New Life for the Havana Flag Site By Compatriot Stan Willis



The "Havana Flag Site" located on the east side of U.S. Highway 27, north of Havana Florida stands only a mile or so south of the Florida-Georgia State Line. At that location, a small area of property was donated to the Florida Division of the Sons of Confederate Veterans by a member of Finley's Brigade Camp 1614 for the site. The late **Compatriot Bill Beckham** donated the property which would be the "First" flag site in the state of Florida.


The flag pole was installed and the site completed sometime in 1999. A dedication service was held at the site in late 1999 by Finley's Brigade who had overseen the project and maintains it to this date. Over time, stress on the pole caused a crack to form near the bottom, adjacent to the key lock plate. Finley's Brigade **Past Commander Marshall Carroll** drilled a hole near the end of the crack in an attempt to stop the crack. However, the crack circled below the hole and continued to grow. A crack on the opposite side of the key lock plate then began to form.

In late April 2022, **Past Commander Kelly Crocker** checked on the site and found the cracks growing. At that time, the first crack had grown to just over three inches long and the other to just over two inches. At that time, it was decided that the flag should be recovered until repairs could be made. **First Lt. Commander Mark Bess** and I went to the site and recovered the flag. We both began to search for someone to repair the damaged pole. We settled on a **Mr. Bryan Fulford**.

At 10:30 AM on Monday, 23 May 2022 we met Mr. Fulford at the flag site and the repair began. At approxomately 1 PM, First Lt. Commander Mark Bess and myself, assisted by Mr. Fulford raised a new 1st National Flag on the repaired pole.

President – **Lisa Bess** Vice-President – **Rose Ann Roberts** Secretary – Wilma Scofield Treasurer – Mary Ann Laird



Charles F. Sellier enlisted in the 1st Florida Infantry Regiment (CSA) in 1861. He served in Pensacola Florida and fought in the battle of Santa Rosa Island. After transferring to the artillery, he fought again at Olustee with the Florida Light Artillery. He survived the war and mustered out as a Corporal at the close of hostilities.

Everyone will now know he had a life, was someone, and he was a Confederate soldier.

The work never ends as we try to document the forgotten graves of Confederate soldiers. Join us as we strive to keep the pride alive.




