Luke 14:1-14

You will be repaid at the resurrection of the just.”

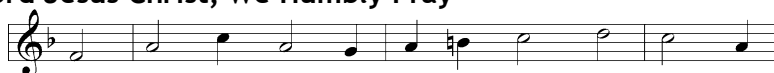

Each table will be dismissed with the words, "Depart in peace," and you may return to your row by one of the side aisles.
