

Harbert Family Obelisk Being Restored

On the weekend of June 26 & 27, 2010, several graves were vandalized in Tallahassee's Old City Cemetery. Among those damaged were the graves in the Family plot of Captain Ephraim Crockett Harbert. The Harbert Family marker was a 4-piece, 10-foot obelisk, in the center of the plot, with names on four sides of the base; of Captain Harbert, his wife Rebecca, daughter Anna Harbert Keith, and her husband Wallace Ney Keith. Captain Harbert's grandson J W Keith has his own marker in the plot and it was also damaged.

The July 2, 2010 Tallahassee Democrat included a small report on page 5A that reported vandalism of about \$50,000. The alleged vandals were never punished and reportedly had connections with local lawenforcement.


Captain E C Harbert joined the Confederate Army on May 15, 1861 and was elected Captain of Company K 6th Tennessee Infantry. He is described as: 6' 2" tall, Blue eyes, light hair and fair complexioned. On September 19, 1863, during the Battle of Chickamauga, Captain Harbert was shot in the right upper chest and in the left leg between the knee and ankle. After spending almost a year in the hospital, he was finally discharged.

He moved to Tallahassee, FL just prior to 1900 and bought the Mostyn Farm, about ¾ mile Northeast of town, in 1902. Captain Harbert lived with his daughter and son-in-law until his death on June 18, 1912. Finley's Brigade has begun the restoration of the Harbert Family Plot and completed Phase I on November 23, 2019. Hope you can assist us with Phase II – coming January 11, 2020.



Cemetery Work Days - Remembering Our Ancestors

During the November 23 Tallahassee Old City Cemetery Work Day, Finley's Brigade worked on the gravesites of Corporal William W. Sanders, 2nd Florida Calvary, and James T. Archer, first Florida Secretary of State, along with the Harbert Family plot. Corporal Sanders' headstone was leaning, but was leveled out and restored. James Archer headstone had a cherry trunk removed – more work to follow.

<u>Finley's Brigade Color Guard Uniform Guidelines – Part 1</u>

The Finley's Brigade color guard has had a distinctive uniform for over a decade in its various memorial services, parades, and ceremonies. It consists of twelve parts: brogans, gaiters, trousers, suspenders, a belt, a cap box, a slung cartridge box, a haversack, a shirt, a shell jacket, gloves, and a kepi. The bare minimum anyone needs of these to march is five parts; a kepi, shirt, suspenders, trousers, and brogans.

Finley's would prefer all members of its honor guard to acquire the complete uniform however we understand that uniforms are not cheap and sometimes a half uniform is all one member may be able to acquire at a time. We also have some spare gear which we gladly distribute on a first come first serve basis for color guard members to use for the duration of their time with Finley's Brigade and during other events.

Additionally while this is the *preferred* uniform for our marching unit, we will *never* turn away anyone with a confederate uniform if they wish to march with us because they do not have the uniform prescribed below.
