

#### **Member Concerns:**

Heidi Engel thanked the committee for all they do. She brought up concerns regarding the organist vacancy and the lack of trained members for technology that supports our church services, funerals and weddings. If we use the new computer-generated music, it still requires someone to run it. Have we pursued any other possible organist or pianist who could cover the weekends that Heidi doesn't? Ultimately, we need additional help with music and technology.

#### **Reports:**

July 9<sup>th</sup> minutes were reviewed. Motion to approve the minutes was made by Sandy and seconded by John, motion carried.

**Treasurer:** Lauren presented the treasurer's report. Motion to approve the Treasurer's report was made by Jodi and seconded by Darrick, motion carried.

- **Giving:** Deanna presented the giving report. She also shared possible envelopes or mailing booklets we can use to send to members. It was agreed that we would try the booklets mailed out twice a year to members, motion was made by Darrick and 2<sup>nd</sup> by Jodi, motion carried to do a 1-year trial of the booklets. It was also discussed that we should work on getting updated addresses for all members and that adult children, regardless if living at home, should receive their own booklets. Our QR code will also be included on the booklets to encourage online giving if it is preferred.
- **Pr. Mandy's report:** 2 baptisms planned for Aug 31 & Sep 14, 1 funeral for a member and one funeral for nonmember at the funeral home (they had attended a funeral at Augustana and reached out to have Pastor Mandy do this funeral), Wedding planned for September 20. VBS was a great success with average of 80 children attending throughout the week and the total cost to AES was \$88.67 which will be split between the 2 churches, thanks given to those who used their Thrivent dollars to offset these costs, it much appreciated. The ROAR pool party on August 7<sup>th</sup> was well attended with 45 people attending, plans being made to partner with other local congregations on this next year. Activities and programs are being planned for next year, including confirmation, ROAR & Youtherans. Pastor Heather from the synod office will be doing

services on August 17<sup>th</sup>, Pastor Mandy will be doing services at the Ecumenical Butterfield Threshing Bee. Lyla will be conducting services and support August 21-25<sup>th</sup> so Pastor Mandy can take some time off.

#### **Committee Reports:**

**Education:** \*See Pastor Mandy's report. Rally Sunday will be on September 28<sup>th</sup> at our Joint Service @ 10 AM at Augustana. Blessing of the Back Packs is planned for Sunday, September 7th. New member Katie Vogt has agreed to join the education committee and assist with teaching.

**Evangelism/Social Ministry:** Did not meet this month. Gift packets were given to the new members we received in August.

**Worship, Music & Technology:** Feedback has been very positive on the All Creation Sings worship and music. More help is needed for both music and technology. The council will look at ways to recruit members as well as possibly non-members to assist with this. Looking for possibly creating a stand-alone Technology group with sign-ups for all year to cover church services and resource people to cover funerals. Funerals are particularly difficult as they are shorter notice and most often during the week. Brewed Theology will take place on August 26<sup>th</sup>. Plans are being made to do a Christmas Music sing along at Praise at the Pub (Eagles Club) to coincide with the Winter Carnival or another date in December.

**Finance:** Jeff Price reported on our unsuccessful search for cost effective property insurance. Jeff thanked Jodi C. for assistance. Both did a great deal of work. We are looking at having our current agent report to the council on our current coverage and possible ways to save money.

**Property/Cemetery:** Andy Freitag updated the council on building projects including some water issues; mold was removed from a closet, and other measures have been taken to prevent future issues. He suggested the need for gutters at the cost of \$500, Sandy moved to approve this cost with Jeff 2<sup>nd</sup> the motion, motion was carried.

**Youth/Ministry:** Annual camp out was on August 9<sup>th</sup> at East. Car wash created \$365 in funds. Food shelf volunteer project was a great learning experience. 500 plus families are served by our local food shelf. We will be assisting at the Threshing Bee again this year. August 24<sup>th</sup>, we have Bingo at the nursing home planned, this is a big hit with both the nursing home residents and the youth. We are in the process of planning a Root Beer float stand at Relay for Life, if this doesn't work out, we will try to find another way to raise funds for Relay for Life. October a Confirmation Banquet will be on the 22<sup>nd</sup> with Confirmation scheduled for October 26<sup>th</sup>. We have 2 confirmands. Additional plans are in the works for November and beyond.

#### **Old Business:**

Stewardship: Discussion about a possible Fall meal.

Membership List/Directory: Mackenzie Miest will be asked to present at the next AES Joint Meeting. We appreciate Mackenzie's assistance in getting a photo directory created.

#### **New Business:**

Funerals – Discussion on technology and assistance with organizing funerals.

The meeting was adjourned, and we closed with the Lord's Prayer.
