For many of us, the phrase "spiritual disciplines" evokes a picture of an unruly child being corrected or disciplined for their poor behavior. To the contrary, "spiritual disciplines" are a holy opportunity where God plows and plants His love, truth, and guidance into the field of our lives!



Spiritual Disciplines are the intentional actions we engage in which help us draw near to the Lord. Some refer to these disciplines with a different name: "Spiritual ... practices, rhythms, development."

Spiritual Disciplines are not solely a morning or evening endeavor, but instead a way of life. Yes, the intentional pause with the Lord is a life-changing practice when the sun rises and sets. # Considerations

In this private retreat series, it is our hope that each of us will learn to "Life-Speak."

We want to connect with God and His Word in ways that truly tap into His heart of grace, the genuine application of His truth, and an accurate understanding and faith in God's sovereign outcomes.

What "Life-Speak" is <u>not</u> ... It is not grabbing a familiar scripture, quoting it aloud, and watching at a distance to see what might happen. Life-Speak runs much deeper.

Specific goals in Life-Speak ...

- Open the gate of thoughtful, prayerful, action regarding how to speak God's Word and our words in a fruitful, meaningful way that brings life.
- Encouragement and help to linger in scripture until it pulsates with life in our soul. God's words are life-giving words.
  - Explore the impact on us and others based on our words, beliefs, and heart meditations as we process and respond to God's Word.
- Caution <u>not</u> to approach our or other's real life circumstances dismissively. Life-Speak is more than a slogan.

The "Life-Speak" path is one that each of us most certainly walk and will perpetually travel. Learning to speak life as God does is transforming ... for us and for others. And God-honoring.

Your Bible is God's Word to and for you, the first source of information for your declarations. Supplemental materials are beneficial. However, keeping the main book the main book—your Bible—is like putting gasoline or an electrical charge into your vehicle. Without it, the vehicle has no power. Locate a *secondary* resource that helps you compile and Life-Speak God's Word.







Perhaps our eternal God spoke thousands, trillions - an immeasurable number of words before His first recorded words in our Bible: "Let there be light."

And there was light. Genesis 1:3

Light sustains life on earth.
Without light, nothing else that God spoke into existence could survive.
No vegetation would exist to provide food for humans and animals because plant life in soil is dependent on light.
Even fish need some light to visually orient and establish a healthy life rhythm.

## Eternal life is also dependent on Light.

When you look at the order of creation, do you find it interesting that the sun was not created until day four, Genesis 1:14-19 but God spoke light over the earth on day one? Centuries after creation, when Jesus walked the earth, He proclaimed: "I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but have the light of life." John 8:12

#### Light came before the sun; the Son existed before the created light. John 1:1-5, 14

Your confession of your faith in Jesus, the Light of the World, is your first and foremost declaration.

Knowing the One in Whom you believe and why helps you to share about your faith lovingly and clearly. Refresh your soul today with insights and declarations that anchor your faith and magnify the beautiful work God is perfecting in you.

If you are born again, reflect on your "coming to Jesus" story and rehearse it with a friend. Record the details of how God shone His light into your heart and drew you to Himself. If you are on the journey towards a relationship with Jesus, consider Nicodemus' story in John 3:1-21 and the lessons in Romans 3:23, 5:8 & 9, 6:23, 8:1, and 10:9. Write and declare the verses that touch your heart.







Therefore, when He [Jesus] came into the world, He said: "Sacrifice and offering You did not desire, but a body You have prepared for Me. In burnt offerings & sacrifices for sin You had no pleasure. Then I said, "Behold, I have come—in the volume of the book it is written of Me, to do Your will, O God."

Hebrews 10:5-7

Jesus, our Messiah, quoted from Psalm chapter 40, verses 6-8. These scriptures are a clear pronouncement of His personal mission. Jesus understood the depth of these verses and the application in His life. His example teaches us that declarations are to be thoughtful, prayerful, & understood. The Holy Spirit can cause God's word to pulsate with life in our soul as we present ourselves as students of God and His Word. Imagine ... a one room schoolhouse, you at a desk, and God Almighty, your private teacher!

During His public ministry, Jesus frequently referred to stories and people from the Tenakh (the Hebrew Bible) and quoted Scripture about 78 times. Does it touch the core of your heart that Jesus, God's Son, squeezed Himself into a human body and then studied and stored the very scriptures that testified of Him? He highly valued Scripture and it was clearly evident during His public ministry. He often needed a ready response and declared God's Word from the treasure chest of His studies and memorization. Shall we do as He did?

# Considerations

It was the genesis of my Christian walk. Young in my faith, I was learning to navigate in my Bible and I wanted to be a good student of the things of the Lord. After all. I had entered into new life and wanted to discover all I could about how to live this new life. One teaching dealt with declarations and decrees, faith speaking. I listened and explored about the power of words. I heard stories from people who had received answers that they attributed to "speaking it into existence." Yet some things did not set right with me, perhaps because of inaccurate teaching or my own youthful misinterpretation. Ultimately, declaring and decreeing evolved into a hindrance to my faith. Why? One reason was that I observed misuse by prominent individuals who boasted about receiving what they had declared. Their "answered declarations" resulted in a prosperity that, on the surface was dressed as spiritual, but had an undergarment of carnality. I was confused. I thought faith was about a relationship with God, His purpose, and His people ... not stuff. Over the years I functioned with caution regarding declaring and decreeing.

As time passed, the Lord invited me to explore this topic again. One vital lesson has been to verbally agree with verses the Lord shines a spotlight on in His Word and makes alive in my heart. Declarations about Him, His promises, presence, glory, & care for us are declarations of His will.

Father God, Your Son taught, "In this manner, therefore, pray to our Father in Heaven ... Your Kingdom come, Your will be done on earth as it is in Heaven." Help me, Lord, to comprehend, pray, declare, decree only Your will. Amen

Explore the verses listed in the "Scriptures" section on the previous page pertaining to God's will. What do you think is the importance of seeking to know God's heart and will before declaring? Why is this important? How might this phrase pertain to you if you've had a difficult or hindering spiritual experience ... "Glance Back, Gaze Forward." Ask the Lord to help you gaze forward.







In my earlier days of reading novels, I had a habit of reading the final pages of the story before beginning chapter 1. Sometimes it negatively impacted my joy as I read the book because I knew the outcome, but other times it served as a catalyst to connect all of the dots. This I knew ... the last paragraphs were not the story, only the final period at the end. In our Bible, the Book of Job is one that contains wonderful closing chapters. I think it is worth reading the end before starting the beginning!

Despite all of the unthinkable losses, devastation, and disappointment Job experienced, he clung in faith to what He had heard and experienced about God. In the latter chapters of the Book of Job, after multiple conversations with his "friends" speculating about the "whys" of Job's suffering, the Bible says this: "Then the Lord answered Job out

of the whirlwind ...". Job 38:1 In Job chapters 38-41, God reveals His own magnificence and power. The Lord took Job beyond only hearing to comprehending more of God's glory.

This encounter would have certainly wiped out any platitudes Job may have spoken in his prosperous times. Suffering and revelation changed his speech. If we desire our words to be truly life giving, we need our faith to become tangible, full of texture and truth. As we search for God's magnificence in His Word, even in our trials, our Life-Speak will change.

The definition of "platitude" is a remark or statement with a moral content that has been used too often to be interesting and thoughtful. Clichés have the same effect as platitudes. Is there a scripture you have quoted often that you would like to see in a broader or deeper context? Ask Holy Spirit to make that verse alive again to you. Record how God gave new texture to a familiar scripture.







The Bible records several encounters that Jesus had with blind men. Bartimaeus was a blind beggar who occupied a place alongside the road near Jericho, Mark 10:46-52 and there were the two blind men whom Jesus healed. Matthew 9:27-31 There was also the man who was blind from his birth. John 9 In the instances of Bartimaeus and the two blind men, the first thing they saw when they received their sight was the face of Jesus. But not so for the man born blind. In John 9:11, before he saw, he obeyed the voice of Jesus. He went to the Pool of Siloam as Jesus had instructed where he did as he was told; he washed away the mixture of clay and saliva Jesus had put on his eyes.

When interrogated by the religious hierarchy about who it was that healed him, the man who had been born blind said that he did not know. He had not seen His Healer ... not yet.

Miracle of miracles! He could see!

Yesterday we read about Job who had said that he had heard of God with the hearing of the ear but after his encounter with the Living Word, he saw Him with his eyes. That literally became true for the man born blind. Job's opened "eyes" were the eyes of his understanding. The man born blind received a double miracle of sight...he actually saw the face of Jesus and his understanding was opened. Oh how we long to see Jesus' face, but today we can be blessed with the eyes of our understanding opened wide.



"... Noah was a just man, perfect in his generations; Noah walked with God."

Genesis 6:9b

In this familiar story, we see that God gave humanity a space of 120 years to repent. Genesis 6:3 Simultaneously, He also gave Noah a blueprint and plan to preserve the lives of his family, the beasts, and the birds. Noah and his family began the daunting task to build the massive ark God designed. The work consumed their lives. In those years, there was not (nor ever had been) rain. Noah and his family were surely ostracized by their neighbors.

They pressed on.

Do you wonder if in those 120 years Noah ever questioned if he had heard from God? Did he or the family consider giving up? Is it possible that his wife motivated him onward with declarations of faith, words of life? Perhaps she echoed back to Noah the words He heard from God more than 100 years prior.



#### Declare God's Word Aloud ...

And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching.

# Considerations

What do we say on the day when someone we know receives news that makes the earth feel as though it has stopped spinning on its axis?

What Life-Speak words should we say when feared news becomes reality?

None. At least not yet.

**Life-Speak** words spoken out of season will pour salt into the fresh wounds.

My friend, Marsha, taught me about the importance of silent presence. She calls it "sitting together on the mourning bench." What is it? A time when we sit with the one who is grieving, pray silently, and are simply present to comfort or cry. In the Bible, after Job's severe losses of his children, possessions, livelihood, and health, his friends sat with him in silence for seven days. In a recent loss of my own, Marsha and Cathy met with me. They waited patiently until I was ready to talk. They each gently offered encouragement from their hearts and God's Word, a tender thoughtful sharing of God's truth.

At times, words are not helpful. Proverbs 25:20 restrains us ...

"Like one who takes away a garment in cold weather, and like vinegar on soda, is one who sings songs to a heavy heart."

Do not sing songs to a heavy heart.

Silence is the recognition of the holiness or emotional gravity of a moment. Silence leaves space for God's voice.

There is a time to be silent. Ecclesiastes 3:7b We "Life-Speak" even when we're silent.



# Prayer

Lord, in the loss faced by another, whether through the death of a loved one or a significant personal loss, guide me by Your Holy Spirit to speak appropriate words at the right time. Help me not to interrupt the silence. Amen

King Solomon left us this message: "To everything there is a season, a time for every purpose under heaven." Ecclesiastes 3:1 You can Life-Speak God's Word with someone who is suffering. Write out appropriate scriptures, meditate on these, and memorize them; prepare for sacred moments when you share the mourning bench. Use caution though: do not interrupt the silence.







The Book of Psalms is a compilation of poetry, songs, and prayers—150 in all. The authors are a variety of people from different periods in Israel's history. Readers often assume that King David wrote the full book of Psalms, but in actuality he authored about half, perhaps seventy-three of the 150 poems. The Psalms speak to the human experience ... the grappling with trauma, thankfulness, trouble, triumph...life. The Psalms are where the rubber meets the road. They teach us to be raw and truthful with God. The 150 chapters provide an incredible array of pre-written declarations.

The Psalms are also instructive.

For example, David wrote about how he dealt with anger and insomnia in Psalm 4.

In verses 4-5, he provides four specific steps he followed so he would "be angry, and sin not." Ephesians 4:26

✓ Meditate within your heart on your bed. (Ponder God's highest will.)

✓ Be still.

(Verbal/mental/emotional/physical stillness.)
✓Offer the sacrifices of righteousness.
(Do as the Holy Spirit directs you.)
✓ Put your trust in the Lord.
(Patiently trust the Lord's outcome.)

David concluded Psalm 4 with a powerful declaration of trust in God. Perhaps you will declare this over you and yours:

"I will both lie down in peace, and sleep; for You alone, O Lord, make me dwell in safety."

Record your discoveries and speak your discoveries as declarations.







My husband and I have been given the gift of seeing and knowing our children's children's children. We have been granted the pleasure of babysitting two of our Littles on Wednesdays most weeks. The incredible honor is that we know our great grandchildren and are known by them. One Wednesday when our 4 year old was about 14 months old, she was seated in her high chair and I was facing her, helping her as she ate lunch with her cute toddler hands. Background music was playing and Kari Jobe's voice began to sing "The Blessing." As I listened to the lyrics while gazing into the lovely eyes of our posterity, Adalee Rose ... three generations younger than myself ... I was suddenly overwhelmed with the emotion and reality of God's faithfulness and goodness.

#### "May His favor be upon you and a thousand generations, and your family and your children, and their children, and their children."

I could agree with Kari Jobe's musical declaration because her words were in agreement with God's Word.

Music can be a beautiful source for faith declarations, but not all music is equal or holy. The caution is this ... do not be captured by the rhythm, the tune, the musicality in lieu of a careful examination of the lyrics. When we sing along, in essence we make declarations.

May our declarations be mindful and bless the generations for God's glory.

It is living. It is active. It lives between my soul and spirit and between the thoughts and intents of my heart. That's why I read it everyday. Application number 2: allow the Word of God daily to pierce between your soul and your spirit and your thoughts and intentions. Let it be a barrier between your life and the world around you."

A two-edged sword cuts both ways. A modern-day definition is that a double-edged sword can have a positive or negative effect. In scripture, it means the Word of God will fully accomplish what it is sent to do: cut away, purify, guide. (Isaiah 55:10-11) Think deeply how God has pierced you in the past or recently. How has He or is He healing you? What scripture (sword) describes your experience?







Three brothers came together to write their prayers and declarations. These composers of inspired scripture seem like an unlikely group. Their names were Assir, Elkanah, and Abiasaph. Exodus 6:24 They were the sons of Korah, the same Korah who led a rebellion against Moses in the wilderness and was swallowed up when God opened the earth in judgment. Clearly the sons chose to side with Moses and the congregation of Israel instead of their own rebellious earthly father. It is they who became the authors of eleven of the Psalms including the "Prayer for Revival."

Psalm 85 contains remarkable prayer requests and declarations. As we pray for revival in our lives and land, Psalm 85 gives us thirteen incredible verses that speak directly to the yearning of our hearts. Among these verses is a breathtaking portrait of what seems to be an unlikely alliance.

# Verse 10 ... Mercy and truth have met together; Righteousness and peace have kissed.

Can you see it? Mercy (which we correlate with forgiveness) and truth (which we parallel with justice.)
Can these two co-exist? God's Word says "yes." When they do, the result is righteousness and peace. In our difficult world, we see too little of this comradery. However, we can be agents of mercy & truth, righteousness & peace...the kiss.

Jesus began to say to the multitudes concerning John: "What did you go out into the wilderness to see? A reed shaken by the wind? But what did you go out to see? A man clothed in soft garments? Indeed, those who wear soft clothing are in kings' houses. But what did you go out to see? A prophet? Yes, I say to you, and more than a prophet. For this is he of whom it is written: 'Behold, I send My messenger before Your face, who will prepare Your way before You.' Assuredly, I say to you, among those born of women there has not risen one greater than John the Baptist ... all the prophets and the law prophesied until John. And if you are willing to receive it, he is Elijah who is to come." Matthew 11:7-14 (excerpts)

Jesus used His words to clarify John's ministry and honored his devotion.

Although John was human and most likely had shortcomings, the record in the Word of God about John highlights his faithfulness to the call to be "the voice of one crying in the wilderness: Prepare the way of the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God." Isaiah 40:3

Like Jesus, we can **Life-Speak** about others by magnifying their faithfulness and praying silently about their flaws.



You can create your own declarations. Consider recording them for reference sake in a journal, whether handwritten or online, or perhaps an audio recording. Write them on a post-it note or 3 x 5 card to display for review. The intention is to place your selected scripture declarations where you can read, review, and Life-Speak often. Study corresponding scriptures that clarify your declaration.







John chapter 6 gives us a glimpse of two days in Jesus' life. On day 1 he taught a large multitude—5000 men plus women and children—possibly 10,000 or more people (and that without a microphone!) Then he fed them using just five barley loaves and two fish. That night, He walked on the surface of a stormy sea and encouraged His disciples not to fear. Day 2—the crowds discovered his

Day 2—the crowds discovered his location and followed Him to Capernaum. This day, however, the teaching was not as palatable to them. He pinpointed their motivation for following him:

"... you seek Me, not because you saw the signs, but because you ate of the loaves and were filled. Do not labor for the food which perishes, but for the food which endures to everlasting life ..." John 6:27a

Jesus proceeds to speak on a topic their ears could not comprehend and their hearts would not tolerate.

"He who eats My flesh and drinks My blood abides in Me, and I in him." John 6:56

The Bible implies that Jesus' words emptied out the synagogue.

"From that time many of His disciples went back and walked with Him no more." John 6:66

This came as no surprise to our Lord. "Jesus knew from the beginning who they were who did not believe..."

John 6:64b Sometimes Life-Speak exposes what is hidden in hearts. And sometimes rejection follows.

And then if we glance above to the previous chapter, we will find scriptures such as "Enlarge the place of your tent, & let them stretch out the curtains of your dwellings; do not spare; lengthen your cords, & strengthen your stakes. For you shall expand to the right & to the left."

Isaiah 54:2-3a

#### Our Bible is wealth indeed.

Isaiah 55 is the Messiah's invitation to the world to join Him in His family. This chapter is truly inclusive in the best way. As you read it, formulate declarations from the verses; consider doing the same with chapter 54. These are declarations which you may refer to for yourself and an invitation you can speak and pray for others to "seek the Lord while He may be found, call upon Him while He is near."

2 Timothy 2:13 gives us a clear hint: If we are faithless, He remains faithful; He [God] cannot deny Himself.

What do you think about the phrase in 2 Timothy 2:13, "He cannot deny Himself."? Is it probable this speaks of the core of Who God is, His inherent nature? He is unrelenting in His promises. He is steadfast in His character. He is resolute to His new covenant with His people, both Israel and us ... those who are grafted in. Romans 11:11-36, vss 17-20

The new covenant is a non-negotiable. The price to secure it is immeasurable: the blood of Jesus, the Son of God ... God Himself.

This new covenant is a promise secured by the ultimate Promise Keeper ... God Himself.

Even when we face battles and struggles in our lives, we can remember and declare the new covenant which is established by the unwavering One. He truly remains faithful even if we are faithless.

As you meditate upon and make your declaration of the covenant God has established with you, ponder this truth:

God never wavered.

He fought for you—faithfully.

Life-Speak may mean we must speak even when we do not want to. Whatever the reason ... a broken relationship, an on-the-job challenge, correcting an untruth...any number of circumstances, sometimes we simply must open wide our mouth. The goal? God's glory, restoration, reconciliation, peace.

Confrontation need not be contentious. This may be easier said than done. If our heart is cleansed of anger and pride beforehand, the chances of a verbal brawl will be reduced. Our motivation must be love so we must carefully prepare our soul through fasting, prayer, and the Word. In these disciplines, Holy Spirit can correct us in advance so we don't sideswipe someone or be in attack mode. Life-Speak don't death-speak. Begin by controlling the narrative in your own soul.



The bottom line, however, is if I cannot follow in someone's footsteps, I won't hear their words. This is true for all of us.

# Integrity opens the gate to influence.

Paul had proven his integrity and was able to influence new believers, both male and female, along with young pastors such as Timothy and Titus. When Paul instructed

Titus to "speak the things which are proper for sound doctrine..."

he had first learned the lesson himself. And not only learned it, but lived it.

Should we excuse ourselves when we use our words in ways that cause another to do a double take? Does my conversation evoke a comment or thought in my hearer such as: "I thought she/he was a Christian." Perhaps, without realizing it, our words disparage the power of God to transform our life.

We must ask if it is okay to smile and say, "I love the Lord but I cuss a little."

Influence is a fickle friend.

More so, God's ears are always open.

In the 1997 movie, "What the Deaf Man Heard," the people who lived in Sammy's small town thought he was a deaf-mute. Instead he had taken a vow of silence. He was privy to every spoken word even though the townspeople did not realize it. Sometimes we treat God like "Sammy."


