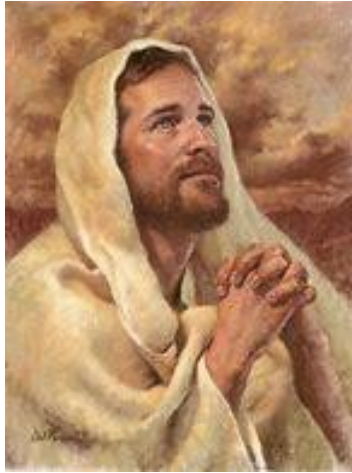

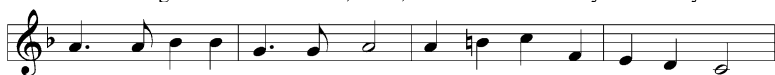
## Distribution


