Rev. Meg Biddle grew up in an Indiana town with no stoplights, called Hope. She graduated from Anderson University (IN) with a bachelor's in organizational leadership and from the Anderson University School of Theology with a Master of Divinity. She is working on her Doctor of Ministry project and dissertation through Central Seminary and plans to graduate next spring. Meg previously served as the pastor of First Baptist Church in Central Square, NY, and Federated Church in Carlinville, IL. She is the National Coordinator for Leadership and Networking and hosts the podcast Ministry Mondays with Meg at the

American Baptist Home Mission Societies.

Pastor Victoria earned a BA in Psychology and an MA in Educational Psychology from New York University. She earned an M.Div. from Union Theological Seminary in NYC and completed a Doctor of Ministry from Seattle University in June 2022. Pastor Victoria was ordained in September 2013 by the Emmanuel Baptist Church in Clinton Hill, Brooklyn. She and her hus-

Reverend Doctor Monica Corsaro is the Senior Pastor of Fairview Community Church in Costa Mesa, CA. About Tonight's Preacher



Rev. Dr. Hrang Hlei is the Associate General Secretary of the Chin Baptist Churches, USA. He was born to Pu Kio Bil and Pi Thla Hnem in 1972 in Hakha, the capital of the Chin state in Burma. He received his Bachelor of Theology (B.Th) Degree in 2000 from Zomi Theological College (ZTC), now Chin Christian Theological Institute (CCIT), Falam. He received his Master of Divinity (M.Div.) Degree in 2004 from Myanmar Institute of Theology (MIT), Insein, Yangon. He received his Master of Arts in Theological Studies (MATS) Degree in 2008 from Princeton Theological Seminary (PTS), Princeton, NJ. He received his Doctor of Philoso-

phy (PhD) Degree in 2015 from Luther Seminary, St. Paul, MN.

He was a visiting scholar with Central Baptist Theological Seminary from June to December of 2014, and became Pastor of Seattle Chin Baptist Church (an Evergreen congregation) in January of 2015, where he served until 2018. He then moved to Indianapolis to serve at the Indiana Chin Baptist Church, where he is the full time Pastor of Congregational Care. He also serves on the Educational Working Committee of the Burma Advisory Group. He married his wife, Pi Tluang Cer Tial in 2004, and they have a son and a daughter.

Welcoming New Evergreen Churches



Manantial de Gracia

En el 1982, se organizó la Iglesia Bautista Congregacional de New Britain, CT, bajo el liderazgo del Pastor-fundador, el Rdo. Edwin Ayala. Parte de las Iglesias Bautistas Americanas (American Baptist Churches/ABCUSA) y la Iglesia Unida de Cristo (United Church of Christ/UCC), el ministerio continuó por décadas bajo la gracia de Dios. En el 2010, al mudarse a West Hartford, CT, al lugar de adoración y propiedad de First Church of Christ,

la congregación eligió continuar su relación denominacional con la UCC al convertirse en una congregación de *puertas abiertas*—viviendo la bienvenida completa del evangelio. Comenzando en Mayo 1 de 2022, Manantial se mudó a Hamden, CT, Spring Glen Church UCC. Habiéndose desafiliado de la ABCUSA en CT, Dios le ha permitido regresar a sus raíces mediante la Asociación Evergreen en el 2024. La misión es: Crear co-munidad para formar discípulos de Jesucristo, edificar vidas en amor y justicia, manifestando la gracia completa de Dios.

In 1982, the Congregational Baptist Church of New Britain, CT, was organized under the leadership of the founding Pastor, Rev. Edwin Ayala. Part of the American Baptist Churches (ABCUSA) and the United Church of Christ (UCC), the ministry continued for decades under the grace of God. In 2010, when moving to West Hartford, CT, to the place of worship and property of First Church of Christ, the congregation chose to continue its denominational relationship with the UCC by becoming an open and affirming congregation - living the complete welcome of the gospel. Beginning on May 1, 2022, Manantial moved to Hamden, CT at Spring Glen Church UCC. Having disaffiliated from ABCUSA in CT, God has allowed them to return to their roots through the Evergreen Association in 2024. The mission is: To create community to form disciples of Jesus Christ, build lives in love and justice, manifesting the complete grace of God.

This year I was gifted time to rest through a sabbatical you all funded.

Among the unexpected gifts I received through that time was to experience being provoked to "love and good deeds" regularly. My family spent the entire sabbatical together and our children are young enough that they still want to spend time with their parents. They were therefore provoking me to spend time with them every day most of the day. There were many days that was the last thing I wanted to do. But, as I look back on this time my sense that these three months will stay with all of us for life increases by the day. I did so very many more good things because my children were provoking me to them than I would have even thought about had they not been there. I did not know how much active "love rest" I needed. What a gift it has been and will be to have had the time to rest in the full meaning of that word.

Some highlights of this year:

Leadership Retreat- we again had an amazing retreat with over 60 of you attending! We are now moving into a theme rotation we think can work very well for who we are as EBA. This rotation is an every other year check in and support. For example, this year, 2024, our retreat was a check in. The format we used was designed to have all who attended explore their own context and share needs, ideas, etc. We then identified cluster needs and those have informed our support ministries from the office. The leadership cohorts that have been created this year, under the Pneuma initiative, have been shaped by the needs we discovered at our leadership retreat. Our 2025 retreat will be providing support and expertise to our churches as they reach out to their community.

Staff- We have almost doubled in the past 7 years! A whole lot of new opportunities have opened up including cooperation, support, perspective, creativity and more. The increase in perspective alone is already benefiting our ministry greatly. As you know we have all caucuses represented in our current staff. Another important benefit has been that we did not have to hire an interim Executive Minister while I was on sabbatical because Rev. Sam and Rev. Paul were able to collaboratively take up the load of my absence. This past year has also been a time to help our staff settle in our new reality. At a time where many ABC regions are dealing with questions about where and what to cut, we have been on a growing trend. With that growth has come a need to revisit everything about how the office functions as it serves all of you. We are still figuring out what it means as we also carry out, create, and execute the ministry work we have been called to. What is certain is that the growth moves us to a place where we can provoke in more spaces and to do so more effectively.

Churches- Our ongoing support of churches through pastoral search, conflict engagement, development, envisioning and more has increased. Our office is now able to be present in ways we couldn't have before through our staff additions. We are again welcoming new churches into our family and I pray you all help us welcome, Mesa Abierta and Manantial de Gracia with open arms.

On the whole 2024 has been a year of settling in with a new and bigger staff as well as reviewing and envisioning how we could do ministry with the added remarkable people resources. Thank you for your generosity and ample support.

Assoc. Exec. Minister of Innovation & Design's Report

Pneuma (<u>ea-abc.org/pneuma</u>) has continued its work of cultivating ways for our churches to grow and thrive, whether it be through cultivating ministry development, connecting ministries to consultants for focused assistance, or forming cohorts of peer-based learning and encouragement.

> In 2024, we focused on forming cohorts from what we listened to at our Leadership Retreat. We took the time to listen to the energy, concerns, and hopes of the Evergreen Association and formed cohorts out of the key themes we discovered. Out of the seven themes that were raised, we were able to form two cohorts that

met for six sessions this year. These cohorts were focused on Community Engagement and any church seeking to Change/Grow or Create.

After closing our last meetings last month, the participants shared that the cohorts were important times of listening and learning from each other. They also served as a way of empowering each other and encouraging each other as they processed their challenges and obstacles.

Our learnings and feedback throughout the region have focused the topic of our next Leadership Retreat (Feb. 13-15, 2025) on how Evergreen Churches can grow in Community Engagement. Please make sure to save the date and join us on Vashon Island at Camp Burton.

Next year, we will start a new cycle of cohorts with Community Engagement and Change/ Grow/Create for anyone else who is interested in taking advantage of this time together to connect with other people in the region to help discern how God is speaking to your church. It will be in the same format with six sessions meeting on a monthly basis.

In addition, we have two other Cohorts to mention: one is for **Emergent Ministers** (people who are entering or discerning ministry as a vocation). This cohort will be a year-long cohort that helps people consider all the facets of ministry and lean on mentors and peers to help discern how God is calling them to their own unique voice of ministry.

The other cohort we will be starting is one dedicated to **Pastoral Support/Well-Being**. They will meet every quarter with Rev. Morgan Fletcher who will facilitate discussions and reflections about how to engage in holistically healthy ministry leadership while also offering regular individual sessions. We will have more to share about this and will unveil this new cohort at our Leadership Retreat in February.

Our desire for all of our churches is that they thrive in their calling and mission while serving their unique context. We want to help you in this endeavor with all of our energy and resources. Thank you for being a part of this Evergreen Family.

Reports back from Caucuses

Euro Caucus: Rev. Dr. Pete Shaw reported. The Euro caucus affirmed the Minutes of the 2022 Annual Business Meeting, the 2024 proposed budget, going to FBC Salt Lake City for the 2024 Annual Meeting, and affirmation of the incoming Evergreen officers.

The Euro caucus recommends that the Executive Committee and possibly task forces help develop budget solutions and the Associated Ministries idea further. Pastor Pete reported that they asked lots of questions, and had good discussion. It was suggested that we want to be thoughtful about how we implement the Associated Ministries, and was pointed that the Rochester region has associated ministries and may be a place for us to get some ideas and information about how that is implemented.

Pastor Pete reported that the caucus is excited overall about the Pneuma Initiative, and have the following question: Does it apply across all caucuses? It may be that the innovation model proposed is not what the other caucuses are looking for. Rather than assume however, the Euro Caucus is asking. Rev. Dr. Victoria Carr-Ware prayed for the Euro Caucus. **Hispanic Caucus:** Pastor Susan Hernandez reported. The Hispanic Caucus affirmed the minutes of the 2022 Evergreen Annual Business Meeting, the 2024 proposed budget, going to FBC Salt Lake City for the 2024 Annual Meeting, and affirmation of the incoming Evergreen officers. She also shared they are encouraged by pneuma initiative and excited for opportunities there. Dr. Keith Madsen prayed for the Hispanic Caucus.

Asian Caucus: Sandra Lee reported. The Asian Caucus affirmed the minutes of the 2022 Evergreen Annual Business Meeting, the 2024 proposed budget, going to FBC Salt Lake City for the 2024 Annual Meeting, and affirmation of the incoming Evergreen officers. Sandra reported that there was good discussion on the Associated Ministries idea, with questions about what requirements would be, how these ministries would support Evergreen and be supported, and the caucus structure and how these ministries might be included. There was also discussion on the possibility ofan Asian Caucus pastor leadership retreat, to help keep them connected with Evergreen, and build the internal relationships within the caucus. For those coming in from out of town, we are staying at the Salt Lake City Marriott University Park, located at 480 Wakara Way, Salt Lake City, UT 84108. There is a discounted rate for those who registered with the Evergreen Room Block. In addition to excellent rooms, a fitness center and on-site parking, The hotel is just under two miles away (and even a bit less than that walking) from the First Baptist Church of Salt Lake City, and less than a mile walking to the TRAX University South Campus Station.

To walk to the church from the Salt Lake City Marriott University Park, head right out the front doors of the Marriott, and follow Wakara Way southwest until you cross Foothill and continue onto Hall Street. Then turn left onto Wahlen Way, and then left on Valdez Drive. Follow Valdez south until you reach East Sunnyside, then turn right. Continue until about a block after East Sunnyside becomes 800 Street, and the church will be on your right.

To walk to the TRAX University South Campus Station from Salt Lake City Marriott University Park, head right out the front doors of the Marriott, and follow Wakara Way southwest. Turn right on Foothill Drive, then right on Mario Capecchi Drive. Turn left and cut through the parking lot past the Madsen Health Facility, until you reach East Research Road. Turn left on East Research Road, then right on S 1800 East. Follow that road northeast until you reach South Campus Drive, then turn left. The station will be on the right.

All Evergreen Backpacking Trip

Take some time for a 4-day trip on the North Fork Sauk Trail where you can detach from technology, take a break from the hustle and bustle of every-day life, and connect with the divine in a way that is unique to the wilderness. Days will include times of silence, guided conversation, amazing views, and hiking and camping. This is a trip that will be meaningful for those with little (or no) wilderness experience or those with a lot.

When: June 19-22, 2025

Evergreen Clergy Backpacking Trip

This trip, exclusively for Evergreen affiliated clergy persons of all kinds, will be a 4-day trip in Olympic National Park. It will be a time to detach from technology, to be in community with other Clergy, and take a break from the every-day business of running a church or ministry. Those who went in 2023 say that the trip was transformative, and the chance to be able to seek the divine outside the church, in the wilderness, was a blessing. Days will include times of silence, guided conversation, amazing views, and hiking and camping. This is a trip that will be meaningful for those with little (or no) wilderness experience or those with a lot.

When: Late August, 2025

- Costs cover, food, group gear (stoves, first aid kit, etc.), and trip leadership. Some partial scholarships may be available. This is a continuing education worthy event.
- Group size is normally between 4-7 people, not including me.
- Spiritual component includes times of silence for reflection, guiding questions, and good conversation
- Overall cost of trips is \$800 a person this includes food for the trip itself and group gear. It does not include transportation to and from the trail. As a group we can work out the logistics for transportation
- If participants need gear (backpacks, tents, or other) we have some I can rent or can work the individual to find good rental options.

About the leader from the website (<u>www.wildernessjourneys.org</u>):

Jonathan Malone is a minister, hiker, musician, husband, father, and slightly crazy. For a number of years he has been leading groups of youth and adults into the wilderness.

Jonathan was a Boy Scout, is a 46er (Adirondacks), a 48er (White Mountains), and has thru-hiked a number of trails including 700 miles of the Appalachian trail. He is an ordained American Baptist pastor, certified Wilderness First Responder through NOLS, is trained in Mental Health First Aid (for adults), has a PhD in theology, and spends countless weeks, days, and hours in the wilderness trying to find God. He keeps looking and welcomes you to join him.
