Trafalgar-Chartwell Residents' Association Inc. (formerly Trafalgar-Chartwell Residents' Group Incorporated) Notes to Financial Statements (Unaudited)

1. General

Trafalgar-Chartwell Residents' Group Incorporated ("TCRA") was incorporated on January 27, 1988 as a not-for-profit corporation without share capital by Letters Patent issued under the provisions of the Ontario Corporations Act. On October 19, 2021, TCRA was continued under the Ontario Not-for-profit Corporations Act.

At the Annual and Special Meeting of Members held on May 4, 2022, Members approved a Special Resolution authorizing TCRA to apply for Amended Articles of Incorporation which included a change in the corporation name to Trafalgar-Chartwell Residents' Association Inc. On May 11, 2022, the Province issued a Certificate of Amendment. Members also approved a new By-law which included a change in TCRA's financial year-end from October 31 to December 31.

TCRA is dedicated to protecting and preserving the existing residential land uses within its defined boundaries to ensure that the character of the area, so highly valued from a cultural and historic standpoint, is maintained and, where possible, improved.

2. Significant Accounting Policies

The financial statements were prepared in accordance with Canadian accounting standards for notfor-profit organizations and include the following significant accounting policies.

(a) Revenue Recognition

TCRA derives its revenue from annual dues paid by members and from donations. In accounting for this revenue, TCRA uses the completed contract method, which is a method that recognizes revenue only when the rendering of services under a contract is completed or substantially completed. TCRA considers its services to have been rendered with regards to its annual dues at the end of the calendar year for which the dues were paid. Any annual dues received from members that related to future periods are recorded as deferred revenue and are brought into income in the future period.

(b) Prepaid expenses

Prepaid expenses are the portion of expenditures for services made in the current year which relate to future periods, ranging from 1 to 5 years. Such expenses are brought into income in the year to which they relate.
