Signature Campaign for Burma

It has been more than a year since the military executed a coup in Burma (officially known as Myanmar), preventing the duly elected Parliament to govern. The Burma army has terrorized the country since then, and the country's ethnic minorities have been particularly hard hit. Efforts are being made in the US Con-



gress to advocate for democracy to be restored in Burma. The House of Representatives passed the Protect Democracy in Burma Act of 2021 (HR 1112) and sent it to the Senate, where it was referred to the Committee on Foreign Relations. Last October, Sen. Ben Cardin of Maryland introduced a separate bill in the Senate (S 2937), which was also referred to that committee. Consideration of that bill is still in process.

American Baptists have had a special interest in Burma since the time of Ann and Adoniram Judson, who began their ministry there in 1813. In 2007, in

The Current Crisis in Haiti and Our Mission

By now most of us should know about the dire situation in Haiti: The country really hasn't fully recovered from the 2010 earthquake, which killed hundreds of thousands of people. In August of last year, a 7.2 magnitude quake hit southern Haiti, and several smaller quakes have been recorded since. The island nation was also hit with Hurricane Sandy in 2012, Hurricane Matthew in 2016 and Hurricane Laura in 2020. The total deaths from those three storms was over 700, and hundreds of thousands were left homeless. Covid-19 has, of course, also hit the struggling country hard.

Adding to the misery of these natural disasters, President Jovenal Moise was assassinated in July of last year, and ever since the country has been ruled by gangs. Our American Baptist missionaries, Nzunga Mabudiga and Kihomi Ngwemi have not been able to get back in the country because of the dangers, although Nzunga did recently attend a gathering in the Dominican Republic which focused on ministry in Haiti.

The Evergreen Association has a task force of leaders who are getting together by Zoom to get guidance on how to stand with the people of Haiti in the midst of these crises. I have been serving as the convener of this group, and Nzunga, Adalia Gutierrez-Lee and Herb Rogers also meet with us.

How do we help in Haiti right now? That is the question on which we have focused. Just sending money is insufficient. The gangs will too often steal such do nations (However, sending donations to Evergreen

response to the large number of refugees from Burma coming to the United States, ABC/USA appointed a Burma Refugee Task Force to support and encourage the refugees and to inform the wider family of their situation. In 2014, the task force became a standing commission that works in partnership with associations of Baptists from Burma that have come into existence in the US. Since February 2021, the Commission has focused on the ministry of advocacy in light of the present situation. Recently, the Commission put together an advocacy group with representatives of many organizations from the "Burma diaspora" throughout the US, entities within American Baptist Churches USA, and the Christian human rights organization 21Wilberforce. That group has been promoting a signature campaign to submit a petition to members of the US House of Representatives and Senate. The petition expresses support for a Burma bill and requests that the final version of the bill include eight specific provisions. These include support for a new constitution in Burma establishing a federal democracy, recognition of the National Unity Government [composed of duly elected members of Parliament] as the official government of Burma rather that the military-backed State Administration Council, provision of direct cross-border emergency aid to Internally Displaced Persons and individuals in the Civil Disobedience Movement, and support for religious freedom and human rights for everyone in Burma.

The ABC Burma Refugee Commission urges concerned US citizens to sign the petition, which can be found online at https://burmaadvocacygroup.org/,

along with articles and photos. Clicking on the blue "Take Action" button will take you to a page that includes the full text of the petition. Filling out the accompanying form with your name and address will cause a copy of the petition to be sent on your behalf to your two US Senators and the Representative for your congressional district. The end-date for the signature campaign had been March 31st, but the Commission has discussed extended that deadline, at least through Easter. As of March 18th, almost 900 petitions had been processed with reports of more on the way.

Six congregations affiliated with the Evergreen Baptist Association were established by refugees from Burma. Five are in the Seattle area (Karen Community Church of Greater Seattle, Seattle Chin Baptist Church, Seattle Falam Baptist Church, Washington Chin Baptist Church, and Washington Kachin Baptist Church) and one is in the Bay Area (San Francisco Bay Chin Christian Fellowship).

Gail and Paul Aita have made ten mission trips to Burma and two to Malaysia since 2000. They serve under contract as volunteer Special Assistants for Southeast Asia for American Baptist International Ministries. One of Paul's functions as such is to serve on the Burma Refugee Commission. In 2012, Paul was appointed Minister to People from Burma by the Panther Lake Community Church. In 2020, he was invited by the Washington Kachin Baptist Church to be their Senior Pastor. You are welcome to contact Paul for more information at aita.paul@gmail.com.



Building Bridges

Evergreen as a region has a vested interest in church growth. This is for many reasons, but primarily because the local church is the expression of the Beloved Community in its particular place. We want to help new churches be planted, help revitalize existing churches, and help find ways to help new paradigms of church get off the ground. And while salvation is free, ministry is not. Oftentimes new or restarting churches don't have adequate funds to keep them going long enough to become self-sustaining. The Building Bridges Fund is going to be part of our answer to that.

Thanks to the generosity of individuals and our churches, especially First Baptist Palo Alto and Mount Lake Terrace, we have established an endowment to help churches which need that revitalization or seed money to get the funds they need. This fund is overseen by a Steering Committee with a representative from each of Evergreen's Caucuses. They're still working to determine the exact criteria under which existing churches, churches looking to restart, and new ministries can apply, and the oversight and help they'll receive. In Memoriam—Norman Gottwald

Norman Gottwald Professor Emeritus of Biblical Studies, New York Theological Seminary

Norman K. Gottwald (1926 - 2022) passed away on March 11, in Berkeley, California. Along with his spouse, Laura Lagerquist-Gottwald, Dr. Gottwald was a longtime and active member of First Baptist Church of Berkeley and will be deeply missed by the congregation.

Professor Emeritus of Biblical Studies at New York Theological Seminary, Dr. Gottwald taught previously at the American Baptist Seminary of the West and the Graduate Theological Union (both in Berkeley, CA) and Andover Newton Theological School (Andover, MA). His most influential book is *The Tribes of Yahweh: A Sociology of the Religion of Lib*-



erated Israel, 1250-1050 B.C.E. (1979), a celebrated study of the origins of ancient Israel as an indigenous peasant uprising. His other writings include The Hebrew Bible: A Socio-Literary Introduction, The Hebrew Bible in Its Social World and in Ours, The Politics of Ancient Israel, and, as co-author, The Bible and Liberation: Political and Social Hermeneutics. Gottwald pioneered the use of social theory and method in

biblical studies. He was a world-wide lecturer on the critical relevance of the Bible to contemporary social struggles and a citizen activist in numerous civil rights, anti-war, and pro-labor movements and organizations.

As an ordained minister of American Baptist Churches USA, Dr. Gottwald was a strong advocate of biblical study committed to social change.

or International Ministries, to be used when it can be done in a secure way is always helpful). Two kinds of actions are most urgently needed now:

Concerted prayer: This is a big challenge, but no challenge is too big for our God! We need God's guidance on this vital issue.

Explore Advocacy Options: our government needs to support Haitian efforts to solve their crisis. What can church leaders do to make sure that happens? This is a tough issue, but a critical one. There is a group established in

Haiti calling itself "Commission for a Haitian Solution to the Crisis." It is seeking to set up fair elections to restore leadership. To date, our government seems to be supporting the former Prime Minister, Ariel Henry, who is a suspect in the former President's assassination, and who is resisting setting up an election. Can we find a way to support this commission, or other efforts Haitians make to bring hope and healing to their country?

Our group continues to meet to determine how we can help. Keep in prayer for God's guidance for us as well!
