A GPP initiative, 12 for Life Workplace will provide part-time, entry number of at-risk students, age 16 and above, during the school day.

Chosen students also must be in danger of not graduating from high school, not have major or consistent behavioral problems, qualify for free/reduced price lunch, eligible to work in Georgia and have high potential.

Once the student graduates from high school, that student is no longer in the GPP program so that the student's continued employment is a matter between the student and the employer.
