On Monday, July 4th 2011, Aldan Borough celebrated Independence Day with its annual parade and festivities. REAL DEMOCRATS WIN PRIMARY ELECTION!

Aldan Democrats responded to the challenge of cross-filed Republican candidates in the May 2011 Primary Election. For William Penn School Director, Aldan Democratic Organization founding member, Frank Lane defeated Republican incumbent Bob Reardon for the Democratic nomination by a 3.5 to 1 margin.

In contested races for seats on the Delaware County Court of Common Pleas, the 4 endorsed candidates, Michael Schleigh, Nathaniel Nichols, G. Lawrence DeMarco and Sally Ann Heckert-Bikin, won Aldan Borough by more than 2 to 1 margins over their Republican crossed filed opponents and were the four vote leaders county wide. These results guarantee a voice for Democrats in the General Election on November 8, 2011.

In the race for state-wide Judge of the Commonwealth Court, endorsed candidate Kathryn Boockvar won in Aldan Borough by an almost 6 to 1 margin; carried Delaware County more than 4 to 1 and was nominated state wide by only 2,052 votes!!

The primary election victories provide the foundation for strongly contested races at the state, county and local levels in November. Four Aldan Borough Council members with Democratic candidates Michael Ceci, Paul Krueger, Sarah Robertson and Ben Williams will be elected this fall and three Delaware County Council seats, with Democratic candidates Keith Collins of Ridley Park, Lin Floyd of Wallingford and Jayne Young of Lansdowne are also on the ballot.

AT WHAT COST? SCHOOL DISTRICT HOLDS PROPERTY TAX LINE

At the June 27, 2011 general meeting of the William Penn School Board, the members voted on a zero property tax increase budget. The final \$83 million budget is \$6 million less than the preliminary proposal. With the final numbers now available from the state budget, which was finalized at 11:45 PM on Thursday, June 30, 2011, there is a \$600,000 gap between approved expenditures and projected income.

To reach the final 2011 - 2012 numbers, 43 full time teachers and administrative staff positions were eliminated, that reduction is in addition to the 30 positions eliminated for 2010 - 2011. Also, another 40 part time lunch

room monitors were eliminated. There were concessions by several negotiating

groups including teachers who will take a 2.5% pay increase next year instead of the 4.5% increase negotiated in their current contract.

While our district struggles to close the \$5 million reduction in state aid pushed by Republican Governor Tom Corbett and the loss of federal stimulus money, state

employees will receive a 10% pay increase over the next 4 years. This

contract negotiated by Governor Corbett is in addition to the 1.8% pay increase

this year to our elected representatives and senators and to state judges despite calls by the Republicans for pay freezes and give backs by teachers and administrators at all state school districts. Most school districts, including our own William Penn, cut staff positions and programs to offset

reduced state and federal funding.
