Partnership formed with Millennium Community School



The Nutter Center for Empowering Women is excited to announce a new partnership formed with Millennium Community School 3500 Refugee Road Columbus, OH 43232.

Beginning August 2021, our licensed mental health and behavioral health professionals will be integrated into the school and following the school calendar.

Our experienced team of clinical staff will be providing individual counseling, group therapy, family therapy, case management services and life-skills training (The SUCCESS Program) to youth and families, during school and during after-school programs and prevention services.

With the implementation of school-based services The Nutter Center for Empowering Women will provide behavioral health services that promote well-being, prevention and intervention services that are used to modify risk exposures and strengthen and complement the coping mechanisms of youth and their families.

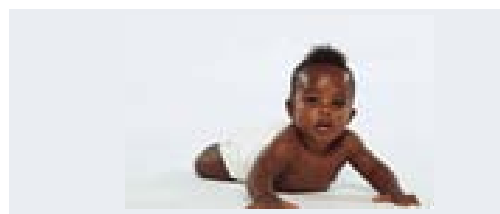
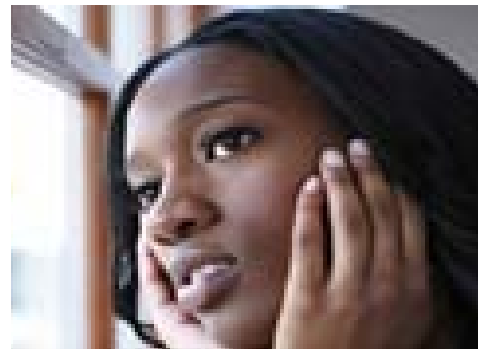
