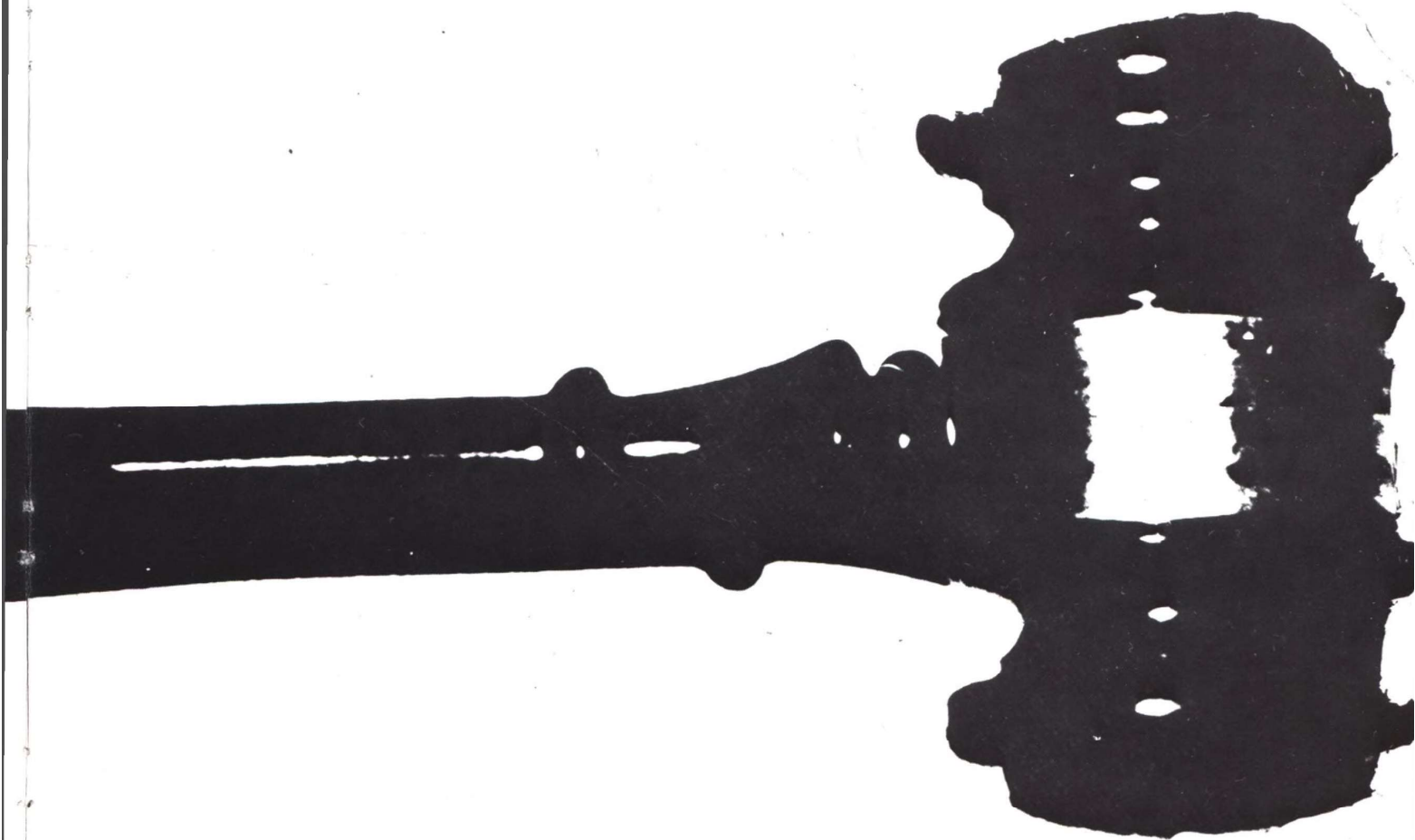


CLUBS CLUBS

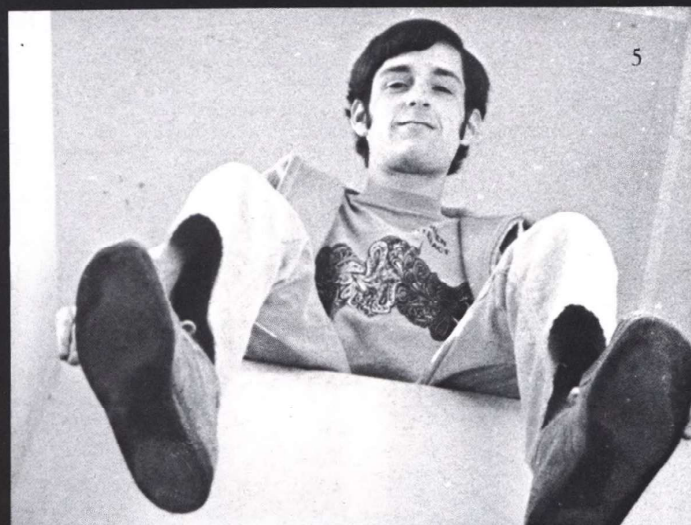

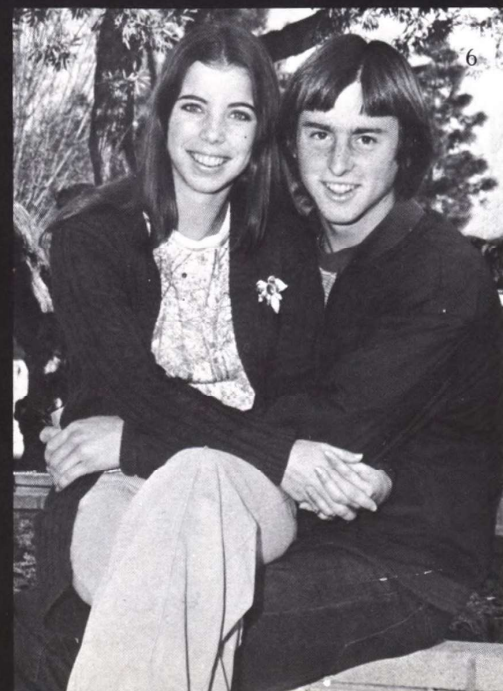
When you say Key Club and Fideles,

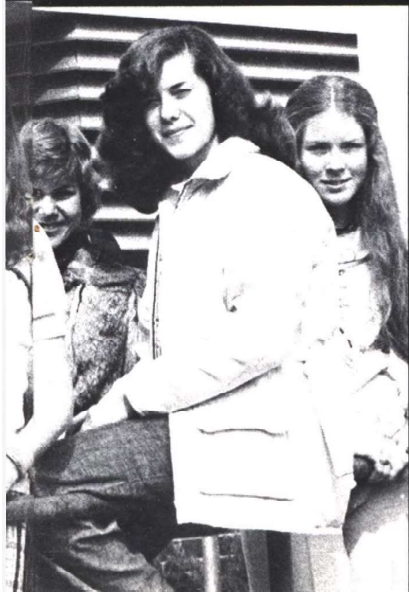

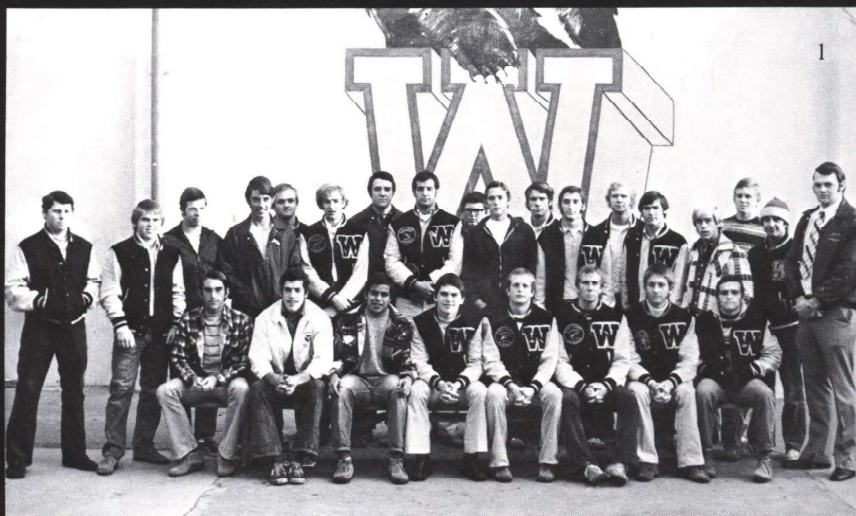
