

Welcome to SEPTEMBER! It's the month of getting everything back in gear ... and especially challenging may be the things we had time off from during the summer.

Here's something that's not "back in gear," though ... it's something brand new and exciting. Key leaders from Nativity and from Gardens Presbyterian, one of our ecumenical partners through ELCA, have been praying and sharing together to begin a shared youth ministry for both of our congregations.

Look at the calendar ... September 10, at 4 p.m. here at Nativity is when the Kickoff Event for this new venture is planned. More details will follow, but ... it's especially focused on Middle and High School youth. It's not going to be something we're doing "for" our youth, but "with" our youth. Stay informed Be sure you don't miss

out on information from your child's school. Have him show you what's in his backpack each day, and sign up for class or school email lists. If you use an electronic calendar, visit your school website to learn whether you can link to it so important dates are filled in automatically.

Time to relax

Put relaxation on your family's agenda! Each day, set aside 15-30 minutes for an activity that helps everyone unwind. You might find time right after work or on weekend mornings. Together, look at family photos, blow bubbles, or lie on a blanket in the yard and watch the clouds, for example.



DID YOU KNOW Little ones often need extra time to think about what they want to say and to put it into words. During conversations, wait and let your youngster speak for herself. Your patience will help her become a confident speaker-and show her how to be a good listener, too.

Your child has an exciting job-she's a student! Encourage her to embrace her "big kid" role by talking about what successful students do.

I follow routines

From circle time to story time to music Ne_ class, your youngster's school day is full of fun activities. She can get used to her new routine by making a book about it. Suggest that she draw a picture of each activity (circle time, recess, math) on a separate sheet of paper. Help her write (or let her dictate) captions, such as "We go to the cafeteria for lunch." Staple the pages together, and read her book with her.

I learn something every day

Invite your child to share her new knowledge with you. Reserve a special spot on a bulletin board or the refrigerator to post projects and papers she's proud of. Then, ask questions about what she's learning. Example: "I see you

Sunny starts

Starting the day on a positive note lets your youngster head off to school happy and ready to learn. Try these ideas for upbeat mornings:

• Use humor to get your child out of bed. You might sing a silly song or tell a knock-knock joke.

• Give each family member a job to make getting ready a smooth operation. You can wash breakfast dishes while your youngster packs snacks.

• Before you leave the house, hold a "morning huddle." Tell your child what to expect after school, such as who will pick him up or what's for dinner. Then, exchange hugs and an "I love you."♥

I work with others

Your youngster is part of an important community-her classroom. Play school at home so she can practice working alongside others. Have her create a "learning center" like one in her classroom, and use it together. The two of you could sort and count toy cars in a "math station" or stir together oil and water in a "science lab."

Call Committee's work is confidential.

A Ministry Site Profile will need to be completed that includes what it is the congregation is looking for in a pastor.

Reiterated that the congregation in our annual budget meeting already approved setting aside \$10,000 for resources required by the Call Committee. Anticipates that some or all of this can be compensated by special donations and this will be mentioned in future upcoming bulletins. Aside from monetary contributions, hotel and/or flight points can be donated to help assist with what is required.

When it comes to travelling to visit a candidate pastor's location, the entire Call Committee doesn't have to travel, can be several members that visit and just report back to the Committee.

Pastor Lutze indicated that since Confirmation instruction is a crucial part of a pastor's role and has indicated that he will not initiate any new classes until the new pastor arrives.

Pastor Lutze shared that conversations for a joint Youth Ministry between Nativity and Gardens Presbyterian have already been started.

Pastor Lutze shared the outcome of the Special Magistrate Code Hearing held on 07/25/17:

Violations were around 3 main areas: Portables, Parking Lot and Dumpster.

City is giving us until 09/24/17 to take violations to resolution.

Kari Donnelly has received quotes for the fence and the dumpster which were accepted by the Council. Contractors are already applying for permits.

Kelly Rogers confirmed that we have received an offer from the City of Palm Beach Gardens to purchase all of our property for \$1,850,000.

More information and discussions will need to take place before a decision and/or response can be requested from the congregation. The Council will work on gathering more information.

A line of credit through Mission Investment Fund is currently pending. The expectation is that we will only borrow what is needed. We will probably request for special gifts other than contributions for our normal operating expense. We will share more with the congregation once we have more detailed information about the line of credit.

Pastor Lutze asked that members of the Call Committee remain after the meeting to discuss next steps and outstanding tasks such as the ministry site profile.

Meeting adjourned – 12:15 p.m.

Special Congregation Meeting, Sunday, July 30, 2017

Minutes Pending Approval

Meeting called to order 11:20 a.m. and opened up with prayer led by Interim Pastor Paul Lutze.

Ouorum confirmed at 42 voting members in attendance.

*An initial tie between Chad Smith and John Johnsen for the 6th spot resulted in a second tie. A motion was made and accepted to increase the Call Committee membership to 7 since we do not have a specific maximum number of members identified in our constitution.

Pastor Lutze indicated that a future Sunday date will be identified for when the elected Call Committee members can be installed. He also requested that we keep the Call Committee and pastor candidates be kept in our prayers.

Pastor Lutze shared some information regarding the candidate process.

Recommendations of a pastor from our congregation members can be submitted for consideration to the Bishop's office.

Pastors can self-nominate themselves from outside the Synod. However, the Bishop's office will determine the final list of candidates to be presented to the Call Committee.

Bishop office does not recommend "trial sermons". If Call Committee does want to do this, consideration of anonymity of pastor during the process.

Zipping toward independence

It's fun for kids to learn to button, zip, and tie. Here are strategies that will make your youngster more independent at home and in school.

Buttons. Use stickers to show your child which button goes with which hole in his shirt. Place one sticker next to each button, and put a matching one beside the hole where it belongs. Your youngster can remove the stickers as he fastens each button.



Plant a kindness tree

Does kindness grow on trees? It does when your family tries this activity that encourages your child to be kind to others.

Help your youngster draw a big tree with bare branches and label each branch with a family member's name. Hang her tree where everyone can see it. Next. have her cut leaves


from colored paper and place them in a bowl near the tree

along with a pencil and a glue stick. Whenever someone notices a family member being kind, select a leaf, write about or draw a picture of the kind act,

and glue the leaf to that person's branch. Examples: "Tony picked up my toys" or "Mommy held the door for a lady pushing a stroller." At the end of the week, read all the leaves aloud, and "plant" a new tree for next week.♥

Zippers. To help your child zip his jacket. teach him to say, "1, 2, 3, zip!" On 1, he moves the zipper pull to the bottom of the jacket. On 2, he inserts one side into the other. On 3, he grabs the zipper pull and zips it up!

Shoelaces. Bulkier laces offer a better grip for your youngster's little fingers. Consider replacing thin shoelaces with

thicker ones or swapping out flat laces for rounded ones. Tip: Let him try tying the laces when his shoes are off, or have him tie vour shoes.

Back to school, back to work

Q: Now that my daughter is in school full time, I'm working days instead of nights. How can I be a part of her school?

A: There are plenty of ways for working parents to be involved. Talk to your daughter's teacher about how you can volunteer from home or at after-school events.

Maybe the teacher needs someone to repair torn pages in books or to collect and count food package labels for a manufacturer's reward program. Or perhaps you could hand out programs before the school musical or type and photocopy an announcement about a class party.



Office Report

We reviewed the written report and the attendance report from our office manager Kari Donnelly. She provided updates on the progress that has been made on items included in our Notice of Violation from the City of Palm Beach Gardens, as well as information about a new cleaning company, with a lower rate, that our church could use. Information about our church's golf benefit on October 28th was also distributed at this time.

Old Business

Kelly shared updates from our recent hearing for the Notice of Violation we received from the City of Palm Beach Gardens, with thanks to Eric Hoecker for attending and speaking on our behalf. We received a September 24th extension deadline to complete some of the work that still needed to be done, including the removal of our portable classroom spaces and updates to paving, exterior surfaces, and the dumpster area.

We also discussed our recent letter from the City of Palm Beach Gardens regarding the purchase of our property and some of our potential next steps in following up to this proposal. We would like to survey feelings from the congregation about a potential property sale and utilize legal representation as we meet with city officials to gather more details.

New Business

Our call committee will be meeting on August 15^{th} , and will be installed at the worship service on August 27^{th} .

Kelly shared a preview of our new church website. We plan to use PayPal (the version for nonprofits) on the site.

"Nativity's Got Talent" has been scheduled for Sunday, September 3^{rd} and will serve as a fundraiser for our youth. Ernadel will be sending more information soon.

Our meeting was adjourned with a closing prayer at 9:05 PM.

August 9, 2017, Minutes Pending Approval

Present: Interim Pastor Paul Lutze, David Johnson, Kelly Rogers, Jim New, Audra Bryson, Earl Osborne, Ernadel Sioson

Absent: None

We began our meeting in the loggia at 7:05 PM with Pastor leading us in devotion and prayer.

Minutes from the Council meeting on June 7, 2017 were reviewed and approved. It was noted that items from July were rescheduled for discussion today. Minutes from the Special Congregational Meeting (regarding the formation of a Call Committee) on July 30, 2017 were also reviewed and are pending approval from the congregation.

Financial Report

Jim reviewed our financial report for the month of July. Our total income was \$20, 370 and our total expenses were \$28,502, leaving us with a loss of \$8,132 for the month. We discussed preparing fact sheets or other types of communication to share with the congregation when we hear back from Mission Investment Fund about our qualification for a loan to be used to improve our facilities.

Other items during our finance discussion included notes from the August 8, 2017 Audit Committee meeting and a copy of our audit procedure. The committee recommended that our internal audit should include the Nativity Women's Association Fund. A motion was made and approved for this action.

Pastor's Report

Pastor Lutze submitted a written report on his actions from the last month. He shared some potential ideas for upcoming events, including Global Church Sunday and Reformation Sunday (marking the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation). It was noted that Back to Church Sunday is next month, and Ernadel offered to help distribute mailings for this. Pastor suggested delaying the start of a new confirmation class until our new pastor begins.
