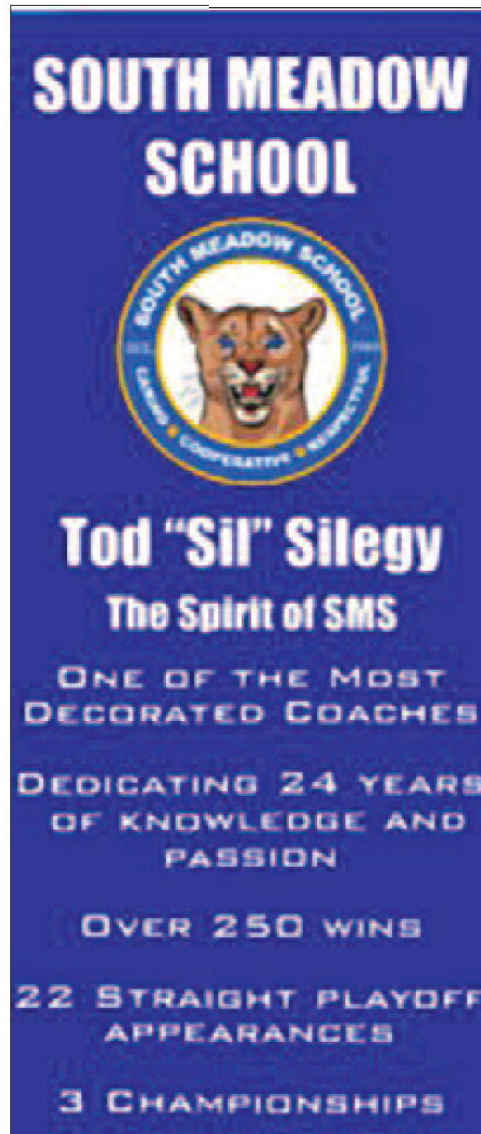
