

Springtime is synonymous with new life! Determine to set aside opportunities to journey through these 21 devotionals in this new season. Search for hidden treasures in the life of Joseph.

The Spiritual Disciplines—Silence and Solitude

We encourage you to continue to incorporate as many spiritual disciplines as possible in your Private Retreats. Our spiritual discipline focus for this Springtime Season is a combination of silence and solitude.

The aim of silence and solitude is to purposely present yourself before God to listen and learn from Him. Solitude is a "come away with the Lord," a time designated to intentionally abstain from interaction with others so you might interact uninterrupted with God. Henri Nouwen said that "silence is the way to make solitude a reality." We know that responsibilities may make it challenging to find blocks of time for complete silence and solitude, but God is pleased with your sincere effort. He can work in moments, minutes, and hours.

The Life of Joseph in the Book of Genesis

Joseph's story, like ours, begins in the first book of the Bible, Genesis. During these 21 Private Retreats, we will pick up Joseph's story in Genesis chapter 37. Some days we will read a full chapter and other days a portion. If you would like to acquire a historical foundation of Joseph's life, his family history three generations prior begins in Genesis chapter 11. There you will read about Joseph's famous ancestors: Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob (whom God later re-named "Israel.")

Included at the beginning of each 7 days is a "Reflections" page highlighting parallels between the lives of Joseph and Jesus. Some comparative information between Joseph and Jesus has been gleaned from the organizations "Jesus Plus Nothing" and "Jews for Jesus."

<u>Observations and Prayer</u> Commentary and prayer prompts associated with each day's Bible reading are provided for your pondering and action.

A Deeper Look

Following the Observations and Prayer is "A Deeper Look" where supporting scriptures will help deepen your understanding of the daily Bible reading.

Worship in Song





Welcome! Historical Gates



Some manmade structures are simply iconic.

Their history is often interwoven
with the name they have been given.

The Golden Gate Bridge San Francisco, California

The Golden Gate Bridge was built in the 1930's at a cost of \$35 million dollars and, sadly, 11 lives. It spans 4,200 feet and was the longest suspension bridge in the world until 1964. It derived it's name from the Golden Gate Strait over which it stretches 1.7 miles from entrance to entrance.

The strait is the water taxiway from the Pacific Ocean into San Francisco Bay. It might be said that the bridge is the "water gate" of the "City by the Bay."

The color of the "Golden Gate Bridge" is not gold (as some might expect.)
Instead, it is "International Orange."
Year around, the gate bridge is inspected and painted to protect it from the harsh conditions—sea salt and fog.
Ongoing onslaughts from nature require ongoing maintenance.

Joseph's Historical Family

His name was "Joseph."

His name means "Jehovah has added."

He was the firstborn son of his father and mother, Jacob and Rachel and the eleventh son among twelve. Joseph became the gate to life for his kinsmen.

Like all of us, Joseph had a history ... a family history.

Love, hate, comradery, favoritism, jealousy, rivalry ... rivalry taken too far.

But Joseph also had his own personal story.


One thing I love about Joseph is this:

Joseph demonstrates that we need not be mere outcomes of our past or our pain. We are not doomed because of our bloodline or any foolish acts committed by us or against us. Instead, we are offered a hope and a future—a new history— because of the God-man, Jesus Christ. Life will have ongoing onslaughts, but we can be diligent to do ongoing soul-maintenance. Joseph did. And he learned this: God is a very present help in times of trouble and in times of triumph! (Psalm 46)

The Story of Joseph
(Read or Listen)

Genesis chapter 37, verses 1-11



Observations

Genesis chapter 37, verses 1 through 11 provides a backdrop for Joseph's life story. Within these 11 Old Testament verses, we are introduced to three historical aspects in Joseph's experiences that remind us of Jesus. Joseph was beloved of his father, he foretold through the dreams given to him that he would rule in the future, and he was hated and envied without a cause by his own brothers. In the New Testament, we see that Jesus was loved by His Father. At His baptism, God affirmed His love. During Jesus' examination before the high priest prior to His crucifixion, He foretold that He would rule. Jesus was delivered to be crucified, not for any sin or crime, but because of envy and hatred. Joseph life foreshadows or prefigures Jesus' earth life. Of interest, all of Joseph's years on earth were spent in lands where he and his family were strangers: first Canaan and then Egypt. One day those who believe will be home in God's promised land! Soon, but not yet!

Lord, thank You for showing us Your Son, Jesus, even in the Old Testament. Amen

The Story of Joseph (Read or Listen)

Genesis chapter 37, verses 12-36



Observations

Genesis chapter 37, verses 12 through 36 is heart wrenching. Artists have attempted to depict the conspiracy and conduct of the older brothers and the anguish of Joseph's soul, but how can such a desperate moment be illustrated on canvas? Yet in the midst of evil, God's mystery plan of salvation was beginning to take shape. Although the act of murder was the first intention, (verses 18-20), there was a "Nicodemus" among the scheming brothers. But Reuben heard it, and he delivered him out of their hands, and said, "Let us not kill him." That day, Joseph was not murdered physically, but just as his coat of many colors was stripped from him, so the life with his father and family was torn away. Sold into slavery for twenty shekels of silver, Joseph was pulled from the pit and carried away into Egypt. Joseph's story parallels Jesus' story who was also rejected and condemned to die, stripped of his clothing, and sold for silver coins. Sometimes God's plan is difficult. Lord, help us to be a "Nicodemus" to others, to provide support as You work out Your plan. Amen

Genesis chapter 38



Observations

Genesis chapter 38 is like a misplaced intermission with a purpose. To help our 21st century western minds grasp it, lets look at the cultural facts. If a brother died before having a child, his next brother or near relative was expected to marry his widow and raise up a child who would carry the dead man's name and inherit his land. Genesis 38 tells the story of Judah, the fourth born son of Jacob and Leah. He had a son named "Er" who died. Er's wife, Tamar, was sexually mistreated by Onan, Er's brother, and then ignored by her father-in-law, Judah. She devised a plan to preserve her deceased husband's name and inheritance that resulted in the birth of Judah's twin sons through her pregnancy. More important than the unusual cultural norms of that day is the fact that our Messiah Jesus came through the union of Judah and Tamar. She is even listed in the genealogy of Christ. Eventually in Joseph's story, Judah defends and intercedes for his youngest brother, Benjamin. Intercession is the ministry of Judah's future descendant, Jesus! Thank You Jesus for being the Go-Between at Calvary. Thank You for our family ties with You. Amen

The Story of Joseph
(Read or Listen)
Genesis chapter 39



Observations

Genesis chapter 39 takes us into the home of "Potiphar, an officer of Pharaoh, the captain of his guard." Potiphar purchased Jacob's son at the slave market. Consider who Joseph was at this time: 17 years old, his Dad a farmer who had flocks of animals, the favorite child. When Joseph was forcefully transported about 325 miles on a weeks long journey away from his family, the only treasure he carried out of his homeland was his knowledge and faith in the God of Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. In Egypt, Joseph becomes a diligent, wise, worker—as unto the Lord—and his master recognizes the hand of God upon him. "...the Lord blessed the Egyptian's house for Joseph's sake." Things were going well. Then, just as he did in the Garden of Eden, the Tempter shows up. Yet, unlike Adam and Eve, Joseph resists. Although unjustly cast into prison, he again becomes Overseer. Like the Shepherd and Overseer of his soul, Joseph obeyed God even in a foreign land.

Lord Jesus, You are the Shepherd and Overseer of our souls. Your eyes are in every place. Amen

(Read or Listen)
Genesis chapter 40



Observations

Genesis chapter 40 reconnects Joseph to dreams. Back home, Joseph had two significant dreams pertaining to the future. The dreams were unintentionally interpreted by his father: "... What is this dream that you have dreamed? Shall your mother and I and your brothers indeed come to bow down to the earth before you?" We may wonder if his time in the Egyptian prison diminished Joseph's memory of his dreams. A day came when two prominent officers of Pharaoh were imprisoned and assigned to Joseph's charge. Each had similar dreams, but were distraught that no one could interpret. Joseph boldly declared God would give the interpretation. Each explanation came true: the butler was restored to his service as the king's cup bearer; the baker was hung from the gallows. It is intriguing that keepers of wine and bread were used by God to reconnect Joseph to dreams. Two years passed before the butler remembered Joseph, but Joseph's work continued to prosper.

The Story of Joseph (Read or Listen)

Genesis chapter 41, verses 1-36



Observations

Genesis chapter 41, verses 1-36 is a "suddenly" in the Bible. Joseph awakens one morning in prison to the same schedule he has lived for the previous hundreds of days. Suddenly a message arrives that the king of Egypt demands he be brought out of prison to the palace. Joseph had no idea if he had enraged the king and this day would be his last. Such was not the case. Instead, a proverb written by a future relative came true: "A man's gift makes room for him, and brings him before great men." Proverbs 18:16 Pharaoh had dreamed two dreams which none of his magicians or wise men could interpret. Then the butler remembered Joseph interpreting his dream two years earlier. In that palace moment, Joseph was clear about his position as a reliant co-laborer with God. Pharaoh said he had heard that Joseph could interpret dreams. Joseph redirected the honor to Almighty God: It is not in me; God will give Pharaoh an answer of peace." Genesis 41:16

Lord, solidify the truth in me that every good and perfect gift comes from You. Amen

The Story of Joseph
(Read or Listen)

Genesis chapter 41, verses 37-57



Observations

Genesis chapter 41, verses 37-57 are 21 summary verses of a very big picture, multiple events, and seven + years. In these verses, God is acknowledged, Joseph is exalted to second in command in Egypt and given the highest authority except for Pharaoh himself. He implements his plan to gather food during the 7 prosperous years, is married and has two sons, and is the "go to" when the famine begins. Joseph began his service to Egypt and the nations when he was 30 years old, about 13 years after being sold into slavery. Despite all this activity, we have not forgotten the high cost to Joseph. Sometimes we also pay a high price and may ask God the "why" question. Regarding Joseph, we may ask: "Why" did he have to be separated from his family? "Why" the famine? With time, truth unfolds and in a later chapter, Joseph himself answers the question. For now, he leans into the important work God has assigned in the place he has been planted despite the "Why?" Lord, we don't always grasp "why" things happen. Help us to believe this truth: You are good. Amen



The Story of Joseph
(Read or Listen)
Genesis chapter 42



Observations

Genesis chapter 42 is a window into the guilt ridden hearts of the 10 older brothers who hated Joseph and sold him into slavery. The road to Egypt to purchase food for Jacob's household may have been the same road Joseph travelled more than 20 years earlier. We can only imagine the thoughts that plagued each of the brothers concerning Joseph during those long dusty miles and quiet moments. Perhaps they realized how terrible Joseph's forced, solitary journey away from home and family must have been. When they arrived in Egypt, Joseph recognized them, but they did not know him. As Egypt's ruler, Joseph treated them harshly and they reasoned among themselves that it was because of their sin against their brother. Joseph wisely tested them with 3 days in prison and a demand when they returned—bring their youngest brother. Of interest is this: Joseph kept one brother as a hostage in jail while the others returned: Simeon, whose name means "Because I am unloved." Perhaps a subtle reminder of their hate for Joseph. Food for thought on the road back home.

Genesis chapter 43



Observations

Genesis chapter 43 is the second encounter between Joseph and his brothers in Egypt. However, this time his youngest brother, Benjamin, is present. We can only imagine how Dad Jacob is feeling back in Canaan. Alone with no cell phone, no ability to know if he will ever see his 11 remaining sons again. Only God could fill the gap in his life, could meet him in his solitude and silence just as He did years before at Jabbok. Genesis 32 Back in Egypt, the brothers have been summoned to a meal in the house of "Zaphnath-Paaneah." the name given to Joseph by Pharaoh. Genesis 41:45 They readied their gift and themselves to meet with the powerful Egyptian leader. After inquiries about their father and meeting their youngest brother, they sat down to the table. All twelve were together once again even though the brothers did not realize it. They were fully known by name even though they did not understand how they could be seated at the table in their birth order. They were highly favored, deeply loved ... and particularly Benjamin ... even though they did not know why. Lord, we are overwhelmed to be Your beloved ones, known by name, highly favored, pursued. Amen

The Story of Joseph (Read or Listen)

Genesis chapter 44



Observations

Genesis chapter 44 gives a stark picture of a changed heart. In the beginning of Joseph's saga, while he was most likely trying to climb and scratch his way out of the pit his brothers had thrown him into it, Judah was the brother who suggested they make a profit off of Joseph instead of killing him. Genesis 37:27a In the years since that horrendous day in the field, Judah learned many consequential lessons. Moment by moment he carried the secret and the guilt about Joseph. Daily he observed the unrelenting grief of his father. Judah also dealt with the unthinkable details when he used a destitute woman for his own sexual pleasure (who turned out to be his daughter-in-law, Tamar.) These experiences surely reshaped his soul. Now in Egypt, the old Judah would have left Jacob's other favorite son in prison to languish. But the changed man now begged to take his younger brother's place and serve as a slave. Centuries later, Judah's story would play out again when his descendant, Jesus, would take the place of many who are beloved by His Heavenly Father.

Lord Jesus, Judah was spared Golgotha but You were not. Thank You for taking our place. Amen

The Story of Joseph (Read or Listen)

Genesis chapter 45:1-15



Observations

Genesis chapter 45:1-15 is one of those tender, climactic moments in the Bible. 22 years had passed and the brothers were convinced that Joseph was dead. In their travels to and from Egypt, perhaps they wondered if his dried bones were lying beneath the dusty surface alongside the roadway. But now, in the middle of a foreign culture, the ruler throughout all the land of Egypt was weeping before them and revealing his true identity. What? How can this be? The brothers could not comprehend the news, so Joseph beckoned them to come near to him. He began to share knowledge that only he and they knew—"I am Joseph your brother whom you sold into Egypt." And then he tenderly tried to comfort them with the insights he had gained about God's purpose: "For God sent me before you to preserve life." He wanted the brothers to hurry, to go tell his father the good news and bring all of the family to Egypt so he could care and provide for them. Joseph then kissed all of his brothers. They would go as couriers of the best news! He's alive! Joseph is alive! Jesus, You've revealed Your true identity to us. You have shown us that You are alive! Praise God!

The Story of Joseph (Read or Listen)

Observations

Genesis chapter 45:16-28 is reminiscent of the time Joseph's great-great grandfather, Abraham, sent his most trusted servant to obtain a wife for his son, Isaac. The servant had specific instructions and agreed by oath to faithfully obey the agreement. He loaded 10 camels with clothing and with jewelry of silver and gold as a bride price along with travel provisions. His journey was anointed by God and successful, and Rebekah became Isaac's wife. (Genesis 24) When in a season of bountiful harvests, clothing, gold and silver are often highly coveted. However, in a season of drought, we would rather see a caravan bringing life-sustaining provision. Thus was the case for Joseph's family ... provisions, and then some. Not only did they receive the needed food, they received changes of clothing, carts to carry their family back to Egypt, their money returned, and best of all, the promise of a fruitful land to homestead in Egypt. However, for Jacob, all was a distant second to the best news: his beloved son Joseph was alive! This was sweet honey to his soul. It is You, Lord, that we yearn for above all things. You before Your bountiful provisions. You! Amen

The Story of Joseph (Read or Listen) Genesis chapter 46



Genesis chapter 46 is the story of the big move to Egypt. As patriarch of his shepherding family, Jacob is the final decision maker and bears responsibility for his sons, their children, and wives. Sixty six of his blood relatives plus his son's wives were uprooted and moved to Egypt. Not a small task. One stop along his journey was Beersheba in the south. "Beersheba" most likely means "Well of an Oath." Genesis 21 His own father, Isaac, spent time in Beersheba where the Lord appeared to him and promised blessing and multiplication of his descendants "for My servant Abraham's sake." Genesis 26:23-25 And now Jacob has paused his journey in that same place. There he had a "private retreat" with the Lord. He offered sacrifices to the God of his father. And that night, God reassured Jacob about his decision to go to Egypt. "I am the God of your father;

do not fear to go down to Egypt, for I will make of you a great nation there. I will go down with you to Egypt, and I will also surely bring you up again; and Joseph will put his hand on your eyes." Genesis chapter 47: verses 1-11



Observations

Genesis chapter 47:1-12 introduces Pharaoh to some of Joseph's family and they to him. Joseph had prepared his family for their conversations with Pharaoh. The outcome of the conversations were great blessings. Pharaoh instructed Joseph to position his family to dwell in the best of the land and he also offered employment—chief herdsmen positions over the king's livestock to any competent men in the family. Then Joseph presented his 130 year old father, Jacob. After a brief interchange, Jacob blessed Pharaoh. The land in Egypt Joseph gave as a possession was the best land. More importantly, it bordered the land of promise. Some believe that Joseph's intention was to separate his family from the influence and prejudice of the Egyptian culture and to keep God's chosen people as near to God's Promised Land as possible lest they forget the unconditional covenant God had made with Abraham: "Go from your country and your kindred and your father's house to the land that I will show you. And I will make you a great nation... Genesis 12:1 Lord, help us to never become comfortable on the border of Your perfect will. Amen



Genesis chapter 47: verses 12-26



Observations

Genesis chapter 47:12-26 is the story of multitudes of people surviving a 7 year famine because of insider information. In the stock exchange world, that term prompts raised eyebrows and prosecution. But not in God's economy. Because God gave Pharaoh the warning through his dreams and the interpretation of those dreams through Joseph, a plan to prevent widespread starvation was implemented and successful. But then arises the question about the Egyptian taxes. Taxes are a part of almost all cultures; governments cannot function without an income. Because of the severity of the famine, Joseph worked out a plan so that the people could legally obtain their provisions. The outcome may seem unfair: before it was all over, their lands and even they belonged to the government, but they were alive. Joseph instituted an important law: the tax never exceeded 20% under his watch. A flat 20% tax would be nice! Of interest: Joseph's family were not among the Egyptians who sold their lands and selves for bread. God wanted His people free to return home.

The Story of Joseph (Read or Listen)

Genesis chapter 47: verses 27-31



Observations

Genesis chapter 47:27-31 brings us to Jacob's mortality. It has become apparent to him that his days are coming to a close. He wisely does not ignore the evidence or try to wish it away. Instead, he makes a plan. Jacob has now dwelt in Egypt 17 years, the same number of years as Joseph's age when he was sold into slavery and disappeared with no trace but a bloody coat of many colors. God gave Jacob a total of 34 years with his beloved son, 17 more than he ever imagined. The famine had ended 12 years before, and still Jacob and his family remained in Egypt. Perhaps he wanted to stay close to Joseph. Maybe life was easier there than in Canaan. By this time Jacob was 147 years old and Joseph was about 56. Jacob had not forgotten the covenant promise of God. Already his family had grown and multiplied exceedingly as God had said, but they were not in the promised land. Jacob summoned Joseph and secured an oath from him to carry him out of Egypt and bury him with his fathers. Joseph said he would do so. But Jacob took it further: "Swear to me." Lord, lest we forget Your words, help us write the vision & make it plain so we can run with it. Amen

Observations

Genesis chapter 48:1-7 opens a curtain into Jacob's death bed room. We see him strengthen himself for Joseph's visit. It appears he had things to say and was anxious to speak as soon as Joseph arrived. What is said in everyone's final, precious hours is to be highly valued and heard. Not once did Joseph interrupt. The single most important words from Jacob were to recount his encounter with God in his homeland, Canaan. It was the covenant promise: "Behold, I will make you fruitful and multiply you, and I will make of you a multitude of people, and give this land to your descendants after you as an everlasting possession." The promise rolled off of his aged tongue because he had secured it in his heart. Jacob's determined purpose was to reinforce the promise in Joseph's mind and to impart the inheritance of the promise to Joseph's sons. Jacob's hours were short. His thoughts switched to his beloved wife, Rachel who died in childbirth. He knew he would soon follow her in death. Joseph gave his Dad the honorable gift of a hearing ear. Lord, it is appointed unto men once to die. Each of us will. Help us speak meaningful words. Amen

The Story of Joseph (Read or Listen)

Genesis chapter 48: verses 8-22



Observations

Genesis chapter 48:8-22 connects Jacob to Joseph's sons. When Joseph hears that his father is ill, he gathers his two sons, Manasseh and Ephraim to go spend time with their grandfather. While there, Jacob lays claim on his grandsons, basically adopting them both as children and elevating them into the inheritance with his sons. When the time came for the patriarchal blessing, Jacob intentionally laid his right hand on the head of Ephraim, the younger of Joseph's boys. Joseph tried to correct this seeming error, but Jacob insisted. Can you see the twinkle in his eye? "I know, my son, I know." The youngest would receive the greater blessing by God's design. Eventually from the tribe of Ephraim came notable men like Joshua, the successor leader of Moses and Samuel, the first prophet to the nation of Israel. This was not the first time the "2nd" received the blessing that seemed to belong to the "1st." Jacob himself obtained his older brother, Esau's birthright, and Isaac was heir instead of Ishmael. Sometimes God crosses His arms too. Lord, You said the first will be last & the last first. Thank You for Your grace & generosity. Amen

Genesis chapter 49: verses 1-32



Observations

Genesis chapter 49 is the Patriarch's recap of his son's character and prophesies about their future. This impartation of information was not done in private, but rather in the family gathering. Some words were brief, hopeful, and complimentary like those spoken of Gad, Asher, and Naphtali. Other words were harsh like those spoken of Reuben, Simeon and Levi. Judah and Joseph received prophesies that aligned them directly with the future Messiah. Each of these twelve men, with the exception of Benjamin, were older than Joseph's 56 years. Their giftings and actions were observed and known by their father. Today it is our prayer that those things that our Father in Heaven knows of us are covered and cleansed by the shed blood of our Lord, Jesus Christ. We desire to walk in newness of life, not bogged down by the weight of past sins. Thank God for the promise

of Psalm 103:12... "As far as the east is from the west, so far has He removed our transgressions from us." Lord, thank You for every promise in Psalm 103. It is a beautiful banner over our souls. Amen

The Story of Joseph (Read or Listen)

Genesis chapter 49: verse 33 and chapter 50: verses 1-14



Observations

Genesis chapters 49: 33 and 50:1-14 concludes Jacob's life. Joseph was overcome with grief as his father breathed his last breath. The Egyptian embalming process and 70 days of mourning meant that Joseph was not able to immediately fulfill his promise to his father to bury him in Canaan. But the time came and Pharaoh granted the necessary permission for Joseph to depart and bury his father. This was no ordinary funeral. Joseph, his brothers, and family did not travel alone to bury their patriarch. All the servants of Pharaoh, the elders of his house, and all the elders of the land of Egypt made the journey. Can you imagine? Horses and chariots and people shared Joseph and his families loss. The mourning was intense ... "a deep mourning of the Egyptians" is what was thought by those in the local community. And then ... well, life had to go on. Joseph returned to Egypt as did his brothers. By this time they were deeply engrained and committed in their lives in Goshen and the palace. What would their future bring now that Dad is buried in Canaan? Lord, comfort us when we lay a beloved one in the grave. Undergird us when grief overwhelms. Amen

The Story of Joseph (Read or Listen)

Genesis chapter 50: verses 15-26



Observations

Genesis chapter 50:15-26 contains the end of Joseph's story ... almost. First the brothers begin to worry and fear that, now that their father is gone, there would be no restraint on Joseph to get back at them for their sin four decades earlier. Once again Joseph reassure them with the beautiful message he originally told them when he first revealed his identity: "... as for you, you meant evil against me; but God meant it for good, in order to bring it about as it is this day, to save many people alive." Joseph saw multiple generations of grandchildren. At the age of 110, he knew he was dying. Just as his father had done, Joseph's heart turned towards his homeland, Canaan. "Then Joseph took an oath from the children of Israel, saying, "God will surely visit you, and you shall carry up my bones from here." 400 years later, Israel walked out of Egyptian slavery to travel to their promised land. One distinct cart in their midst carried a coffin. Inside were the bones of Joseph, the Israeli ruler of Egypt, being carried out in a similar way he had been carried in, heading home.

Lord, your promises are true. Your plans are perfect. Your mercy and grace are enough. Amen






