

RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. Code of conduct and Liability Waiver must be signed by all players that participate in our events. No exceptions.
- 2. All participants must be 18 years of age or 16 with parental consent and signature.
- 3. All events use Utrip balls. Classic M's or Pro M's only. Must be stamped on the ball. (Available for purchase, \$8 each or 3 for \$20). Open bats in Sandlot and Tournaments
- A. Super Draft and Sandlot, balls are provided.
- B. Regular tournaments, provide your own.
- 4. Commitment lines. There will be a commitment line between 3rd and home. Once a runner crosses that line they are required to continue on. Once a player crosses that line it is a force out at home. The black mat is not part of the plate for the force out. Runners that have passed over may not be tagged out and any and forms of sliding across the line is considered an out. Any runner that runs into the batters box or touches the plate or mat are considered out. All runners must cross the line that extends out or to the right of it extended to the fence. You are considered passed the line once you have one foot touch the line or your foot touches the ground passed it. The force out is complete once the player catches the ball with any part of their body in contact with the plate.
- 5. Field conditions. Any condition that deems the fields unplayable will be decided as soon as possible by the city staff or G Sports Az staff. In the event of a cancellation during an event it will be rescheduled or a prorated G Sports Az event credit will be issued as needed. Event cancellation will result in a refund of deposits or fees.
- 6. Orange Bag. There is an orange bag at first base for the runners safety on a ground ball. If the runner interferes with the fielder and touches the white bag they may be called our for interference. Also, the fielder may record an out by touching the orange bag if the play requires them to do so. Umpires will use best judgment on all plays in regards to the double bag.
- 7. In all coed events 5 women are required to play defense (except Sandlot/Draft) and can play any position defensively. You are not required to have M/F split at pitcher and catcher. You may play more than 5 women in the field.
- 8. Batting order is up to 14 players in all events. In coed events your batting order must rotate M/F. If you have less than 5 female batters then those empty spots are outs. If you walk a male batter before an automatic out that batter shall receive 2 bases before the out is recorded. In tournament play you may bat extra females but the order must stay the same all the way through so females may bat back to back.
