The Battle of Marianna, Florida

On September 27, 1864, a column of 700 Union soldiers attacked the small Northwest Florida city of Marianna. They had no way of knowing it at the time, but it was the culmination of the deepest penetration of Confederate Florida by a Federal force during the entire Civil War. It was also one of the most destructive. On their way to and from the city, the Federals raided farms, homes, and communities along a path longer than the route of Sherman's "March to the Sea."

A hastily assembled force of Southern reservists, "home guards" and volunteers tried to defend Marianna, igniting a battle so bloody and intense that some have called it "Florida's Alamo."

It was not another Alamo, of course, but it was a battle of significance far beyond its size. By the fall of 1864, Marianna was the largest Northwest Florida community still in Confederate hands. The telegraph line connecting Tallahassee with Montgomery, Alabama, passed through the city and it was the hub of a network of roads leading to the Gulf Coast, Pensacola, Georgia, and Alabama. These communication and

transportation links made Marianna a logical choice for the location of a Confederate military headquarters and commissary depot. They also contributed to its attractiveness as a target for Federal forces.

The strike on Marianna inflicted military and economic damage from which the region could not recover. Vast quantities of commissary and quartermaster stores were either seized or confiscated. More than 600 enslaved African Americans were liberated. Four hundred head of cattle were carried away, along with 200 houses and mules. Newspaper presses were damaged, stores looted and anything that might be of use to the Confederate war effort was destroyed. More than 10% of the population of Marianna was killed, wounded, or carried away to prison. According to economic data available from census records, it would take nearly 50 years for the region to recover economically from the damage inflicted during the raid.

Thus began the introduction to **The Battle of Marianna**, **Florida** written by author and historian **Dale Cox**. This "Expanded Edition", published in 2011, is a "must read" for any student of the history of Northwest Florida and is used here by permission of the author.

The Battle of Marianna Florida

On September 23rd and 24th, **Finley's Brigade Honor Guard** was pleased to assist the **Theophilus West, MD Camp 1346** in commemorating the Battle of Marianna Florida.



On Friday evening, we gathered at the Marianna Riverside Cemetery in full period-correct uniforms to lead in the beginning ceremonies. Corporal Larry Thomas was in charge of the detail which included Compatriots Gerald Bell and Robert Crisler. Historian Dale Cox was the featured speaker who reminded us of the extreme bravery of the small force of town folks, home guards and other volunteers who attempted to repeal an aggressive Federal force of 700 troops on September 27, 1864. Many of those brave souls found rest in this very cemetery. As the name of each of the deceased was read, Compatriot Reggie Roddenberry responded with the tolling of the bell.

The following morning found the Guard downtown where the United Daughters of the Confederacy had placed a wreath on the monument. Compatriot **Jim Windsor** joined the detail as we posted the colors and lead in the pledge and salute to the flags. The ceremony included **Jack Cowart**, Capitan of the **CSS Chattahoochee SCV Camp #2314**, as the featured speaker. After the reading of the names of deceased and the tolling of the bell, the colors were posted, and the ceremony was completed.

Much has been made over the course of this weekend, and rightfully so, concerning the events of 9/11/2001—this being the 21st anniversary of that awful day. October 9, 1861 – At Pensacola, 1000 CSA troops under Gen. R.H. Anderson and routed one union camp.

October 3-4, 1862 – Battle of Corinth, MS with CSA forces led by Gen. Van Dorn and Price were repulsed.

October 5, 1863 – USS New Ironsides is attacked and damaged by torpedo boat CSS David.

October 7, 1864 – CSS Florida is captured off of Brazil by USS Wachusett after claiming 37 prizes.

October 11, 1865 – Pres. Johnson paroles several CSA cabinet members.
