# Purpose of Today's Conversation

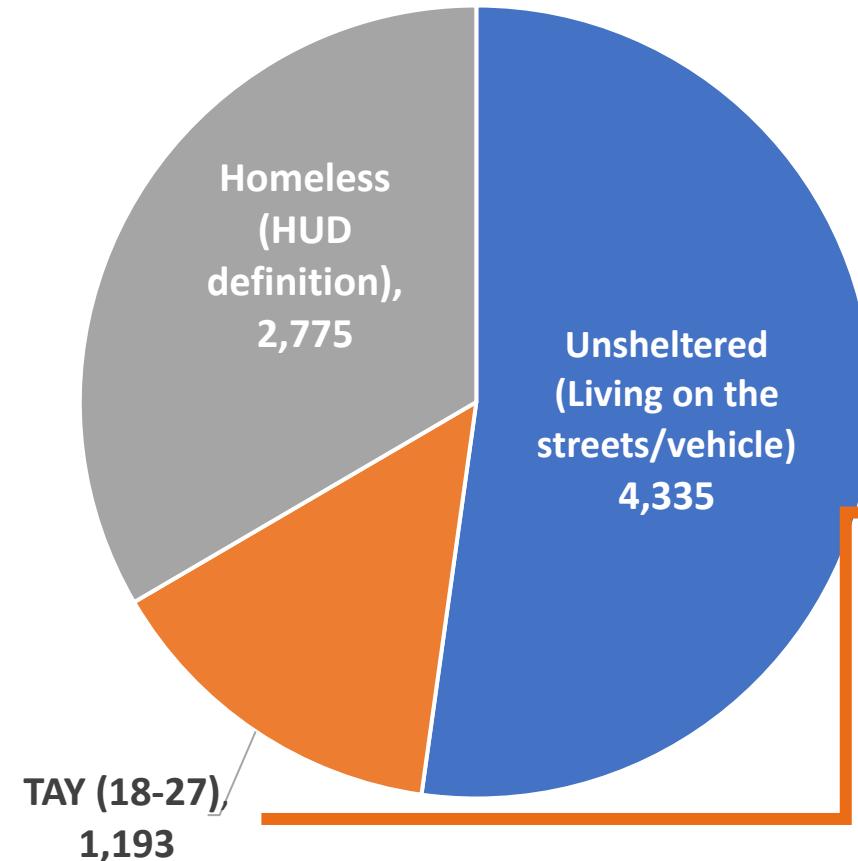
- Introduce the 24/7 TAY site and its role in the community.

# TAY Health and Wellness Center

- The Center will be located at 888 Post, 1st Floor, which is a 3-story building owned by the City and County of San Francisco.
- The TAY HWC Project is funded by the SF Department of Homelessness and Supportive Housing Services.
- Provides an environment for young adults to come indoors and be connected with services they need, 24 hours a day/ 365 days a week.
- The target population is defined as TAY, ages 18-27, who are experiencing homelessness.

According to the 2024 San Francisco Point-In-Time Homeless Count...



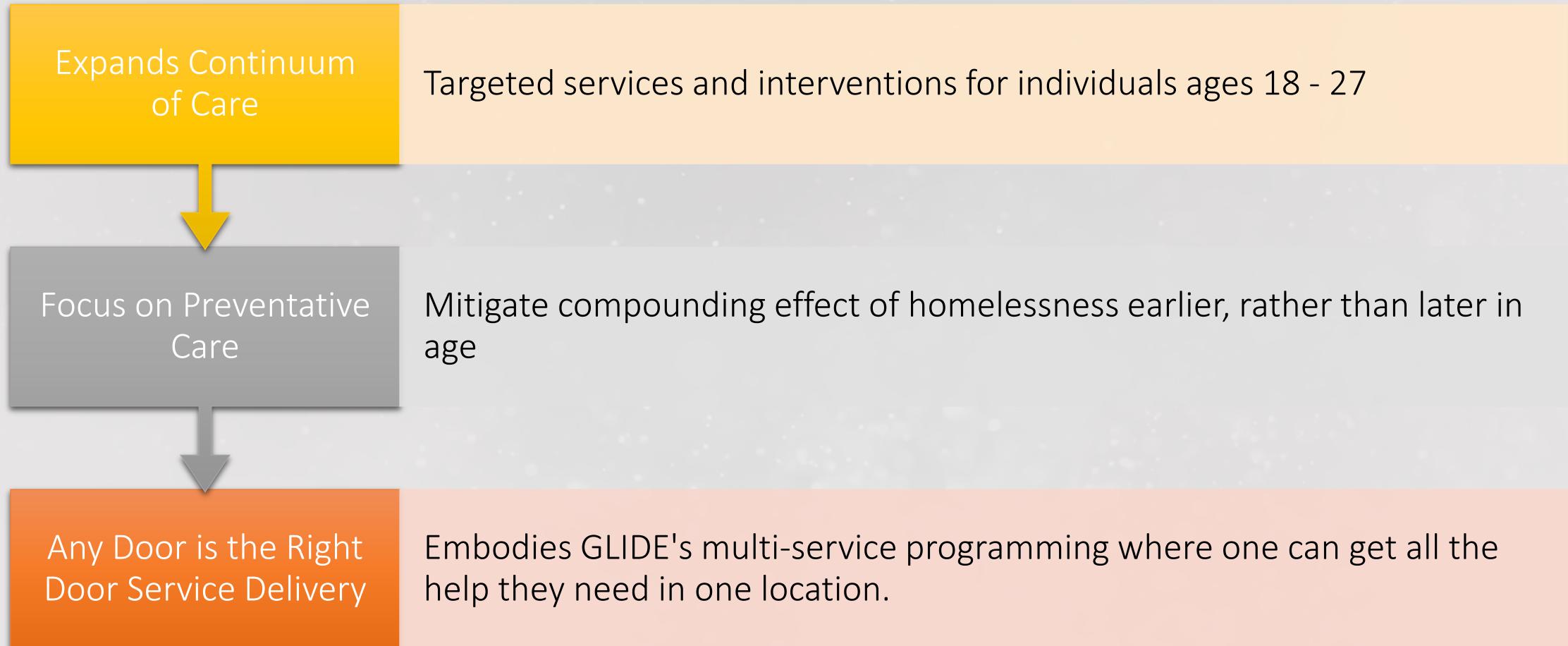
## A Growing Challenge

Between 2022 to 2024, the share of TAY experiencing homelessness increased by 75%.

- Incident Response and Escalation Protocols in Place

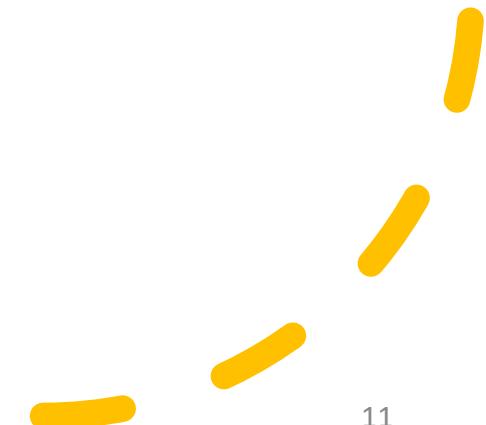


# Our Commitments To You
