The OneSeed Teacher Training Team is working alongside 23 teachers from Pre-K to Junior High School classes at our partner school, Wisdom Ways Academy (WWA). Each teacher is paired with one of our professional trainers and works with them one-on-one three days a week. Throughout the first quarter OneSeed Teacher Training Team have completed initial observations, teacher personal development plans, and assessed school, teacher, and student needs. Teachers started Phase 2 with a large group training on Classroom Management. They are currently implementing the skills they learned in the training into their classrooms with the help of their teacher trainer.

The OneSeed team is very grateful to partner with City Hearts Africa to implement their Emerging Voices Resource Pack into our Teacher Training Program. OneSeed has aligned the Emerging Voices Resource Pack with the Ghana National Curriculum and implemented the projects in Basic 6 Class at Wisdom Ways Academy. Students will be taken through these three phases throughout the school year. Students are currently in Phase 1 learning about historical slavery in Ghana. The students are very excited to participate in the Emerging Voices Project.

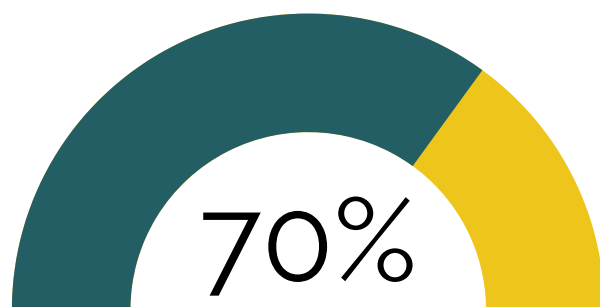

Program Review

Quarter Goals

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-Teachers at WWA have implemented classroom management strategies that have increased student engagement and instructional time.

-Students can teach their community about their Sister School's culture using cultural elements.

-Basic 6 students at WWA can explain the cause and effect of the Trans-Atlantic Slave Trade.

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-Teachers at WWA have implemented new teaching methods, enabling critical thinking, collaboration, and student-led learning.

-Students have worked together across Sister Schools to identify conservation issues in their communities and brainstorm solutions.

-Basic 6 students can identify the main forms of human trafficking and recognize warning signs of human trafficking activity.

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-Teachers at WWA will understand how to differentiate to meet the needs of all learners and integrate technology into student learning.

-In collaboration with their Sister School students will learn their role as a global citizen.

-Basic 6 students will teach their community about the dangers of human trafficking and how to help prevent human trafficking in their community.

Challenges

Throughout the first quarter of our pilot project, the OneSeed team has learned about additional challenges that our partner school faces. Below are the main challenges that we the OneSeed team have recognized.

1. Lack of Teaching and Learning Materials.
2. Girls missing school because a lack of menstrual hygiene sanitary resources and education.
3. Lack of foundational reading and numeracy skills across WWA.
4. Lack of safe environment for students to play during break.

Resolutions

The OneSeed team alongside the WWA administration have taken the following steps in an effort to resolve the challenges listed above.

1. Fundraising through DonorSee for teacher resource packs, and donations from surrounding schools.
2. Partnership with Start From Ghana to implement their Sisterhood Program, providing 110 girls at WWA menstrual hygiene education and sanitary kits.
3. Working alongside WWA teachers to implement reading and math interventions for students.
4. Working with WWA administration to design a safe playground environment for students.



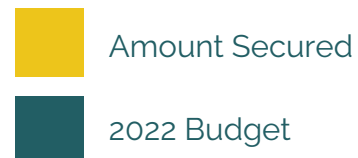
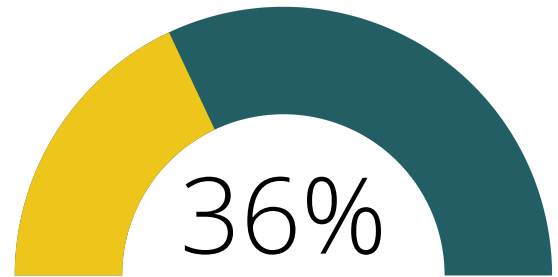
Financial Review

Summary

The OneSeed team is very grateful for the generosity of all of our donors that have helped us to operate throughout the first quarter of the year. Individual donations make up 96% of our funding so far. We are grateful for each contribution.

OneSeed's main program cost is providing our partner schools with free professional development from our professional teacher training team. Teacher training is a major need across schools in Ghana and the cost of training often puts schools and teachers in lower socio-economic communities at a disadvantage. We recognize that many schools can not cover the costs for professional teacher training consultants and materials. Our goal as OneSeed is to provide teachers with equal opportunity for professional development, allowing all students access to quality education.

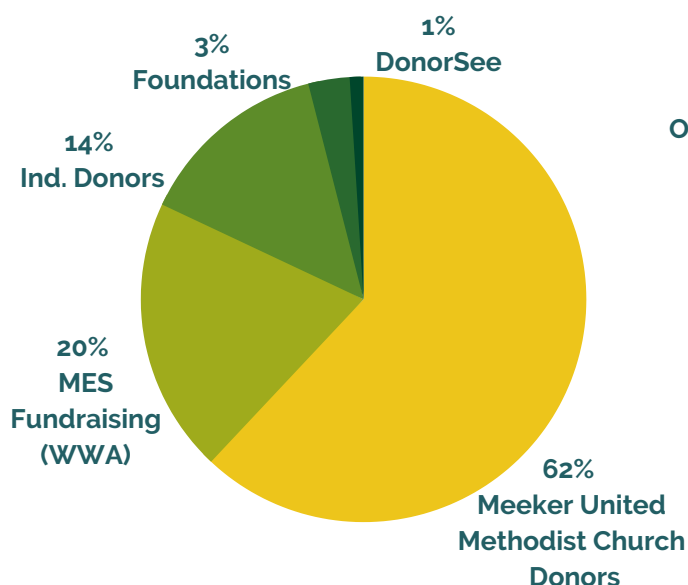
As we are in our initial phases of our programs, the expenses for program materials will gradually increase throughout the year. We have also become aware of more material needs at our partner school. We are currently raising funds through DonorSee that will help meet these needs.



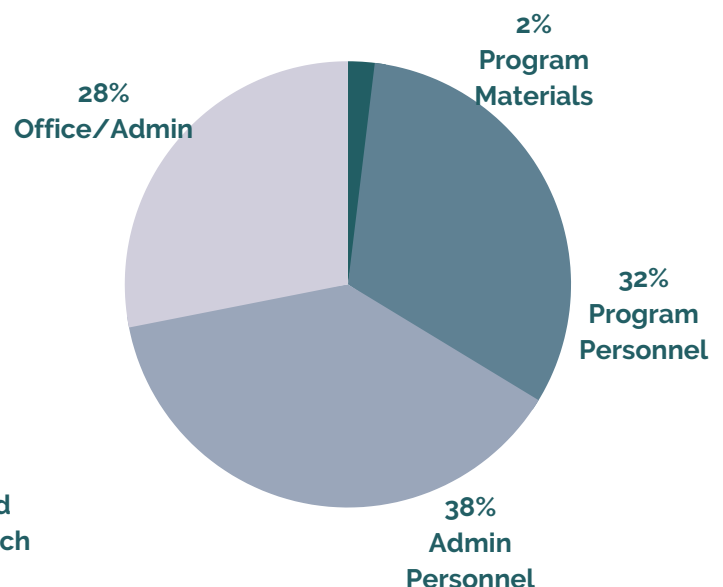
OneSeed is registered as a nonprofit in Ghana with both the Regist General's Office and the Ministry of Gender, Children and Social Protection. OneSeed is also registered as a non-profit in the State of Colorado, and currently undergoing the application for our 501c3 status.

Receiving funds from larger foundations and organizations has been a challenge for us as we have not yet received our 501c3 status, and this is our first year operating as a nonprofit. We are praying that as we complete this process and continue to operate, more doors will open for OneSeed to receive larger grants and donations.

Revenue



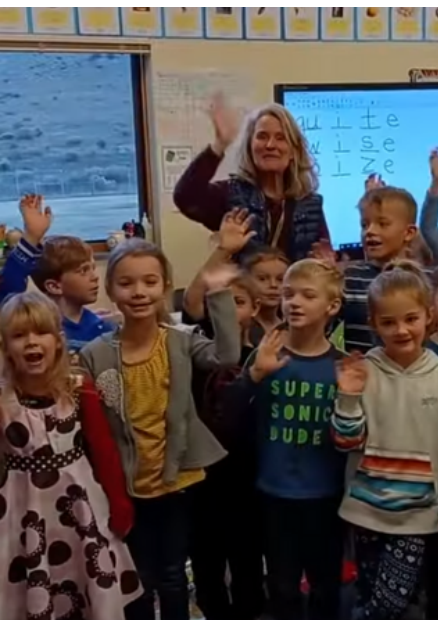
