- How do I get on YouTube?
- Eazy Peazy!

Follow these steps if you are new to YouTube:

- Although you can view YouTube videos without an account, you can't make comments if that is what you want to do.
 Therefore, it is best to have an account. It is fast and easy.
- First, get a gmail account by going to Google.com and

- creating one for free. It only takes a minute.
- Alternatively, you can go to YouTube and press the "sign in" button and it will prompt you to create a gmail address. Same difference.
- When that's done, you're in.
 The gmail address signs you into google and YouTube.
- That simple!



Besides being able to make a difference by making comments, the advantage to having an account is that you are now able to subscribe to the channel and you will be automatically notified when a new video is available.

A few housekeeping notes are in order:


-This channel is really for you. Please don't treat it as a forum to argue, dispute or make inappropriate entries about the chain of command. Its our channel but let's keep it professional.
