- Mentor educators in teaching Essential Skills and incorporating Essential Skills into lessons
- Offers in-depth customized training workshops that develop workplace Essential Skills expertise
- Increases awareness of Essential Skills and builds capacity by presenting Essential Skills topics nationally and internationally.
- Assists educators with writing and publishing educational resources
- Hosts national conferences for educators on Essential Skills topics
