### DEMOCRATIC PRIMARY ELECTION RESULTS

On Tuesday, May 15, 2018, 661 voters (25% of those eligible) cast ballots in Aldan Borough during the Municipal Primary Election. 409 Democrats or 26% eligible voted and in the contested races, all candidates supported by the Aldan Democratic Organization, for Lt. Governor, for Congress and for State Senator won in Aldan Borough. None of those candidates won the primary

because they were out-voted in other parts of their districts.

In the General Election, the Democratic Candidates for those offices will be: John Fetterman of Allegheny County for Lt. Governor, Mary Gay Scanlon of Swarthmore for Congress and Tim Kearney of Swarthmore for State Senate.

In the contested race for Democratic State Committee, of the six candidates

supported by the Aldan
Democratic Organization,
all won in Aldan Borough
and five of the six were
elected county wide to
represent us at Democratic
State Committee meetings.

Newly elected local Committee Members are Joyce Lambert and Rachel Milano-Davis in the East and Donna Henry and Harold Borders in the West. Thanks to all who voted.
