

Re: Important Update on Return to School; Due to COVID-19

Dear Southgate Families,

Southgate Academy started remote learning on August 5<sup>th</sup>, 2020. It is great to see students logged in to their on-line curriculum and using the Google-Classroom platform to have face-to face video chats with their teachers and classmates. It is a new experience for all of us! The staff is here to assist if you are experiencing any technology or curriculum issues.

Recently, the Pima County Health Department (PCHD) published guidelines for safe return to in-person learning. As a district, we discussed the data released to us in detail and based on this information, Southgate Academy will delay the on-campus learning until it is deemed safe for us to return.



From the County Administrator's Office: County public health agencies with real time information and data regarding the pandemic are in the best position to offer public health advice regarding school activities related to managing the spread of COVID-19. These agencies have been working with local area school superintendents including Southgate, to develop specific guidance consistent with public health standards and how to incorporate the guidance that was recently issued by the Center for Disease Control (CDC).

<u>Public health data does not support the reopening of schools on August 17, 2020 for traditional face-to-face, in-person learning. The explanation lies in the facts. They are:</u>

- The local County COVID-19 infections are near the highest daily amounts since the pandemic began.
- Pima County's total monthly infections in March were 153, in April 1,024, in May 1,101, in June 5,622 and so far for July through the 27th, they are 6,722.
- Countywide transmission <u>rates remain above 11 percent</u>, with a World Health Organization (WHO)
  <u>recommendation that rates be below 5 percent prior to opening</u>.

- Masks were only recently mandated at the County level on June 19, 2020 and it will take six weeks to see if this mitigation strategy is working.
- Hospitalizations for COVID-19 are at record levels and it was only last week the ICU bed capacity was nearly exceeded and critical patients were transferred to other hospitals within the State.
- Widespread testing is now only becoming available throughout the community.

For all the above reasons, schools **should not open on August 17, 2020** for traditional face-to-face, in-person instruction.
