2022 FINAL CONGRESSIONAL AND STATE HOUSE DISTRICTS

After each Census, the 435 seats in the U.S. House are reapportioned based on the population in each state as a percentage of the total population of the United States. Although Pennsylvania's population grew from 2010 to 2020, it grew more slowly than the United States overall, thus the state's congressional delegation was reduced from 18 to 17. In comparison, other states like Florida and Texas gained congressional seats since they grew more in proportion to the overall population.

On February 23, the Pennsylvania Supreme Court took the 18-district map from 2017 (instituted after they overturned the old gerrymandered map), and made a 17-district map while trying to make the "least change" possible. Aldan Borough remains in the 5th PA Congressional District, which includes all of Delaware County, and is currently represented by Mary Gay Scanlon (D), who is running for reelection.

After each Census, the Pennsylvania Legislature is also redistricted to ensure equal populations in each of the 203 State House districts and 50 State Senate districts. The Legislative Reapportionment Commission approved the new Pennsylvania State House and Senate maps in a 4 to 1 bipartisan vote in February. The Pennsylvania Supreme Court, in a unanimous decision on March 15, rejected legal challenges to the new maps, finalizing the legislative redistricting. Aldan Borough will remain in the 26th State Senate District, which now contains only Delaware County municipalities and is represented by Tim Kearney (D), who is seeking reelection. Aldan Borough will also stay in the 163rd House district, which lost its portions of Haverford Township, but gained Collingdale Borough and the Briarcliffe section of Darby Township. We are presently represented by Mike Zabel (D), who is also running for reelection.

FAIR FUNDING TRIAL CLOSES AFTER 4 MONTHS OF TESTIMONY

The parties in the landmark trial *William Penn School District et al. v. Pennsylvania Department of Education et al.* over equitable funding of Pennsylvania schools gave their closing arguments on March 10, 2022. The case began in 2014 when six school districts, the Pennsylvania Association of Rural and Small Schools, and a group of public school parents filed suit in the Pennsylvania Commonwealth Court, alleging that the state was failing to uphold its constitutional obligation to provide a "thorough and efficient" system of public education. Four months of testimony began in November 2021, including from William Penn School District teachers and Superintendent Eric Becoats. It is expected to be months before Commonwealth Court Judge Renée Cohn Jubelirer issues a decision on this case, and the losing side is expected to appeal to the Pennsylvania Supreme Court.

RECYCLING IN ALDAN UPDATE

Recycling in Aldan continues to be collected in the Swim Club parking lot. There is a container for paper (please no cardboard) and a larger dumpster for cardboard, glass, bimetal (soup, etc.) cans, and plastics #1 and #2. The dumpster is emptied weekly. Due to staffing shortages, the County will no longer be maintaining the brown igloo and expects to remove it from the Swim Club parking lot in the near future. Until then, the Borough asks residents not to leave trash or recycling on the ground next to the igloo.

The Boy Scouts continue to collect aluminum cans in the Municipal Parking Lot on the first Saturday of every month from 9am to 11am.

The most effective way to help the environment is to reduce the use of plastic packaging, since it is not generally recyclable.
