BLUNT, LUETKEMEYER HONORED BY MISSOURI ROA

Major Awards Presented at Annual State Convention

Lake Ozark, MO: The Missouri Department of the Reserve Officers Association of the United States (MO ROA) presented **Missouri Senator Roy Blunt** with its **Nathan Hale Award** for “outstanding individual service in the interest of national security.” MO ROA also lauded **Representative Blaine Luetkemeyer (R-MO 3rd D)** with the **Twice The Citizen Award** for “his faithful and tireless work in support of a strong national security and efforts on behalf of reservists, their families and the ROA.” Both awards were presented at MO ROA’s annual state convention held at Lake Ozark, MO on April 22-24, 2016.

Citing **Senator Blunt’s** long-standing support of matters directly affecting Missouri military members, outgoing MO ROA President, **Major Layne Wroblewski, USAFR** presented the **Nathan Hale Award** at the conclusion of a briefing from **Senator Blunt** on current national security issues. The highest award eligible from an ROA State Department, Maj Wroblewski acknowledged the senator’s efforts indicating, “the high level of success realized by both active and reserve components from Missouri can be directly attributed to the support of the military provided by **Senator Blunt.**”

The MO ROA convention is a significant opportunity for active, reserve and retired military members to be updated on current national and international security measures. “The informational exchange between attendees and the speakers at this year’s convention is some of the best and most timely available,” said Captain Dick Kallemeier (USN-Ret), MO ROA Secretary. “This dialogue between members, leadership and our elected officials is critical if we are going to be effective in communicating service members’ needs to those in command and elective office...and the feedback is also helpful to understand the total mission for national security.”

In presenting the **Twice The Citizen Award**, Maj Wroblewski acknowledged “**Congressman Luetkemeyer** has and continues to be a strong voice for us in congress, supporting the needs of members of the Missouri Guard and Reserve communities. The constant interface between civilian life, employers, families and the needs of the national command authority would be a dauntless task were it not for the congressman’s assistance and support.”

As a key function of the convention, MO ROA announced the selection of the following drilling reserve officers for their significant contributions to their service branches and units as **MO ROA Officers of the Year.**
