# <u>German Confederates</u> <u>By J.R. Miller</u>


#### Johann Heinrich August Heros von Borcke

Born at **Ehrenbreitstein Fortress** July 23, 1835 and died Berlin May 10, 1895, von Borcke was a member of the old Pomeranian Von Borke family and the son of Theodor von Borcke and Therese who was born Adloff (Not a Typo). His first wife was Madalene Honig and his second wife was Tony Honig, his first wife's younger sister.

Von Borke became a Prussian cavalry officer in 1855, served with the <u>Guards Cuirassiers</u> and until 1862 in the 2d Brandenburg Dragoons. He immigrated to the Confederate States in 1862 and soon arrived in Richmond and was appointed by Secretary of War George W. Randolph to Jeb Stuart as a Captain. Due to his physical appearance he stood out amongst commissioned and the enlisted. His giant sword was a Solingen straight sword which aided in is persona.

He was involved in the famed ride around McClellan army which brought much attention to the cavalry arm of the army and also helped to promote Von Borke to the rank of major. Von Borke was detached for a short time to escort the body of John Pelham aka "The Gallant Pelham" to Richmond Virginia.

At the Battle of Middleburg, Von Borke received a rather nasty neck wound which knocked him out of action for some time. He partially recovered and was attached to staff duty for a time and was at the Battle of Yellow Tavern where his commander (Jeb Stuart) was mortally wounded.



Later Von Borke was again promoted to the rank of Lieutenant Colonel and was given official thanks from the Congress of the Confederate States. Then President Jefferson Davis sent him to Great Britain on a diplomatic mission.

After the war Von Borke returned to Prussia and fought in the Austro-Prussia War who served as a staff officer for Price Friedrich Karl and was awarded the Order of the Red Eagle. He retired in 1867 due to war wounds and published his memoirs "Memoirs of the Confederate War for Independence" In 1884 he came back to the Southern States and visited many of his old friends.

He eventually returned to Giesenbrügge where he flew the Confederate Flag on his estate. He died of sepsis due to the yankee metal that he receive at the Battle of Middleburg. He is buried in <u>Giżyn</u>, <u>Poland</u>. His headstone was destroyed by the Red Army during WW2 but was replaced by the Sons of Confederate Veterans in 2008.


We will need help setting up and cleaning up after the event. Your help is appreciated.
