

Spiritual Disciplines

Fresh Fruit and Bread

Spiritual Disciplines have been written about and encouraged. Why? Because life is busy but our busyness does not always yield fruit or bread. God has a place of fruitfulness, both spiritual and practical, that He knows we will be blessed by and be a blessing to others. But a great meal is never prepared in a rush. It begins in the quiet, intentional preparation at the kitchen counter.

You are my trust from my youth.



Verse 11 of Jeremiah 29 is an iconic scripture, a familiar, often quoted verse. It is an applicable promise for all of God's people, a true statement of His Loving nature and intention towards us... a future and a hope!

In Jeremiah's day, the Jewish people needed the assurance of Jeremiah 29:11. Historically, when this verse was penned, their worst fears had been realized. Overcome by their enemy, they had been taken captive and forcibly removed by King Nebuchadnezzar from their homeland to Babylon. The Open Bible's introductory commentary to the Book of Jeremiah reveals why this trouble came upon them: "their empty profession, disobedience to God's covenant, and spiritual harlotry." Matters were made worse when false prophets, particularly Hananiah, spoke lies to the people, telling them their exile would last only two years. False hope leads to deferred hope— "hope deferred makes the heart sick." Proverbs 13:12 God does not want our hope deferred; He does want us to have faith in the midst of reality. Jeremiah delivered the accurate instruction of the Lord regarding how Israel was to navigate the 70 year exile. It boiled down to

Live ... Occupy ... Pray ... Be fruitful and multiply... Actively wait!

this modern day analogy: focus on the windshield instead of the rear view mirror. In other words, hope for the future and trust God with the present.

Jeremiah 29:11 is quoted at celebrations and sometimes when there is not much to celebrate. Life in this fallen world does not always bring us joy, prosperity, and success. The Apostle Paul taught that his contentment was not based on circumstances, but on His relationship with Christ. How does Proverbs 3:5-6 and Philippians 4:13 help you to participate in God's promise of a future and a hope?





Batman, Spider-Man, Wonder Woman ... fictional superheroes have common attributes: they wear a costume that conceals their true identity, have an unrealistic super strength or ability, and face larger-than-life battles. Superheroes are often benevolent and they win in the end. Why are people, young and old, fascinated with them? Perhaps because they provide a positive demonstration of three universal human desires: hope, justice, and empowerment.

When Chuck and I were early in our relationship with the Lord, a youth pastor friend of ours used interesting parallels between the Bible and the Star Wars movie. His effort was sincere, to help his students grasp more clearly the fight between good and evil and Jesus' victory. For me, Star Wars didn't transform me, but Holy Spirit and God's Word did. God's answer to our human desires far exceeds a man-created story; it is found in His Word and in His Son.

Through Jesus' resurrection, we've been given <u>LIVING HOPE</u>. 1 Peter 1:3b

The foundation of God's throne is righteousness and <u>JUSTICE</u>. Psalm 89:14

Jesus' <u>POWER</u> has given us all that pertains to life and godliness. 2 Peter 1:3a

The creativity to manufacture characters and write stories is a gift from God. However, perpetual hope, justice, and empowerment were fought for and won on a nonfictional battlefield by our living, valiant Superhero, Jesus Christ!

Psalm 118:16b says "the right hand of the Lord does valiantly." "Valiant" means courage, loyalty and faith even when facing great danger. We pondered Matthew 26:62-64 in our Scripture section. Read the context of those verses in Matthew 26:46-68. Revisit our iconic scripture for today—Zephaniah 3:17. How does this well known verse touch you knowing it speaks of God's love for you?







"There is his story, her story, and the truth." Have you heard that quote or something similar? The bottom line is most people believe that they know truth. The question is, do we? What is truth? That was Pontius Pilate's rhetorical question to Jesus just before he yielded to the Jews and condemned our Lord to be crucified. John 18:37-38a

One would think that truth would be a beloved and sought after attribute. Why then is truth so controversial? Is it because people are genuinely confused about the truth of God's simple message?

Or is there something else? Is truth perceived as an overt thief to those who love self, stuff, and supremacy, a direct threat to their agenda? Truth is not the friend of the greedy, deceptive, or controlling. Who is it that crucifies truth? 2 Timothy chapter 3:1-9 is the answer.

Truth is the best friend of the humble and the seeking. God's truth is not hiding atop Mount Everest, the highest point on earth, nor in the depths of the Challenger Deep in the Pacific Ocean's Mariana Trench.

No! It—HE— is present with us. Truth is not a mantra, creed, or mere writings.

Truth is Jesus: "I am the way, the truth, and the life." John 14:6a

There are those whose hearts sincerely long for truth, but do not yet know.

Jesus tenderly calls such to come to Him.

Jeremiah recorded their answer:

"You will seek me and find me when you seek me with all your heart. Jeremiah 29:13

Prayer

Suggestion: Read chapters 13 through 17 in one sitting, ignoring the chapter breaks. These verses are Jesus' final teaching before His crucifixion, His summary of truth.

Re-read the prayer above aloud as a declaration.

As you read Jesus' summary of truth in John 13-17, imagine you are seated listening to Jesus in the upper room. Notice God's truth is not detached from His desire for relationship with people. Record lessons He spoke that particularly challenge your thinking. Sit with your thoughts and pray. What freedom might the apostles have needed after Jesus was crucified? What freedom do you need?

I have fought an excellent fight. I have finished my full course with all my might and I've kept my heart full of faith. The Passion Translation



The Apostle Paul (formerly Saul) was a man with an extraordinary drive to pursue his religious convictions and passions. Before his conversion to Christ, he was a religious terrorist. After his conversion, he was a bold and relentless evangelist.

Very few (if any) have a conversion like Saul's. One moment he is vehemently leading an entourage to help him arrest men and women who believed in Jesus. The next moment he is face down in the dirt and voice-to-voice with the Creator, the Messiah. His life and beliefs were wholly reconstructed by his encounter with Yeshua, Jesus. Despite Saul's prior blindness to the truth, in his three days of physical blindness, he saw and fully committed to the Lord's commission. The Damascus Road was the start of Saul's good fight, finished race, and kept faith.

It has been said we must pick our battles carefully but then fight to the death for the ones that matter. Paul did just that.

He began by preaching in the local synagogues and going to boot camp. Three years of Holy Ghost schooling in the Arabian desert and Damascus shaped a counter-cultural minister. Paul told of what he saw and the things God showed him. Who was evangelized by this former Jewish rabbi? The "Goyim," the non-

Jewish rabbi? The "Goyim," the non-Jewish Gentiles. If you are a non-Jew as am I, we are forever indebted to Paul for opening the door of the Good News to us.

Thank you Paul for fighting the good fight. I hope I make your fight worth it!



Prayer

Lord, help me to learn from your servant Paul how and why to fight the good fight of faith. Whenever my last day is on this earth, whenever my last breath is breathed out, Lord I want to finish with Your name on my lips, your armor firmly in place, my arms wrapped tightly around those You allow me to love and influence, and my hand gripped by Yours. Help me to fight an excellent fight, finish my full course with all my might, and keep my heart full of faith. Amen.



Paul was compassionately bold. Some with opposing views may have mistook his passion for pride or narrow-mindedness. Despite his fearlessness, a shadow hung over his life: "I am the least of the apostles, who am not worthy to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the church of God." The fuller context of Paul's remark is in 1 Corinthians 15:1-11. Verse 10 gives the anecdote to his guilt and 11 highlights the purpose of his good fight. How do these verses guide you to fulfill today's iconic verse?







Iconic Scripture

(Speak God's Word Aloud)

Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.

Message to Jewish believers who became Christians. Hebrews 11:1 nkjv



Just a concept? Sometimes faith is viewed as an abstract idea. And yet the author describes faith as having "substance." A definition for substance is "the real physical matter of which a person or thing consists which has a tangible, solid presence." Let us search Hebrews 11:1 for the solid presence in faith. Lo and behold, it is "hope" and "the evidence of things not seen." What? All intangibles. Perhaps that is the point.

Faith is *not* faith *in* faith.

It is faith in the tangible Author and Finisher of our faith, Jesus Christ.

He gave us a physical picture of faith through His life, a map to follow.

Consider Hebrews 11:8. "By faith Abraham obeyed when he was called to go out to the place which he would receive as an inheritance. And he went out, not knowing where he was going." No map with a pin in the final destination, and no evidence ... vet. But faith in what God had said moved Abraham forward. Time passed. He homesteaded near Bethel, but had yet to see the fulfillment of the second half of God's promise, a nation-building heir. In Genesis 15, I paraphrase his question to God: "where's the substance and the evidence that I will have a son?" The answer? God brought Abraham outside and directed his eyes to the stars while his feet stood on the promised soil. His tent was staked in the evidence. Does God honor faith? Abraham would say "yes!"



Prayer

Lord, help me to recognize the evidence of unseen things which I now see. I trust that You know Your plan and what is best. I want to be fully in sync with You and rest patiently in confident expectation that every unanswered hope or prayer is not forgotten or ignored, but will be answered in accordance with Your love and wisdom, Your timing and ways.

I stake my life of faith on this.



We have hoped for specific outcomes and waited for the evidence of what we have not seen. At times we have not received that which we have asked and prayed for. How does this affect your faith? How does a combination of a temporal and eternal view help you, knowing God redeems all things in His timing? Hebrews 11:36-40 speaks of those who were not delivered. What was their reward?







We have all heard it...if you see the word "therefore," at the start of a sentence in your Bible, look back and see what it is "there for." Today's iconic scripture leads with "therefore" so we will apply that sage advice. According to online info, the original Bible was a continuous text. Chapter breaks were first added in the early 1200's and then revised in the 1600's. Therefore, (no pun intended), if we read the book of Hebrews with no chapter breaks, new light is shed on the "great cloud of witnesses" in 12:1.

Preceding chapter 12 is the "Hall of Faith", the famous chapter in the Bible that highlights significant (and obscure) people who walked "by faith." Each of them lived by faith through trying circumstances. Abel who offered to God a more excellent sacrifice than his brother and was murdered by him, Noah who saved his family from the flood, Sarah who bore a child in her (very) old age, Isaac, Jacob, Joseph, Moses, Rahab, and many more. And then we come upon our iconic verse:

"Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses...". Who is it that surrounds us? Those whose lives testify about living by faith! They teach us how to thrive in our faith walk; they spur us onward in our faith! Their witness is a shining light. How are we to do this? Verse 2 ...

"Looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith..." Our Lord is the

perfect example of walking by faith.



Great Cloud of Witnesses

Faith is action. It begins with personal action and proceeds to public action. Revisit Psalm 34. List the personal action steps it speaks of (ie: *I will bless the Lord; Magnify the Lord; Taste and See; Come; Listen.*) In Jesus Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5-7), He provides many action steps to help you walk by faith and be a difference-maker. Ponder, record, and do. Start where Holy Spirit directs.







Let's explore our iconic verse, Isaiah 55:11, in a paraphrased version.

So also will be the word that I speak; it does not return to me unfulfilled. My word performs My purpose and fulfills the mission I sent it out to accomplish.

(The Passion Translation)

The two letter word, "so," in our iconic scripture functions as a result-connector referring to something already mentioned. In the scripture prior to today's verse 11, the Lord gives us a result-connector, a visual analogy that helps us understand the power of God's Word.

Read verse 10 aloud and slow (see below.)

Mentally follow the process of rain and snow from the vault of heaven and it's benefit and affect on the earth.

"For as the rain comes down, and the snow from heaven, and do not return there, but water the earth, and make it bring forth and bud, that it may give seed to the sower and bread to the eater"...

Now, in your Bible combine verses 10 and 11. Read them aloud.

Connect the benefits of physical rain to the benefits of God's mighty Word.

What does physical water accomplish on the earth?

Refresh, cleanse, renew, nourish, spark growth, support life.

God's Word is **the "missionary"** sent by God Himself to accomplish life-giving results on the earth—in your life!

So shall my word be that goes forth from My mouth; it shall not return to Me void, but it shall accomplish what I please, and it shall prosper in the things for which I sent it.



King David's Psalm about the "Divine Shepherd" ♦ Psalm 23:1 nkjv



The Apostle Paul reminded his young mentor, Timothy, "from childhood you have known the Holy Scriptures."

2 Timothy 3:15a Likewise, many have known Psalm 23 from their earliest days, particularly the first line.

Toddlers are often taught it. I remember my firstborn, Ryan, could quote the entire Psalm at the age of 4. We practiced it five days each week as I drove him to his babysitter on my way to work. Today, my lovely firstborn great granddaughter, Adalee Rose, is learning Psalm 23.

David is the author of the 23rd Psalm. David was an actual shepherd of sheep before he was anointed king of Israel. He truly understood shepherding a flock and wrote from his experience. 1 Samuel chapter 16 is the record of the day the Prophet Samuel arrived to anoint a new king to replace disobedient Saul. 

Romans 8 is a life-changing Bible chapter which we would be tremendously blessed to memorize! Yes, it is long ... 39 verses, but all of which are powerhouse scriptures, even "iconic!" Have I memorized Romans 8? Sadly, not yet. But it is a great desire of mine and definitely on my list of highly important things to do in my lifetime. Why? Romans 8 embodies profound, liberating truth, hidden secrets, and undeniable hope. The chapter begins with "no condemnation" and ends with "no separation!" Isn't this what we ultimately hope for? Sandwiched in the chapter is verse 37 ... we are more than conquerors through Him who loved us.

Romans 8 takes us through the journey of *how* we are more than conquerors. Ephesians 1:13-14 compliments Romans 8 by confirming that we are sealed into our relationship with Christ. God wants us to cooperate with Him so that we can live the overcoming life, not just be an overcomer in name only. There is one who has come to steal, kill, and destroy. If Satan cannot have our salvation, he certainly will work to diminish our joy in the Lord through fear, condemnation, distress, confusion. We slam and lock the door to his destructive yakking by obeying the first admonition of Romans 8: ... do not walk according to the flesh, but according to the Spirit ...



Run here, do that! Even our young ones have schedules that do not make space for renewal. In light of the scriptures, how can you model renewal in your life and perhaps help some youth or young families slow the pace and pause in God's presence? Pray about how you can be an example and an influence to others to pursue the spiritual disciplines so they can experience renewal. Make a plan.







Have you observed that living creatures have an innate, built in characteristic?

They want to live. Think about small insects such as ants, spiders, grasshoppers, crickets. If they sense danger, what do they do? Most run or fly. They don't want to risk being squished.

Risk-taking is contrary to many people. Risk-taking can open us up to trouble, pain, entering heavens' gates sooner than we plan. On the other hand, risk has produced profound outcomes on the world stage and in private lives.

In Ecclesiastes 11:4, King Solomon wrote: "He who observes the wind will not sow, and he who regards the clouds will not reap." My first interpretation of this verse has been that if we are afraid of risk, then we want only favorable conditions before we do, work, serve, love. But then I began to wonder...is it wise to sow in the wind? Is it prudent to cast seed to plant in the ground if the wind will swoop it up and carry it into ditches or other fields? And is it a good idea to harvest when the clouds indicate rain is coming. A moldy harvest is a bad outcome to a great planting season.

Reckless behavior is not healthy or holy risk-taking. Making safety and comfort our highest goal is not a display of faith in God. A blend of applied foresight and stepping out in faith, unafraid of being squished, is God's plan. Thought-out risk-taking = an expanded soul and life!

Doing things differently than you are accustomed is risky business. You know you're tendencies. Do you tend to press and breach boundaries, taking unnecessary risks that are not pleasing to God? Or do you play it safe to avoid getting squished? How can you know when to press and when to pause? God's Word, open doors, and the nudge of Holy Spirit give important guidance. Begin there.







Today's iconic scripture is one my daughter, Katie, refers to often. She explains her insights. We have to live in our experiences, but not unpack there. We need to want to be healed whether that is physically, emotionally, spiritually, mentally. We cannot be defined by something that has crippled us for decades or months or weeks or days.

Difficulties can be great teachers, but the teachers must not indoctrinate us to be hopeless. In the paralyzed man's story, he had clearly unpacked at the pool called "Bethesda" where false faith and hopelessness became his companion. Ironically, in Aramaic "Bethesda" means "house of mercy." For 38 years this man believed the legend that an angel would stir the water and the first one in would be healed. Jesus arrived and dispelled the myth and physically healed the man.

When the journey is long and answers to our needs and prayers seem to be "no" or are delayed, we must be vigilant to guard against deferred hope and unpacking in our pain. When asked if he wanted to be made well, the paralyzed man's answer revealed his focus.

Instead of a rousing "yes!," an excuse:

"Sir, I have no
man to put me into the pool."
"Mercy" was not derailed:
"Rise, take up your bed and walk."
What happened next?
"And immediately the man was made well, took up his bed, and walked."







Written in pencil on lined school paper and tucked away in a special place were the words of Ruth 1:16-17. I was young—perhaps 15. I had a handsome boyfriend with whom I believed I was in love and might even marry someday. Yes, at age 15! I had been reading my Mom's red Catholic Bible. Even though I did not grasp much of the words and stories, the book of Ruth grabbed me. Pencil to paper, I copied verses 16 and 17 thinking maybe one day I would say them at a marriage altar. And I did. And he did. 53 years later we are still saying "where you go I will go."

Some commitments have a honeymoon phase, but not all. When Ruth spoke the words of verses 16 and 17, it meant she would abruptly leave her homeland and make a treacherous trek to a new country and culture. She would be the caregiver of her mother-in-law who was steeped in grief and bitterness over the loss of her husband and two sons. In Ruth's new home, she would face prejudice, loneliness, poverty, and hard field work with little pay. Her future as a childless widow seemed certain. So why do it?

Ruth forsook "her pagan heritage in order to cling to the people of Israel and to the God of Israel." (Open Bible commentary.)

For believers, commitment means leaving something behind to move into God's future. He has a plan, place, and people.

1 Corinthians 13 is often referred to as "the love chapter" of the Bible. It contains distinctly clear instructions about what God-love is and is not. This is true ... none of us loves perfectly. Our actions and words may not always reflect God's love perfectly, but our desire is present.

When our love is tested, if we fail

When our love is tested, if we fail, we can rely on this truth:

"...the love of God has been poured out in our hearts by the Holy Spirit who was given to us." Romans 5:5

This means that God's love is resident in our lives. It is not a mere seed, but instead it is His fully developed love. What do we do with that? We stay attentive, ask the Lord to help us be His light in the world by loving as He does, and we repent and begin again if we fail. Loving as He loves is contrary to our flesh, but in rhythm with our redeemed spirit. But it requires intention. When we sincerely seek to know how to love as God does, we bless Him, others, and us! We begin by observing God's love in His Word, by letting Holy Spirit teach us about our Lord's heart. We love based on verses 4-7 inwardly, outwardly, purposefully.

Lord, I am so grateful for the "love-list" in 1 Corinthians 13. You do not leave me in the dark about what Your love looks like. You sent Your Son, Jesus, who purposefully perfectly demonstrated every quality of love in this chapter. And then, by Your Holy Spirit, you poured Your love in my heart.



Today's iconic scripture is one which our friend, Marsha, refers to often. She shares her connection to this verse: In this season, I return to this verse often. It tells me the truth about my Father. He is Sovereign. He has planned my days with love and intent. He is not distant nor uninterested. I am known and loved for all my days.

Like Aspen trees, God's Word is intertwined, each verse connected for a single purpose: to show us the loving heart and plan of God. The verses, chapters, books tell one story through about 40 authors over a period of 1500 years.

When Marsha shared her Psalm 139 scripture, she also quoted the prior verse. My frame was not hidden from You when I was made in the secret place, when I was woven together in the depths of the earth. Psalm 139:15

Omniscient (all knowing,) Omnipotent (all powerful,) Omnipresent (present everywhere,) reveals our Sovereign God. This is Who superintended our development in the womb! Incredibly, Jeremiah the Prophet was given an additional profound insight:

<u>Before</u> I formed you in the womb I knew you; <u>before</u> you were born I sanctified you; I ordained you a prophet to the nations. Jeremiah 1:5

You also were known by your Sovereign God <u>before</u> the womb, <u>in</u> the womb, beyond the womb, forever. Praise God!



There are two kinds of fear.
The fear that makes us afraid,
and the fear that makes us stand in awe.

In our iconic scripture, God is speaking through Isaiah and saying, "Do not be afraid nor dismayed."

The word *dismayed* means to gaze upon with anxiety. As humans, many of us tend to fix our attention on the bad that could happen. But what if we instead focused our minds on the One we are to fear, the One Who we stand in awe of? I'm not suggesting ignoring reality, but what if we determinedly refocus on God?

Consider the woman with the issue of blood. She had every reason to be afraid and stay afraid. Sick for twelve years with a flow of blood no doctor could stop, time and again hearing the physician's words, "there is nothing we can do." All of her money gone, perhaps also her hope. But then Jesus! Hearing He was nearby, she cast off fear like a blind man's cloak. She went where a ceremonially unclean woman should not be and pushed through the crowds. He was within reach. Had she retreated in fear in that last moment, talked herself out of trusting for her miracle, she would have never known healing and affirmation of her faith. She forced herself forward, then one small touch. Did it feel like the whole world went silent? Maybe. She knew she was healed and Jesus knew someone had touched Him with faith. Finally her fear was gone, but her fear of God ignited!



Look up scriptures about God's newness. Rejoice He is always doing a new thing!







Theologians have attempted to piece together Paul's last days. Many have concluded that 2 Timothy may have been the final letter he wrote. If this is true, we hold in our hands the great Apostle Paul's final written message.

Despite his imprisonment, Paul continued to encourage and mentor. In essence, he passed the ministry baton to Timothy and gave him sound guidance. In this final letter, we can glean final thoughts from Paul, among which is his profound statement, our iconic scripture.

The setting: Paul was suffering in prison for the sake of the Gospel. He knew his days were closing. Thus he prayerfully committed to the Lord what was important to him, a prayed last will and testament to God. I have wondered exactly what Paul committed. He was clearly a kingdom-minded man so we can believe he committed the many churches he planted, the people he worked alongside, the friends and companions he traveled with, and the leaders he commissioned. But I think there was more. Most likely Paul committed his prayers and hopes into the able hands of almighty God, prayers that he trusted would be fulfilled beyond his lifetime. What have you committed to the Lord for safekeeping until the day of His return? Are you persuaded beyond a shadow of a doubt that God has a firm grip on your work, your loved ones, prayers, you? Well. He does!



Our iconic scripture, Isaiah 32:18, is a compelling verse to frame & hang on the wall of our home as many have done so. However this verse speaks to much more than our personal blessings; it speaks of God's hand on His beloved people Israel, and His intention toward we, His beloved. God has revived what was dead, restored what was stolen, and healed the disease of many souls, families, and nations.

Isaiah 32:18 is in the core of the first 35 chapters of the Book of Isaiah. These chapters are considered to be the *prophecies of condemnation*, yet God sprinkles hope within the hard prophecies.

What is the anchor for the hope? Isaiah 32:1 "Behold, a king will reign in righteousness, and princes will rule with justice. Isaiah 32:15a Until the Spirit is poured upon us from on high.

A righteous King and righteous rule! The outpouring of Holy Spirit!

The outcome?

- The wilderness that once was overrun with thorns and briers becomes a fruitful field where justice dwells and righteousness remains.
- The work of righteousness is peace and the effect is quietness and assurance.

And our iconic scripture:

Today Israel is fruitful where thorns and briers once grew. This is our hope also!
