Southern Recipe of the Month 'No Bake Peanut Butter Pie' Scott Osteen

Ingredients:

- 18 oz. package of cream cheese, softened
- 1 Cup of Peanut Butter
- 1 ½ Cups of powdered sugar
- 1 16 oz. container of frozen whipped topping, thawed
- 1 Graham Cracker Pie Crust
- 1 ½ Cups of heavy whipping cream

Directions:

- 1. Use a mixer to beat the cream cheese until smooth.
- 2. Add peanut butter and 1 cup of powdered sugar. Mix well.
- 3. Slowly pour in whipped topping and stir.
- 4. Pour into pie crust and freeze overnight.
- 5. Mix the heavy whipping cream and the ½ of powdered sugar together. Top the pie off with it and then serve.
- 6. Garnish with chopped Reese's pieces.

1st Florida Infantry Regiment

The 1st Infantry Regiment, formerly the 1st Florida Infantry Battalion, was assembled in March, 1861, at Chattahoochee Arsenal. Its members were from the counties of Leon, Alachua, Madison, Jefferson, Jackson, Franklin, Gadsden, and Escambia.

The unit was involved in the conflict on Santa Rosa Island, then fought at Shiloh, Farmington, and Perryville. Later it was placed in General Preston's, Stovall's, Finley's, and J.A. Smith's Brigade, and in December, 1862, it was united with the 3rd Florida Infantry Regiment. This command fought at Murfreesboro and Jackson, participated in the campaigns of the Army of Tennessee from Chickamauga to Nashville, and was active in North Carolina. The 1st/3rd lost twenty-six percent of the 531 engaged at Murfreesboro, had thirty-four percent disabled out of the 273 at Chickamauga, and totaled 240 men and 119 arms in December, 1863. Few surrendered on April 26, 1865.

The field officers were Colonels J. Patton Anderson and William Miller, Lieutenant Colonels William K. Beard and Thaddeus A. McDonell, and Major Clover A. Ball.



November 6, 1861 – Jefferson Davis was elected President of the Confederacy for a 6 year term.

November 21, 1862 – President Jefferson Davis appoints James Seddon Secretary of War.

November 19, 1863 – President Lincoln gives his Gettysburg Address.

November 8, 1864 – President Lincoln was re-elected and beat General George B. McClelland.

November 6, 1865 – CSS Shenandoah surrenders to British officials in England.

November 10, 1865 – CSA Capt. Henry Wirz, commander of Andersonville prison, is hanged.
