2024 AOD National Meeting Review

This year at the National AOD meeting, we had two discussion topics:

1) Massage Therapy for Abdominopelvic Pain

The objective was to discuss a position statement on Abdominopelvic (AP) Pain, citing the lack of abdominal massage education in schools and concerns of injury has led some offices to ban the practice. Suggesting that with an official position statement it could enhance training in both initial education and continuing education programs, broadening the acceptance and understanding within the massage therapy community and among other healthcare professionals for massage therapists to be able to treat AP pain. An anonymous vote sent it forward to the National Committee to Construct a statement for the AMTA.

2) How would having unified definitions on modalities such as Swedish massage, deep tissue massage, sports massage, and clinical massage shape the massage therapy profession?

A group from Oklahoma brought this discussion to the table. It was solely a discussion and not a vote. The overwhelming consensus at my table and from the body as a whole, was we should not. We discussed how these could put us into a box so to speak with possible issues if we go out of the definition and perform some deep tissue when the order is for Swedish as an example. It seemed to have been the same across the AOD body on this heated discussion. Many of us voiced how there are already definitions stated for these various modalities. We also sometimes must alter our modality once we start on a client, based on the issue at hand, or what we may find during their treatment, if we feel that it may help with what it is they initially came to us for.

*The research and public education by the AMTA is important in the role of protecting the Massage Therapy profession. If any members have a discussion topic for AOD to discuss at the National Convention, I would be happy to submit it for you.
