PASTOR'S COLUMN

Dear Church,

As I write this column, there is great pain happening in our world. I sometimes find myself feeling a great weight as I sit in my office - comfortable, privileged, and safe - knowing parts of the world are literally burning from bombs and violence. It's always been that way though, hasn't it? Joy and comfort existing simultaneously with pain and oppression. It's the paradox we live in. Some are celebrating new babies and engagements in one part of the world while others are starving and losing their homes to missiles in another part.

What should our Christian response be to the suffering in our world right now? The flag outside my office is flying at half-staff due to political violence in our own state. The people in Gaza are literally starving to death. Political leaders are boasting about dropping bombs. Immigrants are living in constant fear. What does the Bible say about how Christians should respond when our neighbors are in dire circumstances?

The answer is empathy. Empathy, the ability to understand and share the feelings of another, is a profound biblical principle that reflects the heart of Christian compassion and love. The Scriptures call believers to empathize with those who suffer, following the example of Jesus Christ, who demonstrated perfect empathy during His earthly ministry.

Empathizing with the suffering involves both emotional and practical responses. Christians are called to listen, understand, and share in the pain of others, offering comfort and support. This may involve prayer, providing for physical needs, or simply being present with those who are hurting.

The Church, as the body of Christ, is called to be a community of empathy, where people support one another in times of trial. Hebrews 13:3 reminds believers to "Remember those in prison as if you were bound with them, and those who are mistreated as if you were suffering with them." This verse encourages believers to identify with the suffering of others, fostering a spirit of unity and compassion.

Empathy requires us to step outside of ourselves and to place our attention on others. This can be challenging due to the fact that we are constantly being fed a narrative of self-perseverance, but nonetheless, empathy is the call of the Christian. How can we as a church foster a spirit of empathy? What tangible things can we do to show that we are breaking along those who are broken, weeping with those who weep, and accompanying those who are fleeing?

The weight I am feeling right now as I find myself in a position of privilege, safety and comfort is what I believe to be the Holy Spirit calling me to action. Will you take action with me? I am dreaming of organizing an action group within the church to really focus on this idea of empathetic movements to help our neighbors. Will this offend some people? Probably. Is it worth it? Absolutely. After all, Jesus Christ Himself offended a whole bunch of people - all the way to the cross. Let us stand with the marginalized and let us proclaim God's inclusive love to all God's people.


